So celebrate this bizarre day by picking your favourite internet cat meme, have a cat drawing competition or just give a shout out to those who are overworked and underappreciated!



STANDING at 74.5m high, this interesting architectural marvel is the highest church in this country, and one of the tallest structures in the nation.

The building is named after a national poet and clergyman, who wrote 50 poems about the Passion narrative (from where Jesus enters the garden of Gethsemane to his death and

burial).

The church is one of the city's best known landmarks and is visible from many different points.

It was designed in 1937 to resemble the rocks, mountains and glaciers of the country's landscape and took over 41 years to build, starting in 1945 and finishing in 1986.
