**NEXT** time your flight is delayed, spare a thought for those passengers aboard a recent Cathay Pacific flight from New York City to Hong Kong, which included a "15- hour unscheduled layover" in Zhuhai, China.

According to NBC News, CX 831 departed JFK on 29 Mar for the 16 hour journey to HKG, but a storm during its final approach caused the aircraft to be diverted to Zhuhai.

Unfortunately, Chinese officials didn't allow anyone off the airplane when it landed, and the pilots and crew were unable to continue the flight because they ran out of cockpit hours.

Fortunately, supplies were allowed on board and a replacement crew was promptly dispatched by CX, but rather than fly to Zhuhai they had to travel by ferry to Macau and then drive an hour to Hong Kong.

The flight finally arrived at 2pm on 31 Mar - about 34 hours after departure.
