

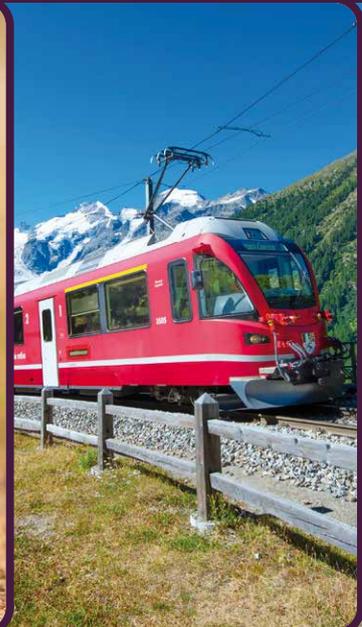
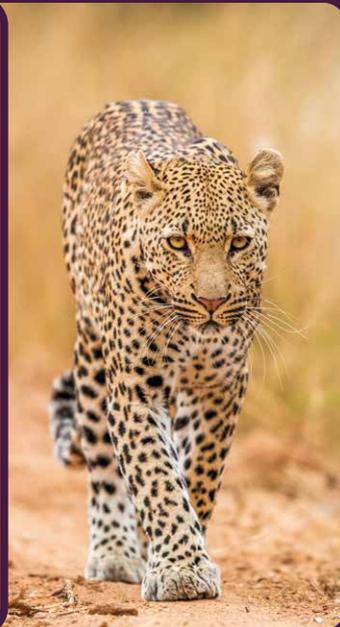
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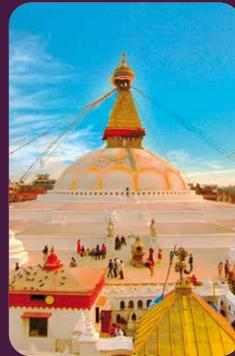

## Victorian Govt gives advanced RFT notice

### EXCLUSIVE

VICTORIA'S Department of Government Services (DGS) has given advance notice of a Request for Tender (RFT) for the provision of travel management services to manage approximately 150 state government departments, agencies, and entities.

The DGS will release the RFT in May 2024, with the outcome of the tender to see a refreshed travel management services State Purchase Contract (SPC) awarded to one or more suppliers.

Scope of the RFT includes the three module specifications:

- Travel Management Company
- Online Booking Tool
- Accommodation Services

Tenderers will have the opportunity to bid for one or more of the modules, however all applicants should note that in the provision of travel management services, service providers must be able to support a "monthly payment of travel in



arrears" financial process which is required by the state.

Applicants should also be aware that this procurement is subject to the Supplier Code of Conduct, Local Jobs First Policy, the Fair Jobs Code and Social Procurement Framework.

Tenderers are required to obtain a Fair Jobs Code Pre-Assessment Certificate prior to submitting an RFT response.

The RFT will be released publicly on the Buying for Victoria website, and offers must be submitted at the following address: [www.tenders.vic.gov.au](http://www.tenders.vic.gov.au).

Lodgement of offers by any other electronic method will not

be accepted.

Organisations wishing to participate in this opportunity must also register on the Buying for Victoria Supplier Portal.

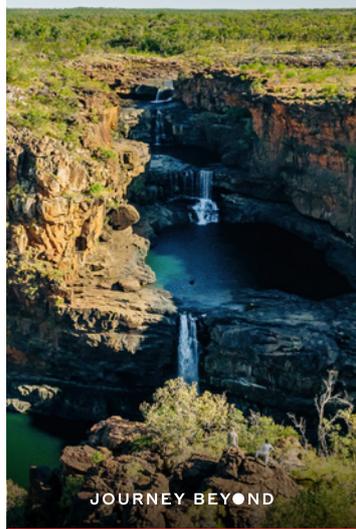

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## LATAM boosts SYD

LATAM Airlines will reintroduce direct flights from Sydney to Santiago operating four times per week from 28 Oct, eliminating the need to travel through Auckland.

The South American airline previously operated direct Sydney-Santiago services briefly until they were paused early on during the pandemic.

Nonstop Harbour City flights follow a wider rebooting of LATAM's international network, having restarted Melbourne-Santiago direct flights in Sep last year (**TD** 04 Sep 2023).

"Passengers can choose from daily direct services between Australia and Chile, including four direct flights from Sydney and three from Melbourne every week, in addition to our flights via Auckland," LATAM said.

## Qantas reroutes Perth-London flights

QANTAS has been forced to temporarily suspend nonstop flights between Perth and London due to safety issues in the Middle East (**TD** breaking news Sat).

The announcement over the weekend was in anticipation of an Iranian attack on Israel, which took place only hours after the carrier's update, with Qantas flights on the nonstop route needing to access airspace where the latest conflict is taking place.

Flights will still operate between the two cities, but at least for the next few days, they will stop in Singapore on a revised flight path to maintain a full load of pax and minimise disruptions.

"We're temporarily adjusting the flight paths for our flights between Perth and London due to the situation in parts of the Middle East," a spokesperson for Qantas told **Travel Daily**.

"We'll reach out to customers directly if there's any change to



their booking."

At this stage, only the QF9 (Perth-London) and QF10 (London-Perth) services are affected, with the carrier to monitor the situation with a range of options available using alternative flight paths.

Qantas' other flights to and from London (QF1/2) are unaffected as they operate through different flight paths.

If a direct military conflict between Iran and Israel were to continue, it has the potential to derail Qantas' plans to launch its Perth to Paris route in Jul,

designed to take advantage of the increase in Aussie traffic heading to the Paris Olympics.

