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Govt insists ACCC rethink

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THE Federal Govt is urging the Australian competition regulator to reconsider knocking back a tie-up between Qantas & China Eastern Airlines, arguing its draft decision is "too narrowly focused on the Sydney-Shanghai route".

Aviation Industry Policy Branch gm Stephen Borthwick was among the first responding to the ACCC after it flagged it was likely to deny the proposed coordination on flights between Australian and China (**TD** 24 Mar).

Borthwick reiterated the pact's benefits - better coordination of schedules & frequencies and providing QF pax greater access to China via Shanghai - would aid Australia's tourism industry by enabling both airlines to market & sell destinations in Australia. He said the Draft Determination

was focused too heavily on the Sydney-Shanghai city pair, "rather than the operations of the wider Australia-China market".

It was "inappropriate" to estimate Air China, the direct competitor of the alliance, may respond to the pact by reducing capacity, Borthwick flagged.


"If Qantas & China Eastern were to reduce or limit capacity... to increase yield & profitability, there are few barriers to Air China increasing their capacity if such a commercial opportunity emerged," he suggested.

Borthwick also said new seat capacity between Australia and China (*TD* 23 Jan) would provide "further opportunities for Chinese carriers to service Australian gateways from a variety of destinations". Further submissions on **page 4.**

AUSTRALIANS who travel in school holiday periods can expect to pay as much as 64% more than trips taken during term-time, according to a new study released by consumer group CHOICE.

The organisation compared the prices of identical trips taken during the first or last weeks of term and in holidays for a family of four, including flights and seven nights' accommodation.

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The Gold Coast saw the highest jump, with prices for Jetstar flights and accom at Turtle Beach Resort up 64%, while a trip to Bali (Virgin Australia/Bali Dynasty Resort) was found to be 42% more costly during the holidays.

Hawaii surged 25% (Qantas/ Fairmont Kea Lani) and prices in Fiji (Fiji Airways/Sheraton Denarau Villas) were 22% higher during the school holiday periods.

"It's not surprising that parents are tempted to pull their kids out of school during the last weeks of term time to avoid the peak period hike on flights and accommodation," said CHOICE spokesman Matt Levey.

He said that while NSW is the only state to explicitly count holidays during the school term as formal absences, most other states and territories require permission for any time away.



Chinese visa trial goes permanent

FEDERAL Trade and Investment Minister Andrew Robb has confirmed that the current online visitor visa pilot for Chinese travellers will be extended to offer three-year multiple entry visas to approved applicants.

Formerly visitor visas for Chinese arrivals were only valid for a year, with Robb saying the move showed the government was "determined to do what it can to help Australia capture more than its share of the rapidly growing Chinese tourist market".

He said repeat visitors are an increasingly important market sector, as they tend to stay longer and spend more, as well as venture into regional areas.

Speaking at the Qantas Australian Tourism Awards in Adelaide on Fri night, Robb said the tourism and hospitality sector was one of Australia's great strengths, which the government was determined to back. The move was welcomed by ATEC, the TTF and Sydney Airport, with China on track to become Australia's largest international visitor market by 2016.

The TTF pointed out that the minimum \$130 cost of Australian visas for Chinese travellers was still prohibitive and much more costly than for visitors from Hong Kong, Japan, Malaysia and the US.

Vale Ashley Spencer

FORMER Hilton vice president Australasia, Ashley Spencer, died last Fri, just two months after stepping down from a 27 year career with the group (*TD* 21 Jan). Hilton Worldwide president Martin Rinck said Spencer had made a huge contribution.

"He was a trusted advisor and true gentleman whose determination and strength and passion for our industry were indisputable," Rinck said.

Industry rally for QF/MU pact

MULTIPLE submissions have been received by the Australian Competition & Consumer Comm, calling for the watchdog to reverse its intention to dismiss a proposed airline alliance between Qantas and China Eastern (**pg 1**).

Late last month the ACCC said it was likely to deny the pact, saying in a Draft Determination it was concerned that QF was aligning with its main competitor on the Sydney-Shanghai route - its only route between Australia & China.

The Australia-China Relations Institute urged the watchdog to evaluate its decision based on outbound travel demand from China, which it says has "fallen steadily" over the past decade.

Citing a report from Oxford Economics, the ACRI said Sydney currently ranks as the 11th top global city for Chinese traveller spending, but rising competition, particularly from cities in the US, will see it slip to 18th by 2023.

CEO of the National Tourism Alliance Juliana Payne said the ACCC should reconsider its Draft Determination.

"We believe the public good and tourism industry benefits have not been taken fully into account in this decision, and the draft determination constrains the ability of Australian airlines to develop a strategic hub in China".

Sydney Airport boss Kerrie Mather said she supported any initiative that would "significantly improve aviation links", adding the pact would see Shanghai be a "more attractive proposition for visitors to Australia when connecting from Europe, North America and the rest of Asia".

Tourism & Events Queensland chairman Stephen Gregg said the proposed venture "would have significant positive benefits for Queensland tourism".

The ACCC is expected to make its final decision early next month.

US to probe Gulf subsidy claims

THE US Government has announced it will review claims the 'Big Three' state-owned Gulf airlines receive subsidies from their respective governments (TD 11 Mar) which are "distorting the global aviation market".

Under the microscope by the US Department of State, Commerce and Transportation is a white paper prepared by Delta Air Lines, American Airlines and United, that alleges Emirates, Etihad Airways and Qatar Airways have received govt funded kickbacks.

"The US government takes seriously the concerns raised in the report and is interested in receiving insights and feedback from stakeholders before any decisions are made regarding what action, if any, should be taken," the Obama Administration commented on Fri.

A public forum will be created where stakeholders can submit views on the subject which will be listed on www.regulations.gov.

Solomon A320 delays

FURTHER delays sourcing parts for an engine during scheduled heavy maintenance has seen Solomon Airlines delay the reintroduction of its Airbus A320 into full service until 30 Apr.

Solomon Airlines had intended to have the A320 airborne on 13 Apr, two weeks later than its original return flagged for 29 Mar.

The carrier is taking advantage of the delay by attending to some phased maintenance now instead of the next scheduled service in Feb, gm of operations and commercial Gus Kraus said.

Due the interim period, IE will continue to operate the chartered Nauru Airlines Boeing 737-300 on its rotations between Honiara-Brisbane, Port Vila and Nadi.




