Lizard Is set to rebuild

EXECUTIVE director of Lizard Island Greg Magi has vowed to reopen the property after it was lashed by the Cat 4 Cyclone Nathan earlier this month.

The Great Barrier Reef-based resort was preparing to soft open next month after an extensive refurbishment (TD 23 May), featuring new villas, plunge pools, a new Essentia day spa and refurbished rooms and suites.

"Whilst we continue to assess the full impact of category 4, Cyclone Nathan, on the buildings and environment in and around the resort, we wish to make it very clear that our intention is to rebuild and reopen Lizard Island as one of Australia's most prestigious resorts," Magi said.

"At this time however, we are still determining the time-frame."

QF revises fares tomorrow

QANTAS and Emirates will launch a new international Economy fare structure effective 01 Apr, including a revised seasonality approach for flights to Singapore, Malaysia and Thailand.

The partner carriers have completed a tariff review for their broader joint network which will include "revised fare levels, new seasonal date ranges and peak period and day of week surcharges" - all of which will be implemented from tomorrow.

For the three affected Asian markets, there will no longer be seasonal indicators as part of the fares, with traditional shoulder and high seasons removed.

Instead, Peak Period surcharges (Q surcharges) will cover periods when there is increased demand. Full details of the impact on the

wider QF/EK network - including flights to the Middle East, UK, Europe and North Africa - haven't been released at this stage, but an update on the Qantas agent site confirms that new seasonal date ranges and surcharges will apply from tomorrow.

All existing unticketed international Economy bookings must be finalised by today or they will be reassessed and ticketed using the new fare structure.

The carriers said they "regularly review our international fares to ensure we remain competitive".



Vail buys Perisher Valley

AUSTRALIA'S largest ski resort is set to join the Vail Resorts family, with confirmation this morning that the US ski giant has purchased Perisher Valley in the Australian alps for \$176.6m in cash (*TD* breaking news).

Vail chairman and ceo Rob Katz announced the deal, saying it was part of Vail Resorts' continued strategy "to drive season pass sales and build loyalty with guests from around the world.

"Australia is one of the most important international markets for ski resorts across the Northern Hemisphere, generating an estimated over 1 million skier visits annually to resorts in North America, Japan and Europe.

"We see this as a groundbreaking acquisition that will dramatically enhance the connection between our company and Australian skiers and riders," Katz said.

The deal includes the Perisher, Smiggin Holes, Blue Cow and Guthega ski areas as well as associated lodging, ski schools, rental and transport operations.

Vail expects Perisher to generate

"incremental resort reported EBITDA" of about \$20m in the first year after acquisition - \$38m of earnings during the ski season and \$18m of losses over summer.

Perisher's \$749 Freedom Pass season pass, which reopened for sale this morning when the announcement was made, will give holders access to Vail properties in the US.

All of Vail's US Epic Pass holders will also enjoy unlimited and unrestricted skiing at Perisher.

AR, NZ codeshare

AEROLINEAS Argentinas is set to commence a new codeshare partnership with Air New Zealand, in conjunction with NZ's new thrice weekly Auckland-Buenos Aires flights (TD 25 Mar).

The AR code will initially appear on Air NZ's AKL-EZE services as well as trans-Tasman flights to Melbourne and Sydney.

MEANWHILE, Air NZ is set to deploy its Boeing 787-9 Dreamliner aircraft on its daily Auckland-Singapore flights effective from 16 Nov this year, replacing 777-200ERs.

TWO travel industry experts have teamed up to offer a new transfer solution aimed at providing a new revenue stream for Australian travel agents.

Former SAA country manager Thevan Krishna and Brad Wicks, ex Cruise Office and helloworld wholesale have together developed Ugotransfers, which brings transfer companies from across Australia together into a single online portal.

Initially covering Australian destinations, the website offers airport, cruise and hotel transfers along with groups, charter and wedding options.

THE new Qantas Club 'smart casual' dress code (*TD* 13 Feb) will apply from tomorrow, with lounge staff given discretion to refuse entry to guests who do not meet the appropriate standard.

Agents who want to utilise the service can register online, and any bookings they make on the one-stop site are commissionable.

