### MU 787s for MEL

**CHINA** Eastern Airlines is rolling out Boeing 787-9 aircraft on international routes, with GDS screens indicating that the carrier's daily flights from Melbourne to Shanghai Pu Dong will be upgraded to the new metal effective 01 Feb.



# Venture Far owed \$500k

FIGURES from the collapse of SA wholesaler Venture Far indicate creditor claims worth over \$500.000 when the business was placed into administration last year (TD 24 Oct 2018).

The business traded as The Venture Holidays SA Unit Trust. with the trustee company Clenton Pty Ltd having two directors: Ian Garritt and Robert Mackay.

Records now available from the Australian Securities and **Investments Commission indicate** after about \$264,000 owed to 15 staff, Clenton's major creditor was Helloworld Travel Limited.

Moneys owed include \$147,751 claimed by Magellan Travel Pty Ltd, along with \$24,761 due to Helloworld Services Pty Limited.

A related company, Magellan Travel Group Pty Ltd, is owed \$7,108, the report notes, while Helloworld offshoot Tourism

A GIANT of the Australian travel publishing sector has died, with travelBulletin co-founder Eddie Raggett succumbing peacefully on 26 Dec after a five-year battle with Parkinson's disease.

Raggett was aged 76, and his extensive career in travel trade media sales culminated in the establishment of travelBulletin in 2004, with the business subsequently acquired by the Business Publishing Group a decade later (TD 24 Jul 2014).

However, "red flag" warnings banning swimming off beaches are still in place.





### **UA's Dream family**

**UNITED** Airlines has kicked off the regular service of its latest aircraft, the Boeing 787-10 *Dreamliner*.

The service departed Los Angeles International Airport on 06 Jan bound for Newark Liberty International Airport.

The new addition to the United family makes the carrier the first in the world to operate all three *Dreamliner* models, including the 787-8, 787-9 and the longest model, the 787-10.

The new aircraft offers travellers the brand's signature Polaris Business class seats, as well as the new Premium Plus seats, with the airline confirming it expects its second *Dreamliner* to enter service between San Francisco and New York in Feb.

### **Ctrip expansion**

ASIA'S largest online travel agency Ctrip has plans for further global expansion, calling on Workday Human Capital Management (HCM) to assist with the implementation of a range of updated cloud applications.

The group is "deepening relationships with global partners and extending its international strategy", and follows the development of its Skyscanner and Trip.com brands which collectively attract over 90 million active monthly users globally.

The company has also partnered with digital financial business Wirecard to offer Chinese customers branded Visa cards that can be loaded with up to seven currencies, including AUD.

# Australia #2 for Silversea



AUSTRALIA is on the cusp of becoming the second largest global market for Silversea Cruises, according to the company's CEO Roberto Martinoli who is in Sydney this week to help celebrate the inaugural visit of flagship Silver Muse.

Speaking at an event aboard the ship on Sun evening, Martinoli (pictured inset with his wife, Silversea Chief Marketing Officer Barbara Muckermann) confirmed that *Muse* would return next year, along with *Silver Explorer* which would cruise out of Dunedin to the Ross Sea in the 2020-21 Antarctic season.

Martinoli and Muckermann have been holidaying in Australia prior to *Muse's* arrival, taking in Adelaide, Kangaroo Island and Port Lincoln.

The company's CEO noted the strong support provided by Silversea's new majority owner, Royal Caribbean Cruise Lines, which has enabled significant investment across the fleet.

Five new ships will be added to the fleet between now and 2023, with Muckermann noting the growth will see Silversea expand its destination portfolio to more than 1,050 ports globally.

The ship was welcomed to Sydney's White Bay Cruise Passenger Terminal by the Australian Girls' Choir singing on the pier, while Adam Armstrong, Silversea MD Australia/NZ highlighted a gift to Rural Aid in lieu of a fireworks display to welcome the vessel.

A gift exchange included the acceptance by Destination NSW GM Stephen Mahoney of a print of a 1744 Royal Geographical Society map of Australia, considered to be the first map published in England wholly devoted to Australia.
