CX OOL CNY charters

CATHAY Pacific will operate a number of direct charter flights from Hong Kong to the Gold Coast during the upcoming Chinese New Year period.

Two-class A330-300 aircraft will be utilised for the services which will take place HKG-OOL on 16, 19, 20, 26 and 27 Feb with the return flights the following day.

ANA plots Sydney return

JAPAN'S All Nippon Airways is apparently planning to resume services between Tokyo and Sydney, with reports by Japanese newspaper Yomiuri Shimbun claiming the flights would operate from Haneda Airport.

The Star Alliance carrier last operated Australian flights in 1999, and the prospective move follows the recent Qantas announcement of its new Sydney-Haneda route (TD 09 Dec).

Qantas will launch daily Haneda flights on 31 Jul 15, with ceo Alan Joyce citing strong growth in patronage on the Japan route which will also see the debut of four times weekly Brisbane-Narita services in Aug alongside flights to Japan from a further yet-tobe-announced Australian port on three alternate days.

QR to add Amsterdam

QATAR Airways will debut flights to the Netherlands this year, with a new daily Doha-Amsterdam route to commence operation on 16 Jun 15.

Reservations are now open for the new route which will utilise a Boeing 787-8 aircraft.

MEANWHILE GDS displays also now show QR resuming plans for a second daily Doha-London Heathrow A380 service.

Previously QR planned to use its A380 on QR1/2 from 01 Dec 14 but a change of plans will now see the superjumbo deployed on double daily Doha-LHR flights effective from 16 Jul 15.

Etihad AR codeshare

ETIHAD Airways has today announced yet another codeshare partnership, this time with South American carrier Aerolineas Argentinas.

Effective from 01 Feb 15, the EY code will be placed on Aerolineas Argentinas domestic and regional flights over AR's Buenos Aires hub - despite Etihad not offering flights there itself at this stage.

At present, Etihad's only port in South America is Brazil's Sao Paolo.

"Guests will be able to travel on Etihad Airways marketed flights to Buenos Aires and from there to 20 popular destinations in South America," the carrier said.

Etihad ceo James Hogan said the AR partnership is a significant development for both airlines.

"Codeshares are a fundamental pillar of Etihad Airways' strategy... we are now able to enhance our business and leisure travel offering between the UAE, Argentina and onwards to the strategically important South American market," he said.

No AirAsia survivors

DEBRIS from the disappeared AirAsia flight 8501 from Surabava to Singapore has been found off the coast of Borneo, with three bodies recovered late vesterday and the recovery operation now continuing through the day.

The A320-200 was found in the Karimata Strait, about 110 nautical miles from Pangkalan Bun, with AirAsia group ceo and founder Tony Fernandes saying he was devastated at the outcome.

"It's an experience I never dreamt of happening and it's probably an airline ceo's worst nightmare...the passengers were on my aircraft and I have to take responsibility for that," he said.

Items from the doomed flight were spotted by an Indonesian air force plane, and ships headed to the area where divers are searching in 30m deep waters.

The debris is floating about 10km from the aircraft's last known radar location.

UA, Orbitz challenge flight startup

UNITED Airlines and US online travel agency Orbitz have filed a joint lawsuit against a website called skiplagged.com which offers cheap tickets by searching for "hidden city" pricing where travellers purposely buy onestop flights for a lower fare and disembark at the intermediate city, rather than continuing onto the itinerary's final destination in violation of airline fare rules.

The site was founded last year by 22-year-old Aktarer Zaman, who claims it is not illegal but simply exposes an "inefficiency in airline pricing".

The loophole only works for one way flights with no checked bags, but UA and Orbitz say it makes it difficult to accurately count passengers to the final destination and therefore affects fuel load calculations.

They are seeking US\$75,000 in damages from the entrepeneur.

New Qld routes for Rex

REGIONAL Express will debut three new regulated Queensland routes on schedule tomorrow, after being awarded the right to operate the services in a state government tender (TD 15 Oct).

Rex already held the rights for the Northern 1 route from Townsville to Winton to Longreach, as well as Northern 2 which covers Townsville to Hughenden, Richmond, Julia Creek and Mt Isa, having flown these services for the last 4 years.

The additions are the Gulf Route from Cairns to Normanton, Mornington Island, Burketown, Doomadgee and Mt Isa; the Western 1 Route from Brisbane to Toowoomba (Wellcamp Airport), St George, Cunnamulla and Thargomindah; and the Western 2 Route from Brisbane to Toowoomba, Charleville, Quilpie, Windorah, Birdsville, Bedourie, Boulia and Mt Isa.

Warrick Lodge, gm network strategy and sales, said the Rex team had worked tirelessly over the last ten weeks to ensure that the new regulated air services can commence on schedule.

It's been a huge job, with the carrier adding 16 new ports to its network as a result of the expansion and a new Area Air Operator's Certificate required.

