# **CNS opposes DJ/NZ pact**

**CAIRNS** Airport has voiced its concern about the proposed Virgin Blue/Air New Zealand alliance to the competition watchdog, telling the ACCC it believes the Cairns-Auckland route will become "noncompetitive" if approved.

In a detailed submission to the Australian Competition and Consumer Protection, CNS says an alliance between the only carriers flying directly between the two cities will have a "negative public benefit" and impact on tourism to Tropical North Queensland.

"The alliance is likely to result in substantial anti-competitive detriment and higher airfares" on a "non-essential element" of the DJ/NZ pact, the commissioned report claims, saying the route is "not relevant to the core Alliance aspiration of competing for Qantas' high-yield business travel".

The report suggests other trunk routes between the countries as part of the alliance would remain competitive, as they are also linked by Qantas, Jetstar or Emirates services.

The Access Economics study suggests the alliance would result in a significant rise in market concentration, and that the QF group has shown "little appetite" to fly the CNS/AKL route, while the threat of another Australianbased player on the route is low.

It recommends the city pair be omitted from the alliance deal, or at the least limited to maintaining

current capacity levels, price monitoring and/or price caps.

Cairns Airport gm of Aviation Business Developmment, Robert Evans included in the submission a 2009 vulnerability study which indicates how "anti-competitive changes and/or economic shocks" will be more detrimental to Cairns' local economy, as tourism is a major GRP contributor.

Additionally, an aviation report that supports regional aviation development was also included in CNS Airport's submission.

MEANWHILE, Gold Coast Airport has said it "generally supports" the proposed Tasman alliance, with chief executive officer Paul Donovan suggesting the agreement could lift capacity into Australian airports.

Both NZ and DJ operate flights between OOL and New Zealand.

#### Al B777s to MEL

AIR India is planning to utilise triple class Boeing 777s between Delhi and Melbourne (TD Tue) when it commences the route later this year.

In its first statement about the return of services to Australia in over a decade, Air India said the "services will meet a long-term demand for direct connectivity" when it re-launches.

"Apart from serving the Indian Diaspora in the region, the new link will cater to the growing demand of business travellers, not only between the two countries, but also beyond India to the Gulf and Europe," the airline said.

Al's Melbourne-bound flights are still not loaded in agent GDSs or on it website but are expected to begin by late Oct/early Nov, the carrier confirmed.



# Tiger charging for no bags

TIGER Airways Australia will begin charging customers with carry-on luggage a fee of \$10 for using its airport check-in facilities from 01 Jul, the no frills carrier announced today.

The move coincides with Tiger's launch of web check-in, which will be free for passengers travelling without tagged luggage who wish to check themselves in for flights, up to 7 days in advance.

"Tiger Airways does things differently to other airlines in Australia," said MD Crawford Rix.

"Our model is based on some of the most successful and profitable low cost carriers in the world, including Ryanair," Rix said.

MEANWHILE, Tiger is raising its checked baggage fee by \$5.00 (effective 01 Jul) to \$20 and \$50 for the 15kg and 25kg allowances respectively.

# QF revamps points

QANTAS has reduced the minimum number of points required to book flights under its frequent flyer scheme to 5,000, when using the Points + Pay option.

The combination of money (credit card) and points offers QF Frequent Flyer members a sliding scale to obtain an Award Flight, with the more points used, the less cash required.

Bookings on both domestic and international flights need to be made online through the QF site.

# SkyTeam look at PG

THE SkyTeam airline alliance has its eye on a carrier closer to Australian shores, with Bangkok Airways firming as a possible contender to join the group.

Bangkok Airways (PG) president Puttipong Prasartthong-Osoth said last week that the Thai carrier was in further discussions about aligning with SkyTeam.

The move supports comments made by the alliance last week at its 10th anniversary in New York (TD Thu) where it stated it was "focused on growing its presence in other regions of the world, such as Latin America, Southeast Asia and India '

MEANWHILE, Romanian flag carrier TAROM was welcomed into the SkyTeam airline alliance on Fri (TD Wed) lifting the network's destinations by 11 cities, including Constanta, Lasi and Timisoara in Romania and Chisinau in Moldova.

#### Alaska tax cut 25%

THE Alaskan government signed legislation on Thu which will see the US state's US\$46 per head cruise tax drop by 25% to \$34.50, as flagged by TD (TD 22 Mar).

The reduced levy is expected to lure cruise lines back for the 2012 Alaska cruise season after scaling back their Alaska voyages for 2011

#### **Gucci vs Gucci**

THE Gucci Group has filed a law suit against the daughter of the late fashion mogul Paolo Gucci, after she revealed plans to open a chain of hotels under her name -Elisabetta Gucci.

The French firm is seeking "injunctive relief in order to protect its rights" against the future hotel brand.

Elisabetta Gucci earlier this month indicated her plan to open 40 hotels over the next 15 years, the first of which will be in Dubai.
