SAS gets new GM

SCANDINAVIAN Airlines (SAS) has announced the appointment of Irmgard Goetjes-Pedersen as general manager of operations in Australia and New Zealand.

Goetjes-Pedersen has been with SAS for 13 years and she was most recently Acting GM following Lars Olofsson took on the position of GM of Greater China in Oct.

AF/KLM tie-up with Jetstar

AIR France/KLM is days away from a tie up with Jetstar that will see the two joint mega European carriers feed traffic into the growing Jetstar network on flights to Australia.

The announcement was made last night by Marnix Fruitema, Air France KLM Senior Vice President Asia Pacific at the opening of the two airlines' combined new offices in Sydney's CBD.

"We are the number one player between Asia and Europe and Jetstar is a good fit", Fruitema told *Travel Daily*.

"We looked at partners to feed to our on-line destinations such as Singapore and Hong Kong, so we choose Jetstar because it has developed in an impressive way and we'd like to make use of the Aussie carrier's rising presence in the region." said Fruitema.

He played down suggestions about the compatibility of the Jetstar low-cost carrier model with the full-service product offered by AF/KLM, saying joining forces is what the world is about today and our passengers will be pleasantly surprised when they feed into the Jetstar system.

"We have a lot of confidence in the Australian market and our presence here is stronger today than when flew our own aircraft into Australia," he added.

Jean-Luc Mevellec, AF KLM Country Manager, Australia said "the opening of the new offices is an acknowledgement of the ever growing importance of Australia to the group and demonstrates our commitment and dedication to forge even closer relationships with our trade and business associates."

As well as the new tie-up with Jetstar, AF and KLM will continue to offer code-share flights with Qantas and Malaysian Airlines on Australia-Europe flights.

The group operates 53 weekly services to Europe with Air France and 44 for KLM from five major Australian cities.

Kakadu entry fee

INTERSTATE and international visitors to Kakadu National Park will be charged a park entry fee of \$25 per person, from 01 Apr.

An online ticketing system is currently being developed to assist tour operators with the collection of the levy and is expected to be rolled out by early Mar.

Kakadu NP says it will approach tour operators servicing various market segments to trial the online system before it goes live.

All Northern Territory residents and children under the age of 16 are exempt from the entry fee.

Alaska cruise cuts

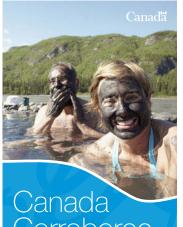

CARNIVAL Corporation has today announced that from 2011 it will operate two less ships in Alaska, with Holland America's *Ryndam* moving to Europe.

And the 710-passenger Royal Princess will also leave the Princess fleet and Alaskan waters in 2011, moving to the UK-based P&O Cruises brand.

The change means Princess will only operate six cruise ships in Alaska in 2011, a 25% reduction.

Carnival and other operators have vigorously protested at the US\$50 per head Alaskan pax tax.

Air Vanuatu ditches MEL

AIR Vanuatu says an increase in demand for capacity out of Brisbane has forced it to revise its Australian air schedule and suspend Melbourne services from 08 Feb.

The move will see Air Vanuatu (NF) remove its 'flagship' Boeing 737-800 aircraft from the MEL/Port Vila twice weekly operation and substitute it for the Brisbane market in Mar.

The airline's Australia Manager Malcolm Pryor said BNE offered feeder traffic from other Aussie

Govt to open up regional airports

OVERSEAS carriers will be given increased landing rights at SYD, MEL, BNE and PER from the govt if they incorporate a stopover at some of the country's regional airports, Transport Minister Anthony Albanese said yesterday.

It's hoped the decision will boost int'l airlines and tourist numbers to locations including Cairns, Broome and Darwin.

The plans will also give foreign airlines the right to fly to other countries from the regional hubs.

"This is about improving the commercial potential of services to Australia's regional airports and encouraging tourism and investment into regional economies," Albanese said.

The relaxed rules would permit an airline such as Continental Airlines, which operates Continental Micronesia flights into Cairns, to fly onward to New Zealand.

HAMILTON Island Yacht Club opened its doors to the public and members for the first time on Wed.

