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## MFS insolvency

ADVISERS to former Stella Travel owner MFS Limited raised the option of putting the firm into liquidation seven months before the firm collapsed, according to a testimony by deputy ceo Craig White in court this week.

The proceedings also included an email from an MFS staffer in Jan 2008 concerned about the possible sale of Stella to CVC Asia Pacific.

"Why would we sell 65 per cent of our most valuable asset for bugger all?" the email said - just weeks before CVC paid \$400m for a controlling stake in Stella.

## Airlines reveal Bali plans

THE three carriers vying for additional Indonesia capacity have detailed their plans for the destination in submissions for the capacity to the International Air Services Commission.

A new bilateral has seen 4000 extra seats made available, with Qantas initially applying for nearly all of it (TD 27 Jul) for new Jetstar services.

The JQ move was followed by applications for extra Bali flights from Strategic Airlines (TD 29 Jul) and Pacific Blue (TD 09 Aug), creating a disputed situation meaning the airlines must justify their requests for the capacity.

Jetstar has confirmed it intends to utilise the 3898 seats it's seeking with four new weekly Melbourne-Denpasar A330 flights, as well as ten extra PER-DPS A320 services and five weekly Perth-Jakarta-Singapore A320 flights.

Qantas would codeshare on the Jetstar flights, and interestingly the submission also confirms that

Jetstar plans to reconfigure its A320-200 aircraft from 177 to 180 seats from 31 Oct 2011.

The submission from Strategic Airlines says that despite launching only recently a limited schedule, it has achieved "extraordinary sales" on its Bali flights, with load factors of 82% in Jul, its first month of operation.

Strategic says there's also growing business travel to Bali, as well as growth in "on-day/next-day" reservations, with plans for an additional 11 services to allow passengers to "travel on a full service Australian airline every day of the week".

And Pacific Blue says its request for 2340 extra seats is based on confidential "actual operational plans" which will further expand its presence in the market.

DJ says it wants to continue to maintain competition in the Bali market, where its operations have seen fares lowered and demand significantly stimulated.

The IASC is now seeking further submissions on the Bali requests, which are due by 01 Sep.

## JQ launch in-town check-in

JETSTAR Asia is introducing an option for travellers to check-in for flights between Hong Kong and Singapore at two city locations.

Guests will be able to check-in at both Hong Kong Central and Kowloon train stations in-town for their JQ flight on the day of the service, at which time they will be issued with a boarding pass.

Jetstar Asia ceo Chong Phit Lian said: "We are constantly looking at ways to innovate and improve our product offering to our customers whilst still maintaining the lowest fares on all the routes we serve."

The new free service will be rolled out this month and available during MTR Airport Express opening hours, and closes 90mins prior to flight departure time.

A spokesman for Jetstar told *TD* today if the service was successful in Hong Kong it would be "viewed closely in terms of its future potential in other markets".

"This approach in Hong Kong we

believe will work well with existing transport infrastructure and customer demand within the Hong Kong market," Simon Westaway said.

At this stage there are no plans to introduce the in-town check-in at Australian cities, he indicated.

## Trafalgar prices firm

TRAFALGAR has reacted swiftly to comments from a rival tour operator about 'locked in' 2011 Europe pricing (*TD* Wed), today announcing it would guarantee 2010 prices for 2011 itineraries.

Managing director Paul McGrath said the offer "safeguards against any currency fluctuations or surcharges which may increase the cost of the tour next year."

The move follows the recent release of Trafalgar's Europe & Britain 2011 Summer Preview program, which will be available in printed format from early Sep.

"Over the past year we have seen the consumer booking cycle decrease to weeks and increase again to eight to 10 months.

"As consumer confidence grows, so to do booking lead times which means our Summer Preview program is timely and well suited to the current market," he said.

McGrath also said that should a Europe 2011 tour decrease in cost clients will receive a refund on the difference.

MEANWHILE, sister Travel Corporation tour operator Insight Vacations says its 2011 Europe itinerary pricing is already locked in for travellers who book now from its Preview Flyer (*TD* Mon).

## QF/SAA codeshare green light

THE International Air Services Commission has issued a draft decision which re-authorises the continued Qantas/SAA codeshares on the South Africa route until 31 Dec 2011.

The ruling stipulates that QF and SAA must price and sell their services on the route independently, as well as withdrawing from all IATA tariff coordination activities in relation to air fare levels between Australia and South Africa.

