Sudoku

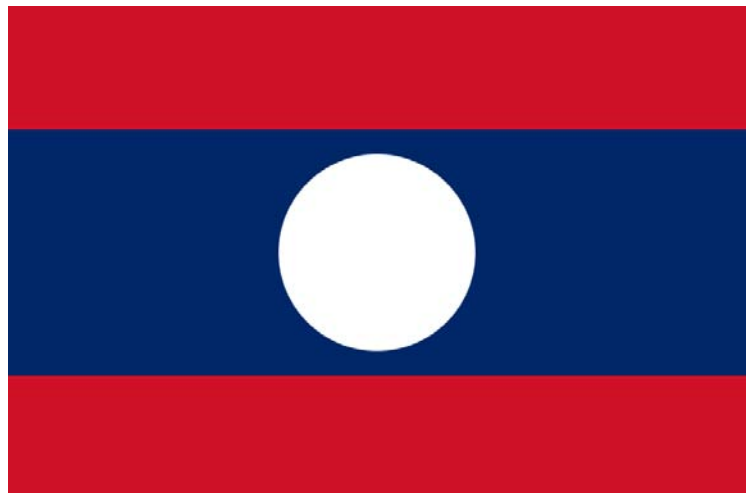
BEGINNER

Whose flag is this?



DESPITE the centre of this flag being a basic circle, it actually represents a parasol or royal umbrella, which was part of the king's ceremonial regalia.

The first flag used by this country was a white three-headed elephant and white parasol on a red field, but the current flag became the official one in 1975, and was the banner

of the revolutionary forces who sought independence from the colonial country ruling the nation.

As well as symbolising the parasol, the centre disk pays homage to another country's flag who supported the independence movement.
