MH, JL partnership

JAPAN Airlines and Malaysia Airlines have announced a new "joint business partnership" seeing them cooperate on flights between Malaysia and Japan.

The pact will formally debut on 25 Jul, with flight resumptions seeing a combined four weekly Tokyo Narita-Kuala Lumpur services in Jul and Aug.

The airlines said they were also working closely with the governments of both countries to establish a travel bubble which will ease restrictions for cross-border travel in the coming months.

Constable shifts to London

EXCLUSIVE

HELLOWORLD Travel senior executive John Constable has returned to the UK for personal reasons, but will continue to undertake his role remotely as Group General Manager of Retail, Commercial and Air Tickets.

An update to Helloworld travel agency members from CEO Andrew Burnes last week confirmed the move, noting that as Constable is not an Australian

Silversea sale done

SILVERSEA Cruises is now 100% owned by Royal Caribbean Group, after the acquisition of the final 33% of the line was settled on Fri.

Payment was in the form of about 2.5% of Royal Caribbean stock worth US\$245 million.

Manfredi Lefebvre d'Ovidio will serve as Chairman of Silversea, while Roberto Martinoli will continue as the luxury cruise brand's President and Chief Executive Officer.

Lefebvre said the combination of the companies had already been "everything I hope for".

Royal Caribbean Group acquired a 66.7% equity stake in Silversea Cruises in Jul 2018, paying about US\$1 billion along with 472,000 RCL shares contingent on the company's performance in 2019/20 (TD 15 Jun).

Qantas pulls flights

QANTAS has closed reservation on all international flights, apart from trans-Tasman services, through until 27 Mar 2021.

Previously the carrier had only formally cancelled flights through until Sep (TD 03 Jul), despite CEO Alan Joyce announcing the Qantas International fleet would be grounded for up to 12 months.

GDS screens indicate that QF trans-Tasman services are also now not envisaged to resume until after the end of next month, with the first available flight for reservation scheduled for 01 Sep.

The Helloworld communication also confirms recent developments including the refunding of more than \$80 million to agents in Australia and NZ over the last six weeks.

"We have dramatically reduced the number of files pending refunds and an enormous amount of work has gone into speeding up our procedures and to ensuring our call wait times are reined back in," Burnes wrote.

"Getting every refund/credit processed and completed is our goal by the end of Sep and we are now on track to achieve that," he added.

Burnes predicts that the "long march" of COVID-19 will now continue for the next six months or so, and will be challenging.

Given the uncertainty about a resumption of travel, franchise and marketing fees for Helloworld members have also now been suspended through to 31 Mar.

Carnival to sell more ships

CARNIVAL Corporation has now confirmed it expects to sell 13 ships and defer future deliveries, as part of capacity moderation efforts in the face of COVID-19.

The departure of the 13 ships represents a 9% reduction in current capacity, while only five of the nine ships originally scheduled for delivery in 2020 and 2021 are now expected to arrive as planned.

CEO Arnold Donald said demand continued for 2021 sailings, with the company continuing to actively consult with science and medical experts about solutions for detection, prevention and mitigation of COVID-19.



Ponfoort to head Aurora

MONIQUE Ponfoort has been appointed as the new Chief Executive Officer of Aurora Expeditions, and will join the company in Oct this year.

She leaves her current role as regional Vice President for Ponant, with Aurora's Chairman Neville Buch continuing his executive role until she starts.

"Monique is an impressive executive and her extensive experience in the cruise and travel industry will be of enormous value to Aurora Expeditions," Buch said.

VA access denied

TWO groups representing some of the Virgin Australia bondholders who are owed about \$2b have been denied access to details of the sale of the carrier to Bain Capital, with a court application thrown out on Fri.

Broad Peak Investments and Tor Investment Management are hoping to put forward a competing "Deed of Company Arrangement" for consideration at the Second Creditors Meeting.

