Carnival tech breakthrough



Today's issue of *TD* is coming to you courtesy of Seabourn which this weekend formally names *Seabourn Encore* in a gala ceremony in Singapore.

ALL is in readiness today for the naming ceremony of *Seabourn Encore* on Sat night, the six-star cruise line's newest and most luxurious ship yet.

With two sailings already under its belt since handover in late Nov, *Seabourn Encore* will shortly charter a course for Australia and New Zealand, arriving in Darwin on 22 Jan, making it the youngest and most luxurious vessel to ever visit the Oceania region.

After visiting Darwin, the liner will make its way down the eastcoast of Australia, stopping at Cairns, Townsville, Hamilton Is, Mooloolaba, Sydney, Melbourne & Philip Island, then onto NZ.

A contingent of VIP Australian travel agents and consumer & trade media have been invited to attend the festivities, which will include a ship tour of the 600-pax Seabourn Encore this morning.

Encore will be the fourth (and largest) ship to join Seabourn's fleet, offering one additional deck compared to Seabourn Odyssey, Seabourn Sojourn and Seabourn Quest which have capacities of around 450 pax. Stay tuned to our social media

CARNIVAL Corporation's new 'Ocean Medallion' technology (*Cruise Weekly* yesterday) could have applications right across the "larger vacation market and potentially other industries," according to Carnival ceo Arnold Donald, who launched the new system at the giant Consumer Electronics Show in Las Vegas.

The Medallion is a "first-of-itskind wearable device" which links with intelligent sensors and a "personalised digital concierge" to tailor and personalise all aspects of a holiday.

Arnold said the system went "well beyond the growing number of wearables used by theme parks and other leisure companies," incorporating multiple communications technologies including Near Field Communication (NFC) and Bluetooth Low Energy.

Fiji figures declining

AUSTRALIAN traveller numbers to Fiji continue to slide, with provisional figures for Nov 2016 indicating a 3% year-on-year drop to 28,234 for the month.

Fiji arrivals from NZ jumped 24.4% to 11,633 and also increased from China, Asia, the USA, UK, Canada and Japan - but were dwarfed by the numbers from Australia which is Fiji's largest market by a long way. For the 12 months to Nov 2016 Fiji visitation by Australians is down 1.2% to just over 320,000. Dreamworld 63% dive DREAMWORLD owners today

confirmed revenues of \$3.66 million for the period 10-31 Dec 2016, after the theme park reopened following the tragic death of four people in Oct.

That was a drop of 63% year on year, Ardent Leisure said, despite positive community support.

Emirates PER swap

EMIRATES will substitute its Airbus A380 with Boeing B777 aircraft on some Perth services from 26 Mar.

The change affects flight EK424 departing 1010 from Dubai and return flight EK425 departing 0600 from Perth.

Emirates' other Perth services EK420 and EK421 will continue to operate aboard A380-800.

The airline says any seat requests previously confirmed for affected departures have been adjusted and new seat numbers actioned within PNRs.

G Adv UK purchase

G ADVENTURES has confirmed its acquisition of All Leisure brands Travelsphere and Just You.

It comes following the collapse of All Leisure Holidays this week which saw around 13,000 travellers have their trips cancelled (*TD* yesterday).

The purchase means 200 jobs at All Leisure's head offices will be saved.

G Adventures said the deal opened up an "affluent, older market" for the brand.

VA expands inbound pass

VIRGIN Australia has expanded the availability of its PlusPass product for inbound travellers to Australia, which is now on sale in IATA Area 3, including South Asian Subcontinent, South East Asia and Japan/Korea.

PlusPass was initially launched to VA's trade partners in the UK/ Europe (**TD** 21 Oct 16), with the wider offering allowing travel agents to tailor inbound international customer itineraries with discounted fares and added benefits when travelling around Australia, the Pacific Islands, New Zealand and Indonesia on VA operated services.

New Zealand is excluded as an entry or exit point for PlusPass validity, and the product is not available for sale in the Australia/

VA PlusPass features include discounted pricing on a range of economy booking classes, extended ticketing time limits of 30 days before departure, additional baggage allowance and the ability to add between two and 16 sectors to customers' international tickets.

Overseas travel agents can add the PlusPass to any VA inbiound ticket, by entering passenger type code VAC in the GDS to view and price the fares, which have fare basis codes ending in PASS.

The international ticket number is added to the ticket endorsement box, and the OSI remark VA VPASS must be added at the time of booking for the extended ticketing time limit to apply.

EURAIL has added Eurostar to its range of rail passes, giving its travellers access to special fares and greater seat availability on the high-speed service.

Eurail Global and applicable Select and One Country Pass holders can now buy cross-Channel Eurostar fares from €30 one way in Standard class or €38 in Standard Premier.

The fares will be available between London, Ebbsfleet and Ashford International and Paris, Brussels, Lille, Calais and Disneyland Paris.

Eurail Passes are on offer for periods of three days to three months, valid for travel across 28 European countries.

NEW York Governor Andrew Cuomo has unveiled a US\$10 billion plan for much-maligned JFK International Airport involving the redevelopment of its aging terminals and improved transport links from downtown Manhattan.

"For far too long, JFK has fallen short of today's global standards," Cuomo said.

"There are overcrowded facilities, confusing on-airport roadways and poor accessibility.

India currency issue

THE Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade has updated its travel warning for India to include new advice on obtaining cash.

The Indian Government's withdrawal of 500 and 1000 rupee notes from circulation has lead to cash shortages, with visitors advised not to rely on cash and be aware that some ATMs do not accept foreign cards.

DFAT says travellers have reported difficulty exchanging Australian \$100 notes and should consider carrying currencies such as US dollars and Euros.

JFK must develop into a modern, state-of-the art facility that puts passengers first," he said.

The plan involves widening the congested Van Wyck motorway to the airport, creating new unified terminals and simplifying the current tangle of roadways.

The concept also provides for a single train journey from Manhattan to replace the cumbersome options among existing public transport links.

No timeframe has been given and at least US\$7 billion of private investment is still required to fund the redevelopment.

Sydney Grand Prix?

HONG Kong, Bangkok and Sydney have been named the top three preferred locations for future Formula 1 Grand Prix races in a survey of race fans across Asia Pacific nations.

The poll of more than 9,000 people by research company YouGov found support for F1 events in the region remained strong, despite speculation about the future of the current events in Malaysia and Singapore.

Hong Kong was the preferred location for future races, cited by 34% of those polled, followed by Bangkok (25%) and Sydney (23%).

More than half of respondents were interested in F1, with support strongest in Indonesia (62%), Malaysia (58%), Hong Kong (55%) and Vietnam (55%).
