ACCC gives tick to JSA

THE long running Joint Services Agreement between Qantas and British Airways (*TD* 03 Nov) is set to continue for another five years, after the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission gave draft approval for its extension (*TD* breaking news yesterday).

The pact, in operation for 14 years now, allows QF and BA to coordinate prices and schedules, and has primarily been applied to the route between Australia and Europe, although it provides scope for them to cooperate on any routes worldwide.

ACCC chairman Graeme Samuel said the JSA is likely to continue to deliver lower fares and a broader availability of schedules for passengers.

"Strong competition on most routes operated under the JSA means that cost savings arising from the JSA are likely to be passed onto consumers," he said.

However the ACCC also said that there had been some decline in the level of the public benefits delivered by the JSA since it was

last considered in 2005.

"The applicants have reduced capacity on some routes and decreased the schedule options since the last authorisation," the draft determination says.

British Airways has attracted attention this week by confirming that it was stopping flights on its London-Singapore-Sydney route for some months this year, as exclusively revealed by *TD* on Wed.

And BA's share of international passengers from Australia has slumped from 4.9% a decade ago to just 1.5% last year, making it the 13th largest carrier operating here, behind JAL and United.

However the draft determination also reveals that the Qantas/BA alliance last year had a 56.1% share of the business traveller market between Australia and the UK - more than five times the 11% for Singapore Airlines and 10.4% for Emirates.

The ACCC has also declined to issue an unlimited renewal as requested by Qantas and BA, instead limiting the authorisation to five years.

The draft determination also includes an interim authorisation which will allow the JSA to continue until a final decision is made, and further submissions are now sought by 25 Feb 2010.

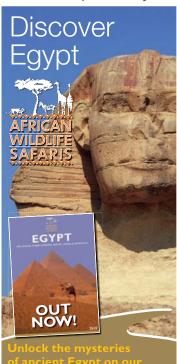

Stella survives debt crush

LAST year's restructure of the Stella Group (TD 31 Jul) saw the firm extricated from a staggering load of debt which contributed to a massive 2008/09 loss of more than half a billion dollars.

The figures are revealed in the accounts for the former Stella holding company, Global Voyager Holdings, which were lodged with ASIC yesterday.

Total revenue from continuing operations for the combined Stella Travel and Hospitality was just under a billion dollars, with earnings before interest, taxes, depreciation, amortisation and impairment of \$41 million.

But this profit was swept away by finance costs of \$177 million. depreciation and amortisation of \$32 million and a massive "impairment charge" of \$372 million, reflecting the writedown of goodwill in the business.

That gave a loss from continuing operations of \$536m - to which was added yet more losses from discontinued operations amounting to \$131m, giving a total loss for the year of \$667 million - around two thirds of the company's total revenue.

QF boosts Pilbara

QANTAS is boosting its Perth based fleet to 11 to support an increase in capacity between the WA capital and Karratha, Port Hedland and Paraburdoo.

Qantas says its adding 7 weekly return flights on the Perth-Karratha route and two extra Perth-Paraburdoo and Perth-Port Hedland services, "in response to increased demand from the mining and energy sectors".

with intangible assets such as goodwill, brand names, trade marks and management letting rights valued at \$1.42 billion.

And even taking into account the huge \$372m writedown, the intangible assets were valued at \$877 million as at 30 Jun 2009.

A detailed breakdown of the values of these brand names and other items wasn't given, but during 2009 one adjustment involved the valuation of the Best Flights brand at \$42 million.

The document points out that the figures as at 30 Jun 09 don't take into account the impact of the restructure, which saw borrowings of \$860 million reduced to \$285m of long-term debt, with repayment due in Jun 2013 - \$245m attributed to Mantra and \$40m for Stella Travel Services.

The restructure also saw amounts payable to the group's shareholders totalling \$364m exchanged for shares.

Prior to splitting the business into the separate Mantra and Stella Travel operations, the group had net liabilities of almost \$400 million, while after the restructure Mantra had net assets of \$264m, while Stella Travel had net assets of \$294m, with the financial position of each business significantly strengthened.

TG back to JNB

THAI Airways International will resume flights to Johannesburg from 17 May, with four weekly 777-200ER services on sale now.

Other changes from 28 Mar will see TG cancel its thrice weekly Bangkok-Kuwait flights, as well as the Hong Kong-Taipei sector.

Chan had to be subdued with a choke hold and the flight was diverted to Pittsburgh, where he told officers that he ate double his normal "dose" of marijuana cookies while waiting to board.

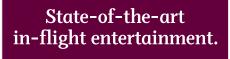

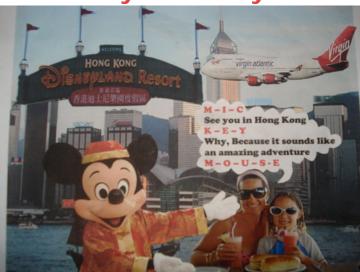