The companies have now withdrawn their application to the Takeovers Panel (*TD* 06 Jul) regarding whether the actions of the Administrators were unacceptable.

Vale David Radcliffe

THE global corporate travel sector is mourning the death of David Radcliffe, former CEO of Hogg Robinson Group (HRG).

The 67-year-old led HRG's management buyout in 2000 and then took the company public again in 2006, continuing to run it until 2018 when it was purchased by American Express Global Business Travel.

He was well known locally as a frequent visitor to HRG's Australian offices, and was also a non-executive director of Amex Global Business Travel. Aurora vessel *Sylvia Earle* arriving next year and "further vessel plans in the pipeline," Ponfoort's experience and skills would help in the future expansion of the business "and ensure we continue to provide the unique life changing travel experiences that we do, in a small intimate vessel environment".

WA JobKeeper push

TOURISM Council WA is calling for travel businesses to join its online petition to lobby the Federal Government in extending the JobKeeper program for the travel sector beyond Sep.

The tourism body is pushing for the government to extend the funding "for at least another six months" and until the international borders can be safely reopened to visitors.

Room-Res launch

ROOM-RES has added attractions, allowing agents to use the platform to access 12,000 single- or multi-day attractions around the world.

The move follows feedback and requests, and agents can now add the attractions into their itineraries or book them alone.

Room-res is also working on a "quote builder" functionality.

BYO quarantine funding

THE NSW Government will begin to charge returning international travellers for their hotel accommodation from 12:01am this Sat. 18 Jul. unless they bought their flights before 11:59pm 12 Jul AEST.

NSW Premier Gladys Berejiklian said Australian residents "have been given plenty of time to return home – and we feel it is only fair that they cover some of the costs of their hotel accommodation.

"The NSW taxpayers have footed much of the bill so far, with more than \$65 million spent on quarantine accommodation to house international travellers returning to Australia."

Travellers will be charged \$3,000 for one adult, with additional adults \$1,000 each, children \$500 each and children under three are at no additional cost.

The hotel quarantine fee includes accom and daily meals, and travellers will receive the bill to pay within 30 days at the end of quarantine, with hardship arrangements to be available.

MEANWHILE, the National Cabinet agreed on Fri to cap the number of pax coming into Australian airports from overseas to 4,000 each week, down from around 7,000 currently.

Sydney is capped at 450 international arrivals per day, a continuation of what was announced on 04 Jul, with a view to further reductions in subsequent weeks.

From today Perth has been capped at 525 international arrivals per week and Brisbane will have an overall cap of 500 international arrivals per week.

These arrangements will be reviewed by the National Cabinet before the end of Jul.

Since 13 Mar, more than 357.000 citizens and residents have returned to Australia.

Cairns hails first interstate flight



CAIRNS celebrated the arrival of its first interstate flight last Fri with a water cannon salute and tropical carnival themed greeting celebration inside the terminal to greet the welcomed passengers.

The Jetstar flight JQ952 from Sydney arrived in Cairns at 12.10pm with 177 passengers

on board (pictured), closely followed by a Qantas jet carrying 160 passengers, the first flights to arrive since Queensland officially lifted its border restrictions.

Arrivals were greeted with much fanfare at the airport, including Indigenous performances, local animal mascots, and an array of rainforest plants and flowers to say welcome back to the Sunshine State.

"Our small population base and wide-open spaces make the Cairns region a highly desirable destination for people or groups wanting to leave the crowds of the cities behind," said Tourism Tropical North Queensland Chief Executive Officer Mark Olsen.

Flight figures

THE US and China are leading the way in domestic flights scheduled for Jul, according to figures from travel data analytics company Cirium.

Domestic scheduled flights for Jul within the US lead the world's domestic aviation markets with 413,538 flights in total, compared to 378,434 flights within China.

In Australia, figures show a 70% dive in domestic flights scheduled for Jul 2020 compared to Jul 2019.

