Rex boosts Orange

REGIONAL Express (Rex) will boost its services between Sydney and Orange, adding almost 18,000 seats per year.

Flights will increase from four return services per weekday to five from 29 Jan, making a total of 58 weekly services on the route.

"This decision is not without its risk as currently there are only 55,000 annual passengers for the 100,000 annual seats that will be available," said Rex gm network strategy and sales Warrick Lodge, who added that a supporting partnership agreement would be sought with Orange City Council.

QF mandates customer data

QANTAS has updated its travel agent terms and conditions, with changes including a formal requirement that all relevant customer information - including mobile number and email - is "passed onto Qantas in the format prescribed".

The new T&Cs were published just before Christmas, and became effective on 20 Dec 2017.

The agent's Pseudo City Code (PCC) must also now be included in any booking, the updated document confirms, to inform QF of where the agent is located.

The revised Qantas agent Terms and Conditions include a new section on 'Sale and ticketing of Qantas products' which restricts agents to only sell, ticket and distribute fares in the country where their PCC is domiciled.

With all fares - not just QF specials - the terms and conditions confirm that agents must "take all reasonable steps to

ensure the customer is eligible to be sold the relevant fare" - and if a Qantas fare or special is sold in contravention of the new clauses, the carrier will be "entitled to compensation from the agent equivalent to the amount of the difference between the ticketed airfare and the highest airfare applicable to the class in which the customer was booked".

Other changes include a new requirement that agents do not inhibit a customer's ability to book and confirm a QF product.

If a reservation system, website, online booking tool or other system is experiencing technical difficulty then the agent must promptly inform Qantas and also take all reasonable steps to rectify the issue as soon as possible, the document states.

Any use of the QF Industry Sales Site, or any marketing, selling or ticketing of Qantas, "will constitute agreement and acceptance" of the new T&Cs, according to qantas.com/agents.

US faces flight chaos

THOUSANDS of flights have been cancelled and major airports closed across the US east coast as winter storms bring heavy snow and high winds.

The New York and Boston areas have been among the hardest hit, with JFK airport closed today amid white-out conditions and 12cm of snow on the runways.

La Guardia was also closed, while Newark cancelled most flights while reducing operations to a single runway.

USA Today reports more than 4,000 flights have been cancelled throughout the region.

Some flights have been diverted from the New York area to airports including Washington, Detroit and Philadelphia, while knock-on effects are creating delays in other regions.

Further disruption is expected tomorrow as storms persist.

Qantas renews push to lift cap

QANTAS chairman Leigh Clifford has renewed calls to lift the airline's foreign ownership restrictions, saying the cap jeopardises its plans to buy new ultra-long haul jets.

Speaking to Fairfax Media, Clifford said the 49% foreign ownership cap imposed by the Qantas Sale Act was restricting the airline's ability to raise capital.

"We haven't got a particular need at the moment, but at some stage we're going to have to dramatically renew the fleet," Clifford said.

"At some stage we're going to have to replace the (Airbus) 380s... and (ceo) Alan (Joyce) has talked of the challenge we've put out to Airbus and Boeing for longrange aircraft.

"Well, these don't come cheaply," he said, adding that the airline would continue to "engage with government" on the issue.

River cruise move for Minor

MINOR Hotels has expanded its cruise offering with the launch of Mekong Kingdoms, promising "a new style of river travel" across a fleet of five vessels.

The ships will sail the Mekong River from Thailand's Golden Triangle to Luang Prabang and join the group's existing cruising options of Manohra Dining Cruises in Bangkok and Anantara Overnight Cruises.

Mekong Kingdom's flagship vessel, Boheme, will be a 42m 13-cabin luxury barge with a sun deck, wine cellar and spa.

It will sail two-night voyages from Chiang Rai/Chiang Khong to Luang Prabang and a three-night upstream return cruise, with the itinerary including guided jungle treks, a visit to the Pak Ou caves and mountain biking.

On board activities include sunrise yoga, cooking demos, Buddhist meditation, jewellery making classes and fishing.

There will also be a two-cabin cruiser called Gypsy offering customised Mekong itineraries of one or more nights.

Thomas Cook told Reuters the move would allow its German subsidiary Condor to grow.

Air Berlin Aviation was set up in 2017 to take over the wetlease operations handled by Air Berlin on behalf of Eurowings and Austrian Airlines, however no aircraft are attached to the entity.

THE Clipper 2017-18 Round the World Yacht Race fleet will return to The Whitsundays from the 13-29 Jan.

Based out of Airlie Beach, the Clipper Race crew represent over 20 different nationalities and will also have downtime to explore the tropical island destination with friends and family.

Qld Tourism Minister Kate Jones said visitors during the carnival were expected to bring millions to the local economy, while providing a boost for tourism.

The Clipper yachts are currently racing from Hobart to Airlie Beach.