A 24-7 emergency support number is provided in the event of any dramas, and the site offers fixed rates from suppliers which can provide a range of services from private luxury limousines through to group shuttles.

New CZ regional ceo

CHINA Southern Airlines today announced the appointment of Louis Lu as its new managing director for Australia and NZ.

He was most recently the carrier's senior vp for the Americas, and prior to that ran CZ operations in Malaysia.

Currently China Southern operates 46 weekly flights to Australia and NZ, with plans to increase to 53 this year.

France promo plans

ATOUT France has revealed plans to step up its promotional activities in Australia with a series of key trade events later this year.

Speaking at the Rendez-vous en France trade fair in Paris, the agency's Director for Australia Patrick Benhamou said the major push will be the French Travel Workshop to be held in Sydney and Melbourne on 06-07 Sep.

Over 100 French professionals representing hotels and DMCs will be out to sell France to over 1,200 travel agents, with Paris as the focus destination, he said.

From late Nov, Atout France will host an 'East Side Story' agent seminar in Sydney and Melbourne, showcasing the Alsace, Burgundy and Champagne regions.

"The three regions will promote a special package created by French Travel Connection with cycling and wine activities, and train travel, as they are all close to each other," added Benhamou.


SWEDEN has come up with a novel idea to encourage arriving or departing passengers to part with their loose change and send it to a worthy cause.

VA Red Centre debut

NORTHERN Territory Minister for Tourism Adam Giles has urged Territorians to get behind Virgin Australia's new Red Centre flights.

The carrier yesterday launched new flights between Adelaide-Alice Springs-Darwin, bringing fresh competition for tourist and locals, Giles commented.

He said to ensure competition "is here to stay" and downward pressure remains on ticket prices, travellers should support VA.

Virgin Australia will operate the route thrice weekly using 737s.

A 20 day sale offering at least 20% off airfares between Alice Springs and VA's Australian hubs is being offered to kick-start sales on the route.

MEANWHILE, Virgin Australia has opened the doors to two new lounges in Darwin & Alice Springs today, seen as "an important step in bringing strong competition to the Northern Territory," cco Judith Crompton commented.

Rejigged OZ 777 to SYD

ASIANA Airlines is planning to introduce its new 777-200ER cabin product on the Seoul Incheon-Sydney route from 28 May, GDS displays indicate.

OZ's triple class 777-200ER will operate on two weekly flights (Thu & Sun ex ICN) until 25 Jun, but will be sold only as two class.

Between 28 Jun and 20 Sep, Asiana will introduce new 777-200LR jets featuring 24 lie-flat beds in Business class and 271 Economy seats.

Cairns-Mt Isa relinked

REGIONAL Express will launch a new direct route between Cairns and Mount Isa from 25 May, yesterday revealing it will base three aircraft in the FNQ hub.

The move comes in response to demand from businesses and individual travellers.

Regional Express (Rex) will offer four weekly services on the Queensland Coast to Outback Regular Public Transport route, with flights departing Cairns at 0630 on Mon, Wed, Thu and Fri, arriving into Mount Isa at 0835.

The return flight departs ISA at 1830 & will land at 2030 in CNS.

"This will allow business travellers from Cairns to spend a full day in Mount Isa before returning home late evening," Rex gm network strategy and sales Warrick Lodge said yesterday.

The announcement follows the induction of Regional Express' new weekday service linking Cairns and Bamaga in the Northern Peninsula Area.

Lodge added that the regional carrier would consider boosting its Cairns-based aircraft fleet "as new opportunities arise".

"We invite the communities in the Cape region as well as elsewhere in North Qld to contact us if they believe that they have a case for a viable air service," Lodge remarked.

IT MUST be only a matter of time before we start to see currency related surcharges from suppliers with the Australian dollar plumbing near six-year lows over the last week due to declines in global commodities markets.

As well as dropping almost one cent against the US greenback overnight, the Aussie also declined against the Euro and the British pound Sterling - while drops in the local currency were also recorded against the Japanese yen and Chinese yuan.

The Australian dollar is also at a new 30 year low against the New Zealand dollar.

Can I bring it back?

AUSTRALIAN Customs & **Border Protection Services has** enhanced its web page to now provide imagery of souvenirs that travellers may find problems with when re-entering the country.

