New Conlon role

ACCC denies QF, MU

QANTAS has been knocked back on its request to coordinate operations with China Eastern Airlines, after the ACCC issued a draft determination this morning denying authorisation for the request (*TD* breaking news).

The two carriers were seeking permission on an Extended Joint Coordination Agreement, which would enable them and their related entities, including Jetstar, to coordinate passenger and cargo

TraveLeague tickets

BOOKINGS for this year's Christmas TraveLeague event in Melbourne go on sale today, with the annual gathering scheduled for Wed 13 Dec from 12.30pm. Taking place at the Crown Palladium, tickets are priced at \$191 per person including GST, and can be purchased online via a booking link now live at christmastraveleague.com. transport operations between Australia and China until the end of Mar 2024 (*TD* 09 Dec 2022).

The consumer watchdog said the alliance would potentially breach competition laws, giving QF and MU the "opportunity and incentive to increase prices... by limiting or delaying the introduction of additional capacity on the Sydney-Shanghai route as pax demand continues to grow".

It pointed out that MU is currently the only airline flying direct between Sydney and Shanghai, with QF resuming flights in late Oct, and that demand for air travel between Australia and China is likely to keep growing between now and the end of Mar 2024.

The interim authorisation, which was granted in Mar, will remain in place while the ACCC seeks submissions in response to the draft determination before 06 Oct, prior to making a final decision. JM

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QR info not for public A DAY after requesting more time to respond to requests to provide more information to the Senate regarding the decision to block Qatar Airways from extra flights into Australia, Transport Minister Catherine King has refused to provide key documents

citing public interest immunity. King's decision came in the form of a letter on Thu that claimed the decision to grant Qatar additional landing rights as part of a bilateral agreement, and details regarding meetings with Qantas and other airlines, came under public interest immunity. It means King will avoid

answering questions in parliament about the controversial call that heavily favours Qantas as the next sitting does not occur until 16 Oct.

According to the AFR, King's letter said that bilateral air rights agreements were not commercial arrangements but treaty-level agreements between countries

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and that making those documents public would expose the nature of sensitive bilateral agreements.

MEANWHILE the furore around the QF/QR decision hasn't escaped the CAPA APAC Aviation Summit, currently taking place in Brisbane.

Flight Centre MD Graham Turner said, "there is no doubt this decision will keep airfares higher and for the government to say that's in the national interest then what national interest are we talking about?"

He also acknowledged that there had been no clear explanation from the government and that airfares are unlikely to return to more acceptable levels until 2025.

Brisbane Airport CEO Gert-Jan de Graaff called for the scrapping of bilateral agreements, telling the conference that they were an "antiquated system" and that airlines would fly to markets where more volume is required so that more money can be made. DF

VIRGIN Australia has introduced a new policy to assist travel agents in handling documentation for fare refunds on tickets held by deceased guests.

All fare types can be refunded but the necessary documentation required is determined by the fare value, with tickets worth more than \$600 requiring either a formal Grant of Probate or Grant of Letters of Administration - see virginaustralia.com.

Alliance extension

ALLIANCE Aviation Services has announced the extension of its contract with BHP Iron Ore with a five-year term plus two-year extension option.

Under the renewal, Alliance will provide 14 services per week between Perth and BHP's Coondewanna and Barimunva work sites.

Alliance and BHP began their partnership in 2009.

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Wendy Wu Tours turns 25



YESTERDAY Wendy Wu Tours (WWT) founder Wendy Wu hosted key industry partners for a fabulous celebration of the operator's 25th anniversary.

The enthusiastic Wu outlined the company's stellar trajectory after initially being established as an exclusively China specialist in a small suburban office in the Sydney suburb of Epping and now growing to a major multinational global tour operator.

While painful, the pandemic has also ultimately led to strong growth for WWT, which added new destinations such as Portugal, Georgia and Armenia that have proven exceptionally popular, while the reopening of Japan has seen the company already surge beyond 2019 booking levels (TD 04 Sep).
