The agency was one of nine terminated just last week due to failure to lodge annual financial returns (TD Mon).


Eurostar update

Virgin delivers Christmas

VIRGIN Blue has been awarded the government contract to operate regular flights between Perth and the Indian Ocean territories of Christmas Island and Cocos Keeling Islands.

Minister for Home Affairs, Brendan O'Connor said the new services would commence from Thu 01 Apr 2010, with twice weekly flights to Cocos (Keeling) Islands and Christmas Island, and an additional third weekly flight to Christmas Island only which will be reassessed after six months, subject to demand.

DJ will operate an Embraer 190 aircraft on the route, with O'Connor saying the contract will result in "better passenger fares and direct and faster flights."

"I am pleased that Australia's second largest airline will provide air services to these remote communities, and excited by the potential tourism benefits that this contract could bring to the Islands' economy," he said.

"The Australian Government will continue to underwrite these services to ensure that it meets its community service obligations."

UA, CO and ANA apply for immunity

STAR Alliance members United Airlines, Continental and All Nippon Airways have applied to the US Department of Transportation for antitrust immunity to allow them to "create a more efficient and comprehensive trans-Pacific network".

The carriers said their proposed joint venture "would enable United, ANA and Continental to compete more effectively with other global alliances, each of which has a significant presence in Tokyo".

The move follows the recently announced open skies agreement between Japan and the US.

Virgin Blue replaces the existing provider Cobham Aviation, which has served the territories for the last ten years.

The government has for some time been attempting to renegotiate services operating to the Indian Ocean islands, and awarded the contract to SkyAirWorld earlier this year (TD 06 Mar) - just before the carrier's collapse.

MEANWHILE the cruise industry is leading the way in boosting tourism to Christmas Island, with P&O making its first cruise ship call there yesterday, bringing 1700 passengers and a welcome cash injection into the local economy.

P&O will make another Christmas Island call next month, and also plans further visits during 2011.

Asia-Pac recovery

THERE was a 4.5% year-on-year increase in international passenger numbers carried by members of the Association of Asia-Pacific airlines, "providing further evidence of a modest recovery in air traffic demand".

AAPA director-general, Andrew Herdman, said the November traffic figures "are mildly encouraging, in line with the broader economic recovery underway being led by the Asia Pacific region."

He warned that demand is still "well below pre-recession levels".

LAN orders 30 jets

LATIN America carrier LAN has placed an order for 30 new Airbus A320s which will be used to boost regional and domestic operations.

Worth an estimated \$US1.9b at list prices, the jets will be delivered between 2011 and 2016.

In addition, LAN's fleet renewal plan includes the sale of five Airbus A318s during 2011.

Emirates to Prague

DUBAI-based Emirates has said it will launch direct services to the capital of the Czech republic from 01 Jul, the airline's 24th European destination.

The announcement is sure to delight the operators of European river cruises with a high volume of cruise-tour packages embarking or disembarking from Prague.

EK will operate a dual class 278-seat Airbus A330 on the route.

AA crash in Jamaica

A BOEING 737 operated by American Airlines has overshoot the runway on landing in Kingston, the capital of Jamaica, with more than 40 people injured.

AA331 which also operated as a British Airways codeshare was arriving from Washington DC via Miami, carrying 154 passengers.

The incident happened in heavy rain, with the BBC reporting that the plane came to a halt just 3m from the ocean.

The plane looks to be a total loss with the fuselage cracked and the right engine broken off.

MEANWHILE a Ryanair 737 also left the runway at Prestwick Airport in the west of Scotland when it slid on ice while taxiing towards the airport building.

Nobody was injured and passengers were transferred to the terminal by bus.

New Argentina fee

AUTHORITIES in Argentina have announced a new "reciprocity fee" which will apply to all arrivals from Australia, Canada and the USA effective 28 Dec.

The fee of US\$100 for a single entry by Australian citizens will be collected by government authorities at the airport upon arrival into Buenos Aires.

Some exceptions apply, including for Argentine citizens also holding citizenship in the US, Canada or Australia; US, Canadian and Australian citizens with regular residence in Argentina, those holding a valid Argentina visa, people with diplomatic passports and working crew on flights into Argentina.

The fee is US\$70 for Canadian citizens (single entry) and US\$131 for US citizens (multiple entries for ten years).

QF retimes HKG services

QANTAS has announced new operating times for its services to Hong Kong from both Brisbane and Perth, saying the move aims to provide "greater convenience and better connections for customers".

The changes will apply from late Mar and will see the Perth QF67 flights change from a morning departure to late in the evening, arriving in Hong Kong at 6.05 am the following day.

"Our customer research tells us that this change has significant appeal to both business and leisure travellers," said Qantas regional gm WA, Ian Gay.

"The new times will give customers access to a wider range of connections from Hong Kong on to London and North East Asia, including Beijing and Shanghai". QF67 will continue to operate

three times a week, and will now connect with QF29 between Hong Kong and London.

The Brisbane services will also change from an 11.15am departure to leave at 11.05pm, also arriving early in the morning the following day.

QF regional manager Qld, Andrew Hogg, also confirmed that the carrier would operate extra services from Queensland to Hong Kong in Feb to accommodate increased demand over the Lunar New Year period, including six extra Hong Kong-Cairns flights, three additional Hong Kong-Brisbane services and one extra Brisbane-Hong Kong flight.

DJ 'lost' passenger

VIRGIN Blue has been accused of losing a 38-year-old deaf and mute woman at Brisbane airport as she attempted to transfer to a flight to Fiji on Mon.

The mix-up apparently left the woman unattended for five hours in the terminal.

The Human Rights Commission has responded to the incident by calling on the government to give it the power to initiate court action against airlines.

Gay cruise growth

US gay travel specialist Atlantis Events has chartered the newly renamed Azamara Club Cruises' *Azamara Quest* for what's being promoted as the first gay cruise to China, South Korea and Japan.

The 20-30 Mar 2010 sailing will visit Busan, Hiroshima, Osaka, Taipei and Hong Kong; while a subsequent gay cruise will depart Hong Kong 30 Mar and visit Vietnam and Thailand.

The Via Lounge is open to Finnair Plus and oneworld top tier members and business class passengers at no charge, and to all other customers for a fee.

An airport terminal in Texas, USA became an impromptu wedding chapel when a woman in a wedding gown - accompanied by a Justice of the Peace - surprised her fiancé as he arrived on an incoming flight.

Robyn Moore exchanged vows with William Acosta at Corpus Christi International Airport after her new husband got off a plane arriving from Ohio.

Acosta said he was "speechless and thrilled" at the airport wedding, which was very appropriate given that his new wife said they had "spent half our relationship in airports".

The official wedding photos were taken in front of a Christmas tree at a nearby security checkpoint.

AUTHORITIES in Kazakhstan have come up with a new tourism drawcard - extreme cold.

The country's president, Nursultan Nazarbayev, spoke about the climate in a speech earlier this week.

"Today it's only -30°C. It only strengthens our spirit," he said, urging people to visit the nation's capital Astana.

"This city is so sterile. Even germs can't survive in this weather, so we can enjoy living long lives here," he added.
