QF loses appeal

QANTAS is expected to face significant penalties after this morning's High Court ruling which upheld previous decisions finding the carrier acted illegally when sacking ground handling workers in 2020 (*TD* breaking news).

The latest blow to the airline's reputation found it was "motivated by prohibited reasons" when it undertook the outsourcing, namely avoiding future industrial action.

Qantas noted that the decision was made in Aug 2020 "when borders were closed, lockdowns were in place and no COVID vaccine existed".

"The likelihood of a years' long crisis led Qantas to restructure its business to improve its ability to survive and ultimately recover."

The airline issued a statement saying it deeply regretted the personal impact the decision had on all those affected "and we sincerely apologise for that".

The highly respected Weir (pictured) had an extensive industry career, including almost 16 years at Qantas, progressing from Account Manager Industry Sales to Regional Sales Manager during her time with the airline.

After leaving QF she spent a couple of years on project work and consulting before joining Hawaiian Airlines in 2016, continuing her association with the MICE sector including recognition with the HA CEO "Lau Lima" excellence in sales award.

She moved to Globus in early 2021 and worked tirelessly to grow opportunities in the conference and incentive space, developing exclusive, tailored MICE programs.



Weir died unexpectedly on Mon, with Globus MD Asia Pacific, Gai Tyrrell, paying tribute by saying her dedication to her work, abundance of energy and enthusiasm made her "a beloved colleague and friend who will be greatly missed".

"Joyce's passion and determination for seeking out new business was unmatched.

"She did everything with a smile and a skip in her step...she was a shining light who will be forever missed," Tyrrell added. BP

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Vietjet lands millions in funds



VIETJET and Carlyle Aviation Partners, a US-based aviation finance and asset management company, have signed an aircraft finance agreement worth US\$550 million (approximately A\$857 million) to provide financing for 200 Boeing 737 MAX aircraft.

The deal is key to Vietjet's fleet expansion plans and according to a press release will "significantly impact the company's rapid and aggressive expansion plans in the Australian market".

The deal was signed during the official visit of US President Joe Biden to Vietnam with Vietjet and Boeing having agreed on the delivery timeline of the first batch of B737 MAX planes.

Worth over US\$25 billion in total (approximately A\$39 billion), delivery will be implemented in a span of five years with the first set of 12 aircraft scheduled for 2024 and destined for affiliate carrier Thai Vietjet.

"Carlyle Aviation Partners has been a long-term strategic partner of Vietjet," said Robert Korn, Co-Founder & President of Carlyle Aviation Partners.

"We are pleased to accompany and witness Vietjet's significant growth over the last decade.

"The airline has offered passengers reasonable fares and convenient travel options. thus contributing positively to the aviation and tourism development, and fostering investment between Vietnam and the international community." DF
