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## Travel agent facing court

**FORMER** Axis Travel Centre contractor Arthur Zacharias will face court over 100 dishonesty offences next month following an extensive probe by the Major Fraud Squad.

Zacharias is alleged to have committed 106 offences between Mar 2015 and Jul 2016 and will next appear in court on 12 Oct.

Axis Travel Centre's owners and 19 clients were defrauded of over \$500,000, "with many clients left stranded at overseas airports as no return flights had been booked," South Australia Police

said in a statement.

The offences include deception, aggravated deception, aggravated theft, identification theft, dishonest dealings with documents, dishonestly manipulating a machine & pass valueless cheques.

Impacted clients were rescued by Axis Travel (**TD** 29 Aug 16).

## Expedia names cfo

**EXPEDIA** has promoted senior vp, treasury and head of investor relations Alan Pickerill to the role of executive vp & chief financial officer of the online travel firm.

Pickerill's advancement follows the departure of former ceo Dara Khosrowshahi who is joining Uber (**TD** 28 Aug) and the subsequent promotion of Mark Okerstrom as Expedia's new president and ceo.

## VA confirms Samoa intent

**VIRGIN** Australia confirmed its planned flight schedule to Apia, Samoa which will see the airline operate to the South Pacific destination under its own steam for the first time (**TD** 11 Jul).

VA's Apia services come as a result of the cessation of the joint venture with the Samoan Govt which wraps up on 12 Nov.

On Fri, Virgin Australia said it intends beginning flights on 13 Nov, to ensure there is no disruption in services between Australia and Samoa.

Utilising Boeing 737-800 aircraft with eight Business class and 168 Economy class seats, services include a five weekly rotation between Auckland & Apia, and up to two return services per week from both Sydney and Brisbane.

Virgin gm network & revenue management Russell Shaw said that since 2005, under the Virgin Samoa brand, the airline had carried over 1.4m passengers

between Australia, NZ & Samoa.

"We want to continue to support Samoa and provide valuable tourism opportunities to the Samoan economy," Shaw said on Fri.

"We look forward to receiving approval from the Samoan Govt to commence these operations."

Virgin Australia's planned APW ops will see increased competition to Samoa, as the government-run Polynesian Airways is establishing a new carrier, Samoa Airways, flagged to commence services to AKL and SYD from 14 Nov.

**MEANWHILE**, Samoa Airways has appointed Aviation Online as its gsa in Australia and NZ.

The fledgling carrier has appointed Dwayne Bentley to the Apia-based role of marketing & communications specialist.

Mailo Tiaga (Alfred) Senara has taken the Auckland-based role of regional sales manager for New Zealand/Australia.

## QF discounts for WA regional folk

**QANTAS** will offer discounts of up to 30% for local residents in six regional West Australian cities where individual travellers are impacted by high volumes of corporate travel.

Starting Nov, the variable discount will be offered to residents of Broome, Kalgoorlie, Karratha, Paraburdoo, Port Hedland and Newman on flights to and from Perth.

The scheme will also be offered in Queensland to residents of Mount Isa for flights to Townsville and Brisbane, and of Cloncurry for travel to Townsville.

The scheme will operate as a 12-month trial, with further details to be announced in coming weeks, Qantas said.

The WA Premier Mark McGowan welcomed the move and called for other regional carriers to follow suit.

A WA parliamentary inquiry into airfares will report in Nov.

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## Iririki fights liquidation

**VANUATU'S** Iririki Island Resort and Spa has won a stay in liquidation proceedings, just days after hosting the country's annual Tok Tok travel trade show.

News of the proceedings broke as Tok Tok delegates were leaving the resort last week, however the Supreme Court in Port Vila granted a stay against an earlier insolvency judgement late on Fri, pending an appeal.

The proceedings are the latest move in a dispute between Iririki Island Holdings and building

company Vancorp Construction, which was responsible for repair works conducted after Cyclone Pam hit the Pacific nation in 2015.

The *Vanuatu Independent* reported Iririki was granted a stay by Justice Paul Geoghegan after the resort argued it would be damaged "beyond repair" by the insolvency order.

Justice Geoghegan said he could "readily accept that an order for liquidation will have a very significant effect on the company and accordingly urgent steps may be required in respect of this application" and that he would allow a hold until an appeal hearing in three weeks' time.

The resort's owner has lodged a sum of almost A\$1.4 million in trust pending the outcome.

GM Steve Frichot told *Travel Daily* "Iririki is not insolvent" and that the judge had been denied some key pieces of evidence that had not been reviewed regarding the case, "so he reversed the ruling pending further study".


Frichot insisted Iririki continues to operate "business as usual".

## HST hurting airlines

**AIR** China, China Southern and China Eastern Airlines have blamed the rise of high-speed rail in China for hurting their profits on a domestic front.

The competitiveness saw China Eastern as the only airline of the three to achieve a positive growth of 34.46% in net profits.

CA and CZ saw their net profits fall by 3.79% and 11.62%.

## Port Vila Seafront precinct debuts

The US\$17m project has been one of the largest infrastructure developments that the NZ govt has backed in the South Pacific, with Kiwi tax-payers investing approx US\$13 million.

Speaking to trade media ahead of the opening ceremony, Roberts said the seafront precinct "was meant to be a transformative project for tourism in Port Vila as the gateway to Vanuatu".

"We see tourism as a significant sector that has more potential for the Vanuatu Government.

"We can work together to provide assistance to help deliver that," Roberts said.

The 1.2km beautification project stretches from Chantillys on the Bay to the Port Vila Central Market House, and features upgraded walkways, parklands

(declared at the opening as Tasanak Park) and gardens.