"Rex is honoured to be selected by the Queensland government to deliver these essential services that provide critical linkages between Brisbane, Cairns and Townsville to 20 regional communities that span the entire state," Lodge said.

He said the team had been liaising with local communities and looks forward to building relationships as flights commence.

Rex will also launch a new service between Cairns and Townsville effective 03 Jan.

HLO buyback

HELLOWORLD this morning advised it would suspend its onmarket share buyback program from today through until 27 Feb, in accordance with its formal share trading policy.

The suspension is in place until the second trading day following the announcement of the company's preliminary financial results on 25 Feb.

Helloworld shares are currently trading at 33c each.

LGW emergency

LONDON Gatwick Airport was shut down overnight due to an in-flight emergency on a Virgin Atlantic 747 aircraft which developed a landing gear issue.

Flight VS43 had departed LGW for Las Vegas but returned after developing the fault and then burning off fuel for several hours.

The plane landed safely and the airport reopened at 7pm, with operations now back to normal.

MH adds sim card

MALAYSIA Airlines has begun offering the OneSimCard product as part of its in-flight duty free offering on international flights.

OneSimCard offers international travellers discounts of as much as 85% on voice, text messaging and internet data roaming rates, including free incoming calls in more than 160 countries.

OneSimCard comes with both a European and US mobile phone number and works in unlocked GSM devices and phones.

Crystal set for first ever circumnavigation

CRYSTAL Cruises is celebrating its 25th birthday in 2015 with its first ever circumnavigation of the globe - a 108-night Miami round trip which departs 14 Jan 15 aboard *Crystal Serenity*.

QF 737 pilot pay deal

QANTAS shorthaul 737 pilots have agreed to a new pay agreement which will give them annual increments of 3% through until 2018.

69% of the 560 aviators backed the offer, with the Australian and International Pilots Association saying it was a positive outcome.

However Jetstar pilots are not in the same boat, with 95% recently rejecting a pay offer.

HA outrigger event

MORE than 140 outrigger canoe racing teams from across the globe are set to compete in the upcoming Hawaiian Airlines Sydney Harbour Challenge this year, with an overwhelming response to the second annual event set to be staged on 28 Feb-01 Mar 2015.

Last year the 20km race attracted 93 teams, and in 2015 this is set to be significantly boosted with a program centred on Manly Cove.

A Hawaiian cultural program and entertainment will also be provided at the wharf - and once again HA will be entering a team of its own employees.

DXB traffic up 4.3%

DUBAI Airports has reported a 4.3% year-on-year increase in Nov passenger traffic, which amounted to 5.565m.

Year to date traffic is up 5.9% at DXB to 63.98 million, while Nov aircraft movements rose 10% to 34,690 take-offs and landings.

Eastern Europe was the fastest growing region, up 54.1% year on year due to strong growth from Budapest, Prague and Warsaw.

Dubai Airports ceo Paul Griffiths said the strong year to date performance combined with some of the busiest days on record in Dec meant he was "confident of ending the year above the 70 million mark and confirming our position as the world's busiest international airport".

China agency move

QUNAR, one of China's largest online travel agencies, has made a major investment in bricks and mortar by taking a stake in Traveling Bestone, a business with 3,500 franchised travel agencies across the country.

However rather than backing traditional distribution, Qunar said the move aimed to transform consumer behaviour in China, where a significant proportion of travel is still sold offline.

"This deal will help to bring more of this business online," the company said, with a combined B2B platform set to offer shared inventory for both Qunar and Bestone packages.

There will also be a co-branded travel app targeted at Bestone's mostly offline customer base, offering incentives for them to embrace mobile booking.

"This will give Qunar access to more suppliers and more purchasers," the company said.

Brussels boost

BRUSSELS Airlines is set to expand its operations within Europe this year, with the addition of new routes to Zagreb in Croatia and Bordeaux in France.

The Bordeaux route will operate four times per week effective 29 Mar 15, while the six weekly Zagreb flights will debut 20 Sep.

Marco Polo handy

HONG Kong's Marco Polo Hotels are offering a free "handy smartphone" for guests staying at all three of its properties.

The Handy device comes preloaded with software adapted for tourists visiting Hong Kong, giving them unlimited 3G mobile internet and local calls, a wi-fi hotspot including tethering for laptops and tablets, and instant access to the hotel concierge.

The Handy also allows guests to receive exclusive offers such as restaurant specials.

Dusit hotel school

THAI hospitality group Dusit International has announced the launch of a new Dusit Thani Hotel School in Bangkok.

To be operated separately from the existing Dusit Thani College, the Hotel School will have a curriculum based on ASEAN **Common Competency Standards** for Tourism Professionals.

Offering both certificate and diploma level courses, credits from the Dusit Thani Hotel School will be transferable to higher education institutions across the country