Qantas would not be drawn on whether the launch date of the Paris route is in jeopardy when questioned by **Travel Daily**.

The news coincided with a wider travel warning update issued by DFAT over the weekend.

Meanwhile, Singapore Airlines has this morning informed **TD** that all SIA and Scoot flights have stopped flying in Iranian air space, with flight times now taking "slightly longer" to complete as a result. **AB**

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## Airfares dropping, finally

**INTERNATIONAL** airfare prices have dropped following the return of global and domestic air capacity to pre-pandemic levels, new data from Flight Centre Corporate's FCM Travel and Corporate Traveller has revealed.

Fares on some key international routes for Australian travellers have fallen by 15-25%, with outbound flights to Qatar seeing the biggest drop, decreasing from \$2,519 in the first quarter of 2023 down to \$1,888 in Q1 2024.

Japan and the US also saw significant airfare decreases, with both routes now 21% cheaper compared to the same period last year, while New Zealand saw a 23% drop, down from \$1,176 to the current average price of \$901.

Other noticeable airfare decreases include flights to the United Kingdom, with a seat now costing \$2,220 instead of \$2,709, which was the average in Q1 2023, and the UAE, which now costs travellers \$1,861 as opposed to \$2,406 last year.

Additionally, Aussies heading to Singapore are now saving around 15% on their airfares, thanks to a drop from \$1,567 to \$1,330.

"As of this month, and for the first time since the pandemic, we have reached aircraft passenger seat capacity that is above or beyond pre-pandemic levels globally," said Flight Centre Corporate Global COO Melissa Elf.

"We're seeing this directly correlate to decreasing airfares, which is great news for our corporate travellers, who rely on travel to keep their businesses ticking, and win new work."

Elf added that she expects to see the downward trend continue, as more capacity and more competition is introduced throughout the year.

"We're seeing promising signs that this will be a long lasting trend, thanks to new international capacity announcements like recent ones from Delta Airlines, Singapore Airlines, China



Southern and Jetstar."

She pointed out that some countries continue to lag in their international and domestic capacity - for example, available seats from Australia to Hong Kong are sitting at just 63%, prompting a 16% rise in airfares. *JM*

## Princess eats better

**PRINCESS** Cruises has rolled out a new main dining structure across its entire fleet following a trial of the program on board its new *Sun Princess*.

Designed for flexibility, the line now offers dedicated dining rooms with 'Traditional' for early and late seating windows; 'Reservable' for guests to select their own seating; and 'Walk-in Anytime' for those looking to dine as and when they choose.

The new structure comes into effect for voyages departing 14 Sep, with guests already holding bookings needing to contact Princess Cruises to reprocess their seating.

Princess Cruises Vice President of Food and Beverages, Sami Kohen, said guests have been delighted with the dining flexibility aboard *Sun Princess*.

"Whether guests prefer an early seating every evening, or change things up every night, or even change their mind, these flexible dining options ensure that their dining preference is effortlessly accommodated," he said.

Travellers can also opt for main dining room meals anywhere on the ship via Princess' location-based OceanNow service.

Aussies are fanning out across more of the scenic region, with Praiano particularly popular as one of the less crowded and more authentic enclaves along the Italian coastline.

No longer a well-kept secret, more Australians are pinpointing late Oct and early Nov as an ideal time to visit the Amalfi Coast to take advantage of comfortable "late-summer" temperatures.

**ADELAIDE** Airport has joined forces with First Class Valet to launch a new valet parking service for departing travellers.

Available from 4.30am to 11.30pm every day of the year, travellers can exit their car at the terminal's southern doors and hand their keys to an attendant before proceeding to check-in.

Drive-up rates start at \$85 for a one-day drive-up basis, with lower rates available for longer bookings made online in advance.

Cars are stored in a secure outdoor area for the duration.

The service is separate to a similar valet service operated at ADL by Qantas before it was discontinued in early 2020.

## HALO design out of this world



**GLOBAL** space tourism company HALO Space has offered a first look at the interior of its groundbreaking space capsule, 'Aurora', which was created by Frank Stephenson Design.

Inspired by Space Age architecture, the capsule's design integrates cutting-edge resources, design principles, and technology, with an emphasis on luxury, safety, and functionality.

Ensuring a total take-off weight

of 3,500kg, Aurora integrates lightweight materials such as aluminium alloy and composites, and provides a spacious environment for eight passengers and one pilot.

The capsule also features curved lines and reflective surfaces, as well as an innovative seating arrangement and expansive viewing windows totalling 2.82m<sup>2</sup> to offer travellers an "unforgettable visual experience".

Once flight-ready, Aurora will offer a gradual ascent via a helium balloon to minimise G-forces, with flight times averaging four-six hours and a maximum altitude of up to 35km.

"We wanted every minute of the journey to be unforgettable for our passengers," said Carlos Mira, Chief Executive Officer of HALO Space.

"Frank and his team have created a capsule that not only embodies luxury and elegance but also prioritises safety and functionality," he added. *JM*

Perrett will support existing Sales Coordinator, Emily Potter to help RSSC's sales team nurture trade partner relationships.



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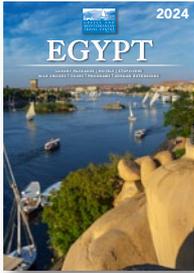

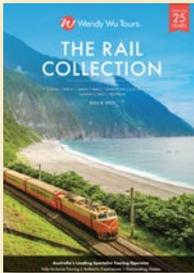

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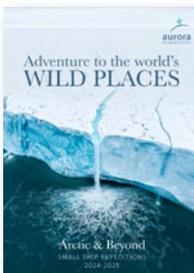
