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

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

An interim order issued on Fri night has required all staff to return to normal rostered duty so 'business as usual' operations can

in effect until a hearing on 05 Oct, after which further stop work orders will be confirmed.



AFTA update

From AFTA's chief executive, Jayson Westbury

IFTHE Federal Government thinks it can rip \$293million more dollars out of the pockets of hard working Australians who want to take a holiday overseas, I honestly believe they are dreaming. The proposed increase to the Passenger Movement Charge (PMC) of \$5 from next

> July, taking it to \$60 per person is a joke. This announcement was made as a part of a

"Package" which the Federal Treasurer has made in relation to his own government's botched attempt to tax backpackers more than has been the case in the past.

The Government decided to announce an increase in the backpacker tax to a rate of 32.5% on every dollar earnt by a backpacker.

This meant that they would no longer be eligible for the tax free threshold and pay that tax from the first dollar they earned.

This measure was to raise some additional tax for the Government of around \$540 million over the four years of the policy.

However, the tourism and agricultural industries rose up to fight this as the number of backpackers coming to Australia started to decline as they [the backpacker] believed they could go to another country and pay less tax. As a result, and post the federal election the government decided to run a "review" of the situation.

The result of that review remains confidential as the report is yet to be released, however, the Federal Treasurer last week announced the solution to save everyone from the problem that he created.

Firstly to make backpackers pay \$0.19 in every dollar earnt from the first dollar, and secondly the 95% of the superannuation that they are paid will be taken back into government upon their departure from the country and third that the passenger movement charge would increase by \$5. What is yet to be released is exactly how much all that adds up to apart from the \$293million that the PMC will raise meaning that the balance should need "only" to be \$247 million.

Yeah right. No doubt that will rake in more and once again the travel industry is left paying the bill.

The justifications that the Federal Treasurer has made about this increase to the PMC include that his reform to credit card surcharging has saved people money and as such they can afford the extra \$5 towards the PMC.

I think he needs to change his wardrobe and put on some brown tights, because that is what Robin Hood likes to wear. Talk about a rob-Peterto-pay-Paul approach to policy. And if that was not insulting enough, he also claims that the travel industry does not contribute enough tax to pay for the changes to the airports and security.

The PMC currently at the \$55 level collects \$1 billion per annum. When he picks up his new tights I think he also needs to buy a new calculator.

While I joke about this, this is serious and AFTA along with our tourism industry colleagues will be pushing to have the PMC decision voted down, or even better removed from this package.

Enough is enough, the PMC should remain where it is, and every travel agent in the country should remind their customers of just how much tax they are paying when they book their next trip or holiday. The war on the PMC has once again begun, this impacts on Australians taking a holiday and the message needs to be spread.




