Mark Korda and Mark Mentha said \$13.8m would be paid out to the staff, bringing to \$718.2 million the total payments and meaning that on average the employees will have received around 95 cents in the dollar of their entitlements.

"The twelfth dividend payment is 17.5% of each employee's outstanding entitlements," said Mark Korda, adding that it was on average \$890 per employee, with some staff receiving over \$8000.

Payments by electronic transfer commenced at midnight last night, he said.

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# Benefit from VA/DL deal

THE Australian Competition and Consumer Commission has approved the joint venture between Virgin Blue and Delta which will allow the carriers to coordinate operations on their Pacific routes (TD breaking news), saying the pact is "likely to result in public benefits".

The ACCC said any cost savings achieved by the JV "are likely to be passed onto consumers given the level of competition on the trans-Pacific routes" and noted that in particular Virgin would gain access to preferentially priced fares on the United States sectors.

Delta will have an incentive to offer such fares to Virgin Blue

#### WA airport upgrades

QANTAS has introduced a new airport security screening zone at its Perth Domestic Terminal aimed at cutting down waiting times and congestion.

Unveiled yesterday and part of Qantas' \$75m terminal upgrade plan, the changes see 3 additional baggage carousels, 6 new check-in counters, a larger aerobridge and the upgrade of one gate to cater for Boeing 767 aircraft.

QF regional GM for WA lan Gay said the Australian flag-carrier's expansion in the West over the past 12 months has been fueled by extra capacity from the mining and energy sectors.

Gay said: "This rapid growth has prompted a significant investment in...order to deliver a faster, smoother and more seamless airport experience."

Next year, work will also begin on the upgrade of the Perth Qantas Club.

MEANWHILE, the regional West Australian airports of Broome, Kalgoorlie, Karratha, Port Hedland, Newman and Paraburdoo will receive technology enhancements such as automated gate boarding facilities

because it will benefit from increased sales of trans-Pacific fares by V Australia under the revenue sharing mechanism of the joint venture, the ACCC said.

The determination also found that the JV was "unlikely to result in any significant diminution of competition in any of the relevant markets."

The ACCC contrasted the decision with its previous denial of the Air NZ/Air Canada plan to cooperate on flights to Vancouver, saying that while that plan similarly involved revenue sharing, "one of the applicants in that matter is an established carrier on the routes concerned.

"In deciding to grant authorisation for the Virgin Blue and Delta applications, the ACCC has, in particular, taken into account the extent to which Virgin Blue and Delta are recent entrants on the trans-Pacific routes, and the extent to which the Joint Venture is likely to enable the applicants to compete more vigorously and effectively against the two incumbent carriers operating on the routes," the official determination said. Authorisation has been granted

for 5 and a half years.

The JV is still awaiting approval by US authorities, and DJ last week said it's not expecting a final decision until mid-2010.

#### CHA notch another

CHOICE Hotels Australasia (CHA) has added another Econo Lodge branded property to its expanding portfolio in Australia, the latest in Sydney South as part of the Macquarie Hotel.

To date, Econo Lodge has launched hotels in Sydney South, Eden, Forbes and Griffith in NSW; Morwell & Mildura in Vic; Kingston in SA and Kangaroo Point in Qld.

CHA also announced plans to expand into New Zealand in 2010.

A RESTAURANT in Paris has had a clear-out of its cellar, with one of the bottles sold at auction for €25,000 (about \$55,000).

The Tour D'Argent, on the left bank of the Seine River, offloaded about 18,000 bottles of wine including the 1788 Cognac dating from just before the French Revolution.

The restaurant was founded in 1582, and has a 400-page wine list - and diners won't be going thirsty, with more than 420,000 bottles still left after the auction.

Restaurateur Andre Terrail said "Buyers acquired not only excellent wines, but also a large part of our history and soul."

**NEWARK** Liberty International Airport in the USA is the best place to make a "love connection" according to a survey released this week by US grooming products maker Axe.

The report examined data from the top 33 airports by passenger numbers, and correlated this with on-time departure records and amenities such as bars and restaurants.

It found that the most likely place to hook up during a delay was Newark, followed by New York JFK.

Unfortunately for lovelorn Aussie travellers, Los Angeles came in at the bottom of the list.

**US** carrier Northwest Airlines is being sued by a Detroit woman who claims she hurt her leg while trying to get settled in a middle seat on a 2007 flight to Las Vegas. 58-year-old Kathy Kuhn is seeking an unspecified cash payment from the carrier, saying she "wrenched her knee" when she tried to climb over an armrest which wouldn't go up. Northwest has denied any

liability for the incident.

A REPORT released by UK travel search engine Lilligo.co.uk has found that low cost carriers can offer a lower carbon footprint to travellers, because they have more seats on their planes and higher load factors.
