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SQ aircraft catches fire

NO PASSENGERS or crew have been injured in an incident at Singapore's Changi Airport this morning, when a Singapore Airlines Boeing 777 caught fire during an emergency landing.

Flight SQ368 from Singapore to Milan turned back to its origin about two hours after departure, after its pilot reported engine problems, with the Straits Times reporting a fuel leak.

As the plane touched down the passengers reportedly clapped and cheered, but then became somewhat concerned when the right engine burst into flames.

The carrier said the blaze was extinguished by emergency services with no injuries to the 241 people on board.

"Passengers disembarked through stairs and were transported to the terminal

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building by bus," Singapore Airlines said in a statement.

An alternate aircraft and crew has been organised to take the passengers to Italy, while videos of the blaze have already attracted hundreds of thousands of views on social media.

Escarpment expands

THE Escarpment Group, which owns the Hydro Majestic Hotel and Lilianfels in the NSW Blue Mountains, has purchased the Peppers Convent Hotel in the Hunter Valley.

It's the first move by the company outside of the Blue Mountains, with the 17 room Convent property and its associated fine dining restaurant Circa 1876 sold as a going concern alongside a ten year management agreement with Mantra Group.

The \$5m deal was a "strategic investment for Escarpment Group and further demonstrates our commitment to regional tourism in Australia," according to Escarpment gm Ralf Bruegger.













Brexit to hit aviation - IATA

THE International Air Transport Association has predicted a decline in UK air passenger numbers of up to 5%, as the impact of Britain's exit from the European Union hits economic activity and exchange rates.

According to a preliminary analysis issued by IATA yesterday, the Brexit vote has triggered much uncertainty, with IATA's outgoing director-general Tony Tyler saying "it is critical that whatever form the new UK-EU relationship takes, it must continue to ensure the common interests of safe, secure, efficient and sustainable air connectivity".

Key issues include aviation regulation, with the EU operating a Single Aviation Market including an open skies agreement with the USA negotiated in 2008.

Brexit could mean the UK will need to negotiate new bilaterals which will depend on its future relationship with the EU, which accounts for 49% of passengers and 54% of scheduled commercial flights from Britain.

An immediate impact of the vote has seen a slump in the British pound, which makes it cheaper for Australians to travel to the United Kingdom - and conversely will hit the costs of inbound travellers from Britain arriving in Australia.

AFTA ceo Jayson Westbury said he doesn't expect there to be any immediate impact on leisure travel by Australians.

"The UK has always been an expensive place for Aussies to go, but we go anyway...the positive exchange rate that we see now and which is likely to get even better for Aussies is a good thing, for those who plan to go over the next six months or so," he said.

VisitBritain didn't comment on the Brexit issue specifically, with a spokesperson telling TD "we offer a warm welcome to our many visitors [and] are anticipating a strong summer holiday season".

EK hit by fare glitch

EMIRATES has reportedly sold 300 fares between Brazil and Australia for just \$214, with the carrier attracting controversy for refusing to honour the bookings.

The bargain return fare was bookable departing Sao Paolo to Brisbane, with a Gold Coast resident among the 300 people who snatched them up.

After receiving confirmations and itineraries from the carrier, the affected clients were later contacted and told the bookings had been cancelled.

Emirates blamed a technical error for issuing the fares at zero value plus taxes and charges.

"The issue occurred on Jun 16, 2016 and lasted for approximately three hours," an EK spokesperson was quoted as saying by News Limited.

Qantas on Snapchat

QANTAS has become the first Aussie airline to launch a Snapchat profile, with content to be generated fortnightly by the cabin and ground staff.

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China Airlines strike

INDUSTRIAL action by China Airlines' flight attendants led to a series of delays and flight cancellations over the weekend.

CI is offering reimbursement to those whose flights had been affected from 00:00 25 Jun to 23:59 26 Jun due to the strike, which will cover loss in airfare, ground transportation, as well as accommodation and meals.

The carrier issued a statement on its site apologising to passengers for the delays - to view more, CLICK HERE.

DFAT backs Zika warning

THE Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT) is backing its decision to update its travel advice on Smartraveller on the spread of the Zika virus in Indonesia, despite the Bali Hotels Association (BHA) last week slamming the government agency for "replicating fears that are not founded" (TD 24 Jun).

A spokesperson from DFAT told **Travel Daily** that "the Australian Government is aware of a cluster of cases of Zika virus in people with recent travel history to Indonesia.

"Our travel advice for Indonesia was reissued on 17 Jun advising that Indonesia was experiencing sporadic transmission of Zika virus to reflect this," she said.

She remarked that DFAT's advice on the Zika virus was similar to statements provided by other countries such as the UK, Canada and New Zealand.

"Australia is not the only country

to apply this advice to Indonesia... The European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control also includes Indonesia as a country with ongoing transmission of Zika." she continued.

DFAT continues to encourage Australian travellers to subscribe to its updates and register their travel plans.

More Darwin taxis

THIRTEEN extra taxi licenses will be issued in Darwin next week, in a bid to reduce pick-up times, better meet customer demands, and to put more cabs on the road.

Around 85 applications have been received in total, with the licenses to be released by a ballot system, said NT Minister for Transport Peter Chandler.

The ballot open to the public and will be drawn by the Taxi Ballot Steering Committee.

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Solo Delta flyer

DELTA Airlines conducted a flight in the US with just one passenger aboard last week.

According to USA Today the carrier was experiencing delays, and contacted almost all of the affected travellers on a flight departing from New Orleans in order to rebook them onto other services.

However, they had the wrong phone number for one Steven Schneider, who turned up for the service and wondered what was going on.

When he arrived at the gate he was given the option of either taking another flight or travelling on his original booking, and he opted for the latter and ended up being the only passenger aboard the 160-seat aircraft.

"At first I felt really bad because I didn't want the plane to only make the trip because of me, but after talking to a flight attendant at the gate she said the plane needed to go back to Atlanta anyway," he said.

Delta confirmed the solo flight, with a spokesperson saying "we're glad this customer enjoyed a somewhat rare solo experience".

New Westjet routes

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
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
