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

## Rail operator makes debut

A TRIO of former Rail Europe Australasia executives have combined to launch a company called Rail Online, a new operator which allows travel agents to search, compare and book European rail passes.

Founded by James Dunne, Lachlan McCallum and Kew Muthalif, the company aims to make the rail purchase process as seamless as possible, with advisors able to access all prices in Aussie dollars, circumnavigate booking fees, self-manage itinerary changes or refunds, and gain access to the most competitive rates.

Backed by major rail software company SilverRail and debuting with a launch commission rate of 7% on Eurail Passes. Rail Online also offers the option of buying point-to-point tickets across the United Kingdom, with a view to rolling out additional


"CATO urges the WA government to support these federal measures and re-open the WA border ASAP to avoid further angst amongst local tourism businesses in WA," he said.


There will be six spaces available for advisors to win on the fully inclusive famil trip, taking place from 27 May to 03 Jun.


WITH travel finally getting back on its feet, why not start your next overseas journey with a destination renowned for being the most welcoming to tourists?

Canada's Government has declared a state of emergency, with significant travel disruptions afflicted in downtown Ottawa.

## **Queen Anne joins family**

**CUNARD** Line has announced *Queen Anne* will be the name of its newest ship scheduled to join the fleet in early 2024, marking the first time in 25 years the line will have four ships at sea.

Anne will feature reimagined Cunard signature spaces, new guest experiences within dining, culture and entertainment, and an updated livery, with outgoing President Simon Palethorpe saying he is "absolutely delighted" to welcome the ship to the fleet to join *Queen Mary* 2, *Queen Victoria* and *Queen Elizabeth*.

"This marks a very special moment in Cunard's 182-year history and showcases Cunard's exciting global plans for the future, allowing even more guests around the world to set sail with Cunard," Palethorpe said.

"With design inspired by the past and set for the future, *Queen Anne* is the perfect way for our customers to rediscover the joy of exploration and travel again."

Soliciting the help of an historian, Anne was chosen among several naming options. She is named after the Queen of

England from 1702 to 1714, who oversaw the *Acts of Union 1707*, which joined together England and Scotland.

#### Valiant joins fleet

VIRGIN Voyages has taken delivery of its second vessel, with Valiant Lady joining Scarlet Lady in the new cruise player's fleet. The ship will offer cruise

#### New Caledonia pivot

**NEW** Caledonia's tourism agency has undergone a major restructure as the French territory looks to take a more unified approach to rebooting its visitor economy in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic.

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#### Frontier's new Spirit

AMERICAN ultra-low-cost carriers Frontier Airlines and Spirit Airlines are set to merge, with the combined company to "drive competition and expand services to underserved smalland mid-sized cities across the country".

The combined fleet will be the youngest, most fuel-efficient, and greenest in the United States, and will add approximately 10,000 aviation jobs by 2026.

The airline is also expected to offer more than 1,000 daily flights.

#### **Boeing SAF deal**

**BOEING** has bought two million gallons (8 million litres) of sustainable aviation fuel for its commercial operations, the largest such purchase to date.

EPIC Fuels will supply the blend, which will be made from inedible agricultural waste, and will be used for production, test, Dreamlifter and delivery flights.

**HBO** megahit *Game of Thrones* has been a major tourism draw for Northern Ireland over the last 10 years, as a large portion of the show was shot in the country, which in turn has generated renewed tourism interest.

Now the European nation has called in some major star power to launch its new Game of Thrones Studio Tour, taking fans of the show closer to the Seven Kingdoms than ever before. Isaac Hempstead Wright (Bran

Stark), Kristian Nairn (Hodor), and

Nathalie Emmanuel (Missandei) were all on hand for the grand opening over the weekend, which is located at one of the original filming locations at Linen Mill Studios in Banbridge.

The treats inside include opportunities to step inside the iconic Great Hall at Winterfell where Jon Snow was proclaimed the "King in the North," and see Daenerys Targaryen's imposing Dragonstone throne.

#### Bringing the Top End's history to life

The Darwin Aviation Museum also received a funding grant.

#### Have a hard copy

AUSTRALIANS travelling to Italy are being encouraged by DFAT to carry a hard copy of their Australian vaccination certificate in lieu of having access to the country's Super Green Pass.

Until at least 31 Mar, the Super Green Pass will be required to access most venues and businesses and most forms of public transport.

European Union and Schengen countries, as well as 33 other states not including Australia, will be subject to the looser restrictions, however Australians must still present a 72-hour negative COVID test.

#### Sit on the sills through the hills



THE century-old tradition of sitting on the carriage sill of the Puffing Billy railway has returned, with the famous Melbourne attraction laying down the tracks for the kids to take part again.

Available for children aged between four and 13 under adult supervision, the attraction's CEO Peter Abbott said the timehonoured tradition would delight visitors taking a ride on the locomotive through the tranquil Victorian countryside.

"It's been a labour of love for our team, partners, and supporters, and we are absolutely delighted to be able to offer the iconic sitting on the sills experience," Abbott said.

"Nothing beats the ride through the towering forests, around bends, over bridges and streams, waving at passers-by, all the while sitting on the carriage sill as Puffing Billy steams gently along the tracks," he added.

The ability for children to hang their legs over the side of the rail was banned in 2018 following a non-fatal collision with a minibus in 2018.

Managed by the Emerald Tourist Railway Board, the open-air steam train aims to preserve Victoria's railway history and provide an unforgettable experience for tourists.

The ride attracted around 500,000 visitors annually prior to the pandemic and was supported by the recently opened state-ofthe-art \$24.8 million Lakeside Visitor Centre.

"There's no other railway experience like sitting on an open-side carriage sill as Puffing Billy winds through the Dandenong Ranges," Victoria's Minister for Tourism, Sport and Major Events Martin Pakula said.
