Hyatt hacked

HYATT Hotels Corporation has launched an investigation after hackers may have obtained credit card numbers or other sensitive information from customers.

The hotelier said malware had been discovered on computers that operate the payment processing systems for Hyattmanaged locations.

"As soon as we discovered the activity, we launched an investigation and engaged leading third-party cyber security experts," Hyatt global president of operations Chuck Floyd said.

Is a statement issued just before Christmas, Floyd urged Hyatt customers to review their payment card account statements & report unauthorised charges.

Fiji Airways to India?

TALKS between the Fiji Govt & officials from India next month are likely to include discussing the potential launch of flights by Fiji Airways to India.

Fiji Minister for Public Enterprise Aiyaz Sayed Khaiyum said an air services agreement between the two countries was a priority.

"Once the air service agreement is sorted out than it does open more opportunities for airlines from India, and of course our national airline carrier, to be able to enter into partnership agreement whether its co-sharing or an inter airline agreement," Fiji One reported the former Fiji Tourism Minister saying last week.

New China-Sydney routes

CHINESE carriers continue to take advantage of an expanded Australia-China air services agreement inked 11 months ago, with a number of new routes flagged to debut next year.

Air China has sought a green light from the Civil Aviation Administration of China to introduce daily services from Chengdu Shuangliu Int'l Airport (CTU) to Sydney, starting Jun.

Boeing settlement

BOEING has agreed to pay the US government US\$12 million to resolve multiple pending and potential enforcement cases.

The pact with the FAA will see Boeing implement & improve several certification processes "to further enhance the airworthiness and continued compliance of all BCA [Boeing Commercial Airplanes] products."

The US Dept of Transportation said "Boeing has agreed to implement improvements in its design, planning, production and maintenance planning processes, and has already implemented several of these improvements."

CTU is China's fourth largest mainland airport and earlier this month recorded 40m passenger movements for the year-to-date.

The Star Alliance member airline intends to offer daily frequencies on the CTU-SYD route using Airbus A330-200s and will be the sole carrier flying the city pair.

MEANWHILE, China Southern Airlines is set to test the water with new seasonal flights between Shenzhen in the Guangdong Province and Sydney, operating thrice weekly from 28 Jan-31 Mar.

The route will be operated using triple class Airbus A330s.

Airnorth to Wellcamp

REGIONAL carrier Airnorth will launch new routes from Cairns and Melbourne to Brisbane West Wellcamp Airport in Mar.

The Toowoomba-based airport announced the new routes on Christmas Eve, which will include thrice weekly services to the TNQ hub and daily return services to the Victorian capital - Airnorth's first southern route.

"We are extremely excited to be able to offer our customers direct return flights to two of Australia's premier travel destinations," said Brisbane West Wellcamp Aiport general manager Phil Gregory.

Airnorth will operate 76-seat Embraer E170 jets on both routes, adding 1,520 seats per week out of WTB.

Flights commence from 14 Mar.

Air France strikes?

INDUSTRIAL action has been called by two separate Air France unions which could see pilots walk off the job from 10-13 Jan.

The move by AF's Alter union is in response to "scandalous disciplinary procedures" against two members suspended in Oct.

Another strike is earmarked by Air France's ground staff union CGT on 28 Jan in response to planned redundancies for up to 3,000 employees.

VA hazard warnings

VIRGIN Australia is advising the trade that customers must be made aware of restrictions on the carriage of hazardous materials aboard aircraft, which come into force from 01 Jan.

Under Australian and US law, ticketing agents selling VA flights are required to inform customers of the following message at the time of ticket purchase, Virgin Australia said in a memo.

"Certain hazardous materials such as explosives, poisons and corrosives are prohibited onboard the aircraft.

Failure to comply with these restrictions could result in legal action such as fines.

Disney revises Med

PORT calls in Greece, Turkey & Malta have been scrapped by Disney Cruise Line on a 12-night Mediterranean voyage aboard Disney Magic on 01 Aug.

Disney has replaced port visits to Athens & Mykonos in Greece, Kusadasi in Turkey and Valletta in Malta with Olbia in Sardinia, Civitavecchia, Naples and Livorno, Italy; Palermo, Sicily; Villefranchesur-Mer and Cannes, France; and Palma de Mallorca.


Prebooked passengers are being given a choice of a refund, a change of sailing or an onboard credit of \$1,000 if they remain on their original cruise.

MH132 off-course?

PASSENGERS aboard Malaysia Airlines Christmas Eve flight MH132 from Auckland to Kuala Lumpur nearly spent Christmas Day in Sydney after the cockpit received incorrect flight plans.


Malaysia's Strait Times reports pilots of the flight were directed to fly south, instead of north, by its Operations Dispatch Centre and that Auckland Air Traffic Control had inadvertently been given an earlier flight plan.

Eight minutes into the flight, the pilot of the Airbus A330 queried with AKL control tower why the flight had been directed south.

In a statement saying, MH said: "Both routes were following an approved flight path & the aircraft had enough fuel for both routes."

"The safety of both passengers & crew were never compromised at any time.

"Malaysia Airlines is currently conducting its investigation in the flight plan submission."

New Cebu UAE slots

FILIPINO carrier Cebu Pacific has been authorised to add seven new weekly flights to the United Arab Emirates.

The budget carrier already operates daily flights between Manila and Dubai, with the new allocation enabling Cebu Pacific to fly to any UAE destination.

EUROPCAR Australia advises it has closed its location at Knox in Victoria, effective immediately.

The firm's Gold Coast Burleigh Heads outlet has also had a name change to Gold Coast Southport.

Hunter Region 20 year plan

THE development of strategies to enhance tourism infrastructure in Australia's seventh biggest city has been identified as a goal in the Draft Hunter Regional Plan.

The discussion paper has been released by the NSW Govt and outlines a 20 year vision geared towards "developing the region as a powerhouse economy," said Parliamentary Secretary for the Hunter, Scot MacDonald.

It encompasses the local govts of Cessnock, Dungog, Gloucester, Great Lakes, Lake Macquarie, Maitland, Port Stephens, Muswellbrook, Newcastle, Singleton and Upper Hunter.

"The Hunter has competitive advantages due to the appeal of its urban, rural and natural areas and has the potential to grow the tourism sector," the 88-page document states.

Citing the Newcastle Destination Management Plan, Final Report released in Jun 2013, the paper said there are several emerging markets "that should be targeted

IAG A320 conversion

INTERNATIONAL Airlines Group, the parent company of British Airways, Iberia, Aer Lingus and Vueling, has announced it is converting options for 15 Airbus A320neo aircraft into firm orders.

IAG said the A320neos would be delivered between 2021 & 2022. and may be used on any of the company's four airlines.

At the time of order in 2013, the A320neo had a list price of approx \$US92 million per aircraft.

NZ assesses services

SUBMISSIONS are sought by the New Zealand Ministry of Transport (MOT) about the future of small passenger services - such as Uber - in New Zealand.

The public consultation will include a review of taxi, private hire, shuttles, "dial-a-driver", ridesharing & carpooling services.

It comes as the MOT determined existing rules for the sector are based on a model established in the 1980s and not keeping pace with the rise of technology-based systems.

Of the five options are already evaluated, the NZ government said its preference is to create a new single class system, in which operators have responsibility for safety and compliance.

The regulator said the move would promote competition between service providers, as "rules would apply consistently".

It ruled transport fares would be "transparent to consumers, with the basis of the fare being agreed before the trip starts."
