QANTAS regional offshoot Qantaslink has signalled its intention for its first international route, with QF lodging an application with the International Air Services Commission for Q400 capacity betwen Cairns and Port Moresby in Papua New Guinea.

The carrier plans to begin operating on the route from Jul, with the move following further fleet expansion for QantasLink.

"The business sector between Australia and Papua New Guinea continues to grow, and we are pleased to offer our customers the opportunity to enjoy all the benefits of the Qantas network on our premium QantasLink aircraft," said QF spokesman David Epstein.

QF/EY codeshare grows

ETIHAD and Qantas have expanded their codeshare agreement, with the EY code set to be placed on more domestic Australian flights - including on the key Sydney-Melbourne route.

The pact now includes flights from Sydney to Ayers Rock, Alice Springs, Canberra, Hobart and Melbourne, as well as from Brisbane to Cairns.

"The expansion of this codeshare agreement with Qantas reaffirms our commitment to passengers around the world who are flying to Australia and want to visit towns and cities outside the key gateways," said Etihad ceo James Hogan.

A NEW airport in Japan has commenced operations, but it's having a slow start with just one daily flight currently scheduled.

Ibaraki Airport, Japan's 98th airport, is about 80km northeast of Tokyo and has been developed with the aim of attracting budget airlines as an alternative to Haneda and Narita airports.

But so far things are a bit quiet, with the only service being an Asiana flight to Seoul.

Domestic carriers JAL and ANA have so far shunned Ibaraki because they're both focusing on cutting unprofitable routes rather than developing new ones.

NAKED boatmen could be returning to a tourist beauty spot in China, as part of a plan to revive visitation.

An ancient custom in the region involves the nude helpers hauling tourist boats through the Shennongxi Stream Gorge in Hubei province.

But visitor numbers have plummeted since 2000 when the naked boatmen were told to cover up to avoid offending women and children.

"Many tourists come here to see the naked boat trackers and they are disappointed to see them dressed," said a local official, who has volunteered to be the first one to drop his pants.

However he's been accused of seeking economic growth in the region at the cost of its dignity.

Apparently the nudist tradition originated hundreds of years ago because the boatmen's coarse clothing chafed in the water.

SYD defends itself

SYDNEY Airport has responded to a damning ACCC airport monitoring report released yesterday, saying it's out of date.

The report covers the period Jul 08-Jun 09, with the airport saying that since then it had achieved a range of milestones including opening the expanded departures level, a new outbound hall, new security screening areas and expanded restaurant options.

In the report, ACCC Chairman Graeme Samuel said that of the airports covered (ADL, BNE, MEL, PER and SYD), the performance of Sydney was "of greatest concern" with indications that the airport had "increased profits by permitting service quality to fall below that which the airlines reasonably expect."

Cruising cash king

CARNIVAL Corporation ceo Micky Arison has had a pretty good year, according to the latest rankings of the world's wealthy by US business magazine Forbes.

Arison has come in 189th on the list this year, with a net worth of US\$4.4 billion - up more than \$1.5 billion in the last 12 months.

The plane was grounded for five hours for inspection and was later cleared to resume service.

UK travel manifesto

THE Association of British Travel Agents (ABTA) has released its first manifesto, outlining a range of key issues affecting the UK travel industry.

ABTA is calling for a dedicated tourism ministry in the government, as well as increased airport capacity across the country and reform of the Air Passenger Duty impost which particularly penalises long-haul travellers to and from the UK.

CEO Mark Tanzer also wants more reform of consumer protection, saying the document "puts the issues we're fighting on in black and white.

"ABTA is serious about taking the concerns of travel agents and tour operators right to the heart of Government," he added.

New Disney pass

DISNEY is set to release a new 'premiere passport' product which is a ticket valid at all of its theme parks in the USA.

The special pass comes with no blackout dates, and was announced at the company's annual general meeting by ceo Robert Iger yesterday.

The move follows feedback from investors, and prices for the all-parks pass haven't yet been released.

BI Perth change

ROYAL Brunei Airlines has advised of a recent change in the management of its Perth office, with the departure effective 26 Feb of the carrier's Sales and Marketing Manager WA Kate Black.

The Perth operation is currently under the management and direction of Paul Lim, BI's National Sales Marketing Manager.

Secure air cargo

NEW laws have been approved by parliament to strengthen the security regime on air cargo with the implemention of measures outlined in last month's Aviation Security package.

To date only parcels could be checked by aircraft operators when it was certain they were being transported by air, meaning an operation might have to certify a large consolidated shipment packed by someone else in the supply chain.

The new laws not only allow parcels to be scrutinised before they reach the airport but they will also expand the number of industry participants that can check and certify cargo.

SWISS shows profit IATA revises losses

SWISS International Air Lines has reported a \$149m profit for 2009, "despite the still-difficult economic environment that prevailed throughout the year."

Total revenue fell 17% but the carrier made a profit in all four quarters of the year.

Australia was a good performer for the carrier, with local gm Anil Rodricks saying the operation had "held its market share in an extremely difficult year, and early indications for 2010 show a steady improvement in passenger numbers and yields.

"The San Francisco stopover from June will enhance the attractiveness of the SWISS Global product," Rodricks added.

AbirDheab

THE International Air Transport Association has once again issued a new forecast for the global aviation industry as conditions continue to improve.

IATA is now estimating a total loss of US\$2.8 billion - just half the \$5.6b it predicted in Dec.

"The improvement is largely driven by a much stronger recovery in demand seen by yearend gains that continued into the first months of 2010," IATA said.