QF must also "take all reasonable steps to ensure that all passengers are informed, at the time of ticket reservation, of the carrier actually operating the flight," the IASC ruling stipulates.

The commission said the approval will remain in effect only while the carriers together operate at least 12 return weekly flights to South Africa.

Close monitoring of the route is also part of the deal, with Qantas ordered to submit quarterly reports to the IASC on the number of codeshare seats available for sale and sold by it on each of SAA's operated services and vice versa, as well as its quarterly yields for all passenger classes on the flights.

The IASC evaluation of the route took into account a significant reduction in passenger demand to South Africa during the global financial crisis.

The weakness in the South African economy has also seen Australian outbound travellers on the route exceed South African visitors for the first time in almost twenty years in 2009.

The commission said the entry of V Australia on the Melbourne-Johannesburg route had "clearly

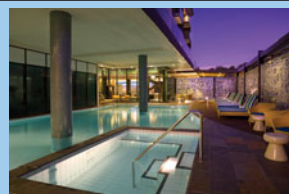

## BNE/SYD report record no's in Jul

BRISBANE and Sydney Airports have reported record passenger movements during the month of Jul, signaling strong signs of returning growth.

BNE welcomed 1,792,000 people during the period, topping the airport's previous record last month, by 30,000 travellers.

Domestic numbers rose 6.9% on last year to 1,387,717, supported by a 9.4% growth in International visitors to 404,284 at Brisbane.

"This month has shown significant recovery in arrivals, with visitors from Japan, Taiwan and China again eager to visit Brisbane and Queensland," said Brisbane Airport Corporation ceo and md Julieanne Alroe.

Qantas, Virgin Blue, QantasLink, Tiger, Jetstar and Brindabella Airlines have all "stepped up" services and capacity to Brisbane in recent times, Alroe said.

MEANWHILE, Macquarie Airports said today that "international outbound growth remains strong" at Sydney Airport, in particular for China, Japan and Korea.

SYD domestic figures for Jul were up 10% year-on-year to 2.08 million, while int'l numbers surged 7.8% to 1.003 million.

Year-to-date int'l numbers are up 8.7% on Jan-Jul 2009 at SYD.

## Snowy seeding push

RESORT operators in Australia's Snowy Mountains have launched a push for the Snowy Hydro Cloud Seeding Project to move from a scientific trial to a permanent operation in time for the 2011 winter snow sports season.

An independent scientific assesment of the scheme has shown that seeded winter storms produced an average of 14% more snow, with no evidence of any negative effects after six years of detailed monitoring.

Currently the trial only seeds about half of winter storm fronts, and the Australian Ski Areas Association said making it a permanent fixture would boost tourism and the alpine economy.

## Healthcare apps

A HELPFUL new iPhone and iPad application has just been launched, which allows travellers to find quality healthcare providers in East and Southeast Asian countries.

Designed for tourists to Tokyo, Shanghai, Manila, Singapore, Bangkok and Ho Chi Minh City the 'mPassport' app locates appropriate medical services for those in need.

The app can find an English speaking doctor or dentist and request an appointment; uses GPS to find the shortest route to medical services; translates medication brand names and key medical terms and phrases; and assesses the right emergency services for the problem in question.

The App is available on iTunes and complements other mPassport products covering Barcelona, Budapest, Dublin, Florence, London, Madrid, Paris, Prague, Rome, Vienna, Cape Town, Nairobi, Buenos Aires, Lima, Mexico City, Quito, Bermuda, Nassau, Beijing and Hong Kong.

## Air NZ Jul stats up

AIR New Zealand has reported a 7.5% year-on-year increase in pax carried on Tasman/Pacific services to 271,000 during Jul 2010.

Passenger demand was up 7.8%, backed up by a 0.7% increase in capacity, while load factors rose 5.6 points to 84.5% during the period.

Overall Air NZ Group passenger numbers were up 7.2% on last Jul, to 1,155,000 movements.

## Tiger bosses sell

THE ceo of Singapore-based Tiger Airways has offloaded a significant part of his shareholding in the carrier, as part of an institutional placement in conjunction with other major investors in the airline, Indigo Partners and Ryanasia, which is controlled by the family who founded Irish carrier Ryanair.

The S\$125m deal covered about 66 million shares, with the carrier not detailing how much each of the shareholders had sold but emphasised that Davis, Indigo and Ryanasia still remain substantial shareholders in the carrier.

Singapore Airlines didn't participate in the placement, and continues to hold 33% of Tiger.