The country also shows the biggest drop in the global top 20 with a 74% fall in domestic seats year-on-year.

Travel the world with mince and meatballs

TO FINISH off our journey around the world with mince and meatballs we have the famous South African Bobotie. We received this recipe from

both South African Tourism

and Adventure World - so it must be good. Enjoy making.





Bobotie

INGREDIENTS

- 2 thick slices bread, crusts removed
- ½ cup milk
- 50g unsalted butter
- 2 large onions, finely chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, finely chopped
- 1 tbsp chopped ginger
- 2 tbsp mild curry powder
- 2 tbsp tomato paste
- 2 tbsp fruit chutney, plus extra to serve
- 3 bay leaves
- 2 tbsp vinegar
- 1kg beef mince

- 1/3 cup sultanas
- 1/3 cup Slivered almonds, toasted and chopped
- 1 cup water **EGG TOPPING:**
- 2 eggs
- 1 cup full cream milk
- 1/4 tsp ground turmeric TOMATO SALSA:
- 2 tomatoes, chopped
- 1 small brown or white onion, chopped
- 2 tbsp malt vinegar
- Salt and freshly ground black pepper

METHOD

Preheat oven to 180°C. Soak breadcrumbs in milk and set aside. Meanwhile, melt butter in a large, deep ovenproof frypan over medium heat. Add onion to the pan and then cook, stirring, for 3-4 minutes until soft, seasoning with salt and pepper. Add the garlic and ginger, then cook for a further 1 minute until fragrant then add the curry powder and stir through. Add bay leaves, tomato paste, chutney and vinegar and cook for 2-3 minutes to caramelise the mixture slightly. Add the mince and cook, breaking up lumps with a wooden spoon, for 5-6 minutes until browned. Stir in the soaked bread and milk, breaking it up to combine then add the sultanas and almonds. Add 1 cup water, season, reduce the heat to medium low and cook for 10 minutes until reduced. For the topping, beat the egg, turmeric and milk in a bowl or jug and season with salt. Remove the beef mixture from the heat then press down on the mixture to create a flat surface. Carefully pour over egg mixture. Scatter over extra bay leaves and bake for 35-40 minutes or until the topping is golden.

Meanwhile combine all the ingredients for the tomato salsa in a bowl and set aside.

Remove bobotie from the oven and serve immediately with the salsa and extra chutney.



Crown's restaurant reveal



CROWN Sydney has revealed three new restaurants for the property ahead of its launch in Dec.

The three restaurants include a'Mare by Alessandro Pavooni. which will serve Italian fine dining and Woodcut by Ross and Sunny Lusted (pictured), providing a dining experience which focuses on Australian produce and cooking with wood, charcoal and steam.

Yoshii's Omakase at Nobu by Ryuichi Yoshii round out the restaurants, and will be an intimate 12-seat eatery inside the entrance to Nobu, designed to create a unique dining take on the Omakase tradition, where the chef selects the dishes.

The company has also appointed Sarah Briegel as **Culinary Director of Crown** Towers Sydney.

Briegel was most recently Executive Chef at the Mandarin Oriental in Shanghai.

Gov invests in Parks

THE Australian Government has made a record \$233 million investment into Parks Australia.

The windfall will deliver infrastructure upgrades across the country's national parks and at the National Botanic Gardens.

Kakadu National Park welcomed the investment, which it said would go towards projects to improve facilities, such as upgrades to staff housing, ranger stations and campgrounds.

Booderee National Park will get a new visitor centre and upgrades to campground amenities, roads and carparks, walking tracks and viewing platforms.

Other parks to benefit from the funding include Christmas Island and Uluru-Kata Tjuta, with the funding to be delivered over the next three years.

The funding was also welcomed by outgoing Voyages Chief **Executive Officer Grant Hunt.**

Jun also marked the first month occupancy and RevPAR were back above 30% and \$40 respectively.