Dubbed the 'Opera House of Queensland' because of its sail-shaped roofline, the Club features a private restaurant, library, health club and conference/function facilities, plus there are 35 four-bedroom luxury villas.

"We know the (Brisbane) market well and have been pleased with the continued and growing support," Pryor said.

NF also announced it would be pulling its direct BNE-Espiritu Santo service as part of its timetable shake-up, which means pax will now connect in Port Vila for the onward sector to Santo.

"Over the next few days we will be re-booking existing Melbourne customers onto connections via Brisbane or Sydney without increase to their fares," he said.

Borghetti came in as the front runner with 30% of votes, with Scurrah in second place at 23% and Baxby way behind at just 8%.

Jetstar Queensland capacity soars

JETSTAR will have more than 50% of market capacity to the Gold Coast and around two-thirds of total seats into the Sunshine Coast and Newcastle once it implements additional frequencies with the addition of four A320s to its fleet (TD breaking news).

CEO Bruce Buchanan said the boost would see Jetstar's Australian domestic market share "continuing to grow to around 18 percent, maintaining Qantas Group market share at 65 percent."

The expansion will include extra frequencies to the Gold Coast, Cairns, Newcastle and the Sunshine Coast, with the move following other recent JQ growth to Tasmania as well as double daily MEL-CNS flights (TD 01 Dec).

"This new growth is yet another example of how Jetstar is proactively responding to the Australian travelling public's strong demand for a combination of low fares, award-winning service and a hassle-free way to travel," Buchanan said.

He confirmed that JQ would back its ongoing commitment to offering the lowest fares on all its routes with the Jetstar Price Beat Guarantee, whereby it will beat any competitor by 10%.

MEANWHILE Jetstar has also confirmed the launch of its new Fiji services, operating four A320 flights a week from 29 Mar, as revealed by TD (07 Dec).

A range of Jetstar Holidays Fiji packages are also on offer, leading in with a deal for a family of four starting at \$591pp for four nights

Arrivals drop 2%

TOURISM Research Australia says short term visitor arrivals fell 2% for the year to 30 Sep, but visitor nights surged 7% to 175 million for the year.

Overall visitor spending also increased by 5% to \$17 billion.

New Zealand was the biggest source of visitors, comprising more than 20% of arrivals, followed by the UK, US and Japan.

BKK double capacity

SUVARNABHUMI Airport in Bangkok aims to be able to cater for 80m pax per year in 10 years time, double its current capacity.

The prediction comes after Airports of Thailand said it would spend US\$2.3b over the next six years to expand the airport.

GAP Adventures will add 21 new small group adventure tours in the Middle East in 2010, following an 81% growth in year-on-year sales to the region.

The additions bring Gap's Middle East offerings to 60 trips which are showcased in a new dedicated brochure.

PATA concerns

THE Pacific Asia Travel Assoc. (PATA) says international visitors to the region in Sep showed steady growth, with arrivals to most destinations in the Pacific increasing, including a 9% increase to both Australia and New Zealand and Hawaii up 8%.

However, falling foreign inbound numbers for China (down 4%) and Japan (down 16%) depressed growth in the Northeast Asia region, according to PATA.

Associate director of Strategic Intelligence Centre, Kris Lim said: "This year is shaping up to be one of the worst for many years for international arrivals into Asia Pacific destinations.

"The full-year contraction in arrival numbers could be as much as five percent. This means the region could end the year with some 17m fewer visitors this year as compared to the 377m recorded in 2008," Lim said.

JAL reductions

THE JAL Group will temporarily adjust flight frequency on routes between Tokyo and Sao Paulo, via New York, from 01 Feb-27 Mar, cutting back on 1 of 3 services.

JAL will also suspend flights JL619/610 on the Tokyo-Shanghai route from 18 Jan-27 Mar, and downsize jets on the Tokyo Haenda-Beijing, Tokyo Narita-Beijing and Tokyo Haenda-Hong Kong routes.

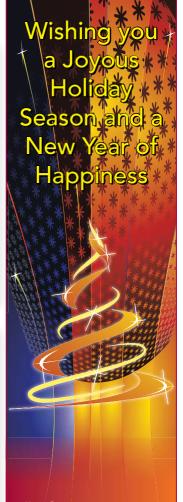
