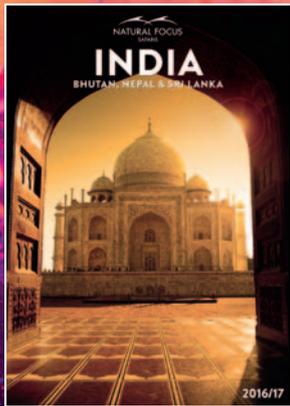

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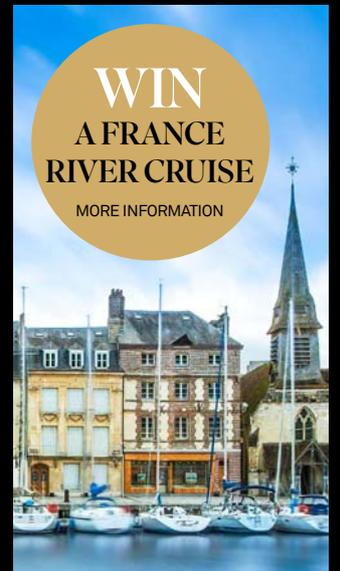

Analyst starts HLO coverage

RESPECTED travel and tourism financial analyst John O'Shea from Bell Potter Securities has initiated coverage of Helloworld Limited, with his first report rating the stock, currently trading at \$3.18 per share, as a 'buy'.

Despite promoting a range of 2016 tours to Tasmania, Europe and Cairns, email replies confirm the business has ceased trading.

The agency was set up by the late Helen Georgas who died suddenly about 12 months ago at the age of just 47.