The Can I bring it back? page on the Customs website lists 40 of the most common items prohibited or restricted, many of which are bought in Southeast Asia or South Pacific.

Items are listed in categories under contamination, firearms, food & drink, medicine, market goods & shopping, substances, weapons, duty-free and terrorism material.

Listed items include wooden & woven wares, hormones & kava.

Browsers can refine the search by destination, with popular tourist hot spots including Bali, Hanoi, Kuala Lumpur and Phuket in Asia and Suva in the Oceania.

Other items include laser pointers and tasers.

ACBPS regional commander NSW Tim Fitzgerald said, "Some travellers assume items such as blow pipes, martial arts weapons, and BB guns are relatively harmless and make interesting, cheap souvenirs. However, they can cause serious injury and should not be brought back."

CHINA'S Hainan Airlines has signed an order with Boeing for 30 787-9 Dreamliner aircraft worth US\$7.7 billion at list prices as it looks to expand int'l routes.

Airlines act up front

VIRGIN Australia, Qantas Group and Regional Express have acted on new federal government rules regulating cockpit personnel, all moving to adopt the new policy.

In separate statements, Qantas said it will require two approved people in the cockpit in all stages of flight on aircraft of 50+ seats.

QF added that smaller aircraft generally operate on short sectors of one to two hours where pilots shouldn't need to leave seats.

Regional Express added it agreed with the policy but that it should apply to all aircraft, imposing its own policy of two crew members on the flight deck at all times.

"All RPT flights requiring the carriage of a flight attendant should be subject to this requirement," REX commented.

World's tallest hotel

SWITZERLAND is preparing to trump Dubai for the title of the world's tallest hotel, with a local entrepreneur unveiling plans for a sky-high property in the Alps.

Remo Stoffel, chairman of facilities management firm Farnek, said he has collaborated with an American architect to build the 381m structure, which will offer 107 rooms and open in 2019.

Dubai's JW Marriott Marquis currently holds the title at 355m.


EY European boost

AFTA UPDATE

The latest updates from AFTA's Chief Executive, Jayson Westbury

FIRST off, may I take this opportunity to wish everyone an enjoyable Easter for the weekend ahead. Easter has many meanings to different people and more than anything I hope it is a time for family and friends to get together as a long weekend is ahead of us.

To political matters, by now those in NSW would be aware of the state election and the reinstatement of Premier Mike Baird. AFTA has enjoyed a solid working relationship with the Baird Government and I am sure this will continue for the four years ahead.

As we do in all jurisdictions, AFTA maintains close working relationships with both sides of politics and we will be keen to meet the many new Labor members of the NSW parliament as they commence working for their electorates. For NSW what is important is that the elected government will have a clear majority which will allow it to get on with governing the state and implementing its policies.

This is of course not the case in almost all other jurisdictions around the country as Australians seem to be putting in place minority governments, something that I guess we will all just have to get used to.

On other state political matters, it would seem that things in Queensland may take a twist with the revelations around the member for Cook being sacked from the Labor party leaving the Premier in Queensland in the vexed position of governing with a questionable minority. Prior to this revelation about the member for Cook, the Palaszczuk Government held the parliament thanks to an independent leaving a very fine line, but at least they were in a situation to govern.

As I have said many times before, a week is a long time in politics, but in Queensland it may well be that a day is a long time in politics as we watch this situation unfold. There are many possibilities and I am sure we will see them all play out over the coming days and weeks, but there is a chance that Queensland may be going back to an election.

For AFTA we still have a number of matters before the various state parliaments and of importance is the extension to the support from reserve TCF funds for the ongoing extended marketing activities of ATAS. While the budget is set and will include significant activity, the idea of having more TCF funds contributed has been around for a while. The tricky part for us is to work out who we are talking to so we can get on with a decision. Stay tuned as they say.

DESTINATION NSW has signed a two year Memorandum of **Understanding with STA Travel** which will see Sydney and regional NSW promoted to all of STA's international markets.

DNSW ceo Sandra Chipchase said the state was targeting youth arrivals growth, with the campaign including the UK, USA, Germany, Singapore, Japan & NZ.
