QF boosts JAL c'shares

QANTAS has announced an expansion of its codeshare arrangements with Japan Airlines to include services between Australia and Japan via Singapore (*TD* breaking news).

The move, effective from 01 Jun, will see QF offer daily connecting flights in Singapore to Tokyo and Osaka from Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane and Perth - as well as links with the current thrice weekly QF services from Adelaide to Tokyo.

The move will see JAL offering flights to seven Australian ports, adding Perth, Adelaide and Melbourne to its existing direct and codeshare services to Sydney, Brisbane as well as with Jetstar to the Gold Coast and Cairns.

Qantas and JAL have been offering code share flights since 1986, with JAL offering reservations on the new services under its JL code from tomorrow.

The expanded codeshare agreement is subject to government approval, with the International Air Services Commission last week confirming an application from Qantas for the capacity, and inviting submissions on the proposal with a closing date of 29 May.

i-Create update

CREATIVE Holidays says a new functionality for its i-Create online agent booking engine which allows consultants to amend their bookings even after a payment has been made is an "industry first".

"Creative Holidays is proud to bring this functionality to its retail partners, further improving the way we deliver our products," said Creative's Andrew Yell.

The amendment feature will be available for new bookings from next Mon 25 May, allowing agents to modify their bookings after they've been deposited, and right up until final payment is due.

Yell said the move would increase agents' control over their bookings, allowing them to add/delete or amend products at any time - more info 13 1222.

First Chinese A320

THE first Airbus aircraft to be assembled outside of Europe made its first flight yesterday, after being constructed in Tianjin in northeastern China.

Airbus said the Chinese-made aircraft "unquestionably demonstrated the same quality and performance as those assembled and delivered in Hamburg or Toulouse."

The new plant in China is expected to be producing four A320s a month by 2011.

BA offers transfers

BRITISH Airways has announced free transfers to and from London Heathrow Terminal 5 for First and Club World Customers living within 100 miles of the airport.

The service will be provided via a fleet of 3000 licensed London cabs through a partnership with Computer Cab plc.

Limousine transfers for premium passengers are already offered in the UK by a number of BA's competitors including Virgin Atlantic, Emirates and Etihad.

HYATT Hotels has just launched a new concierge service based on the new internet phenomenon of Twitter.

Travellers can 'tweet' any question to HyattConcierge, with a service team specially trained to answer the queries in Twitter's 140-character limit.

Hyatt said it expects guests to use the electronic concierge system to make special requests, book spa appointments, find local restaurants and make just about any other query you'd ask the real thing.

SELF-DRIVE tourists in the USA are being warned to have breakfast before they set off, after police arrested a motorist in Massachusetts for driving erratically.

Officers said the man was eating a bowl of cereal with milk, and when asked the reason for weaving all over the road told them that "he was hungry".

A PET-LOVING British couple have travelled more than 6000km from London to the USA in order to adopt a cat.

Chris and Rose Rasmussen flew to Harrison, Michigan to pick up 'Sparky' from the town's animal shelter, after falling in love with the feline on pet adoption website petfinder.com.

The besotted cat-lovers said they realised they could have had the animal shipped to London but instead decided to make the journey themselves.

A spokesman for the Harrison County animal control department said they would miss the black-and-white kitten.

"When people meet Sparky they find he has a dynamic personality and they fall in love with him," he said.

Amazingly the incident was captured on video by one of the passengers on the plane using a camera-phone.

The footage shows the wheel - one of a pair on a landing strut - touch down on the runway and then detach itself and roll away with other debris.

The passenger who filmed the incident said he just 'felt something was going to happen' after he and others on board noticed flames coming from the wheel assembly when the plane took off at Newark Liberty airport.

BA to fly to Vegas

BRITISH Airways is set to launch a new non-stop daily service between London Heathrow and Las Vegas in Oct.

Vegas will become the 19th US city to have daily BA services, with the city saying the flight is the result of ten years of lobbying.

Rival Virgin Atlantic also flies between London Gatwick Airport and Las Vegas.

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AFTA UPDATE

WELCOME to *AFTA Update*, which appears each week in *Travel Daily* to bring you the latest insights from AFTA ceo Jayson Westbury.

OVER the last week I have had the opportunity to listen to a range of economic experts starting out in Canberra and ending up in Singapore.

For the most part it would appear there is more of an optimistic than a pessimistic outlook about the future and the timeframe in which the economy will begin to grow.

Indeed, the Federal Government has led with the front foot on this issue by showing a forecast of return to growth (GDP) of 2.25% by 2010.

Some of the data I received over this past week have agreed, some showing a less optimistic growth number, but still growth and one saying it will come more quickly with a forecast of GDP growth rates of 4% by 2010.

The good thing out of this is that they cannot all be wrong, which means that the economy will be getting back on track within twelve months.

One report in fact made the call that the growth rate will return as early as the fourth quarter of 09, which indicates that a recovery could come more quickly than we expect.

The other thing that has become very clear about post budget commentating is that the forecasters really don't know - this is uncharted territory and the economic conditions that we find ourselves in are really unprecedented.

Of all of the graphs and numbers that I have seen over this last week, the ones that do stand out are from the tourism

forecasting committee (TFC), which show that apart from the dip we are experiencing, outbound passenger numbers and outbound revenue are on a continued grow curve from the start of the recovery to 2016 and beyond.

Sure, market conditions have led to heavy discounting in a range of product categories and other offers to stimulate the market, but if the growth curve gets back on track, these measures will be short term and a degree of normality will return.

So our best hope is to get on the optimistic team, and continue to do what we do as best we can and prepare ourselves for the recovery.

ON a completely different subject, I had the opportunity to enjoy a flight on the A380.

Given this was my first experience on this incredible aircraft I was genuinely excited about the experience.

There was NO disappointment whatsoever - it is so quiet, take off and landing so smooth and overall it really is a new level of travel.

I was actually on a return flight, having been a guest at the Travelscene Corporate Symposium in Singapore.

A great conference and a terrific group of travel agents.

I must also say, Singapore is alive and well and clearly thriving despite the downturn.

Having not been in Singapore for a couple of years they have been busy and as always the stay was welcoming, enriching and most enjoyable.
