VA Fiji inaugural

V AUSTRALIA today operated its first flight between Sydney and Nadi, with a full load of guests on the daily services which will add over 1260 seats a week.

The carrier is certainly shaking up the route with fares from \$199 one way for its full service offering in economy class.

Premium economy leads in at \$469 one way and business from \$649 one way, all including taxes.

Air Pacific has responded by launching a "Fiji Fare Frenzy" with return fares of \$400 including taxes, on sale to 05 Jan and travel 19 Jan-16 Sep 2010 with some blackout periods.

FJ ceo John Campbell was quoted in the *Fiji Times* as saying that the carrier expects to lose market share due to the "unnatural" competition on the route between Jetstar and VA.

Court stops strike

AN emergency injunction has been granted by an English court which will stop the 12 day cabin crew strike planned by British Airways staff, which has thrown the industry into chaos.

The High Court ruled in favour of the carrier's claim that the ballot of workers by the Unite union was illegal because it included members no longer employed by British Airways.

BA said the decision would be "welcomed by hundreds of thousands of families in the UK and around the world," while the union said the ruling marked a "disgraceful day for democracy."

Jetstar expands payment options

JETSTAR has today signalled a new focus on corporate travellers, with new partnerships with Diners Club and Universal Air Travel Plan (UATP) which "have the potential to attract and expand our growing corporate client base even further," according to JQ Exec Mgr Commercial, David Koczkar.

He said the expanded payment options are "a value-add for consumers which increase Jetstar's relevance for frequent flyers around our growing network of more than fifty destinations."

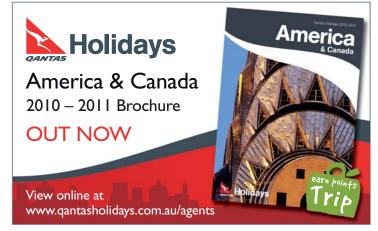
The UATP deal means corporate customers can now purchase Jetstar fares with any UATP issued card, described as "one of the most widely-used and popular card payment options for corporate travel buyers throughout the Asia Pacific region."

Jetstar, Jetstar Asia and Jetstar Pacific will also now accept payment via Diners Club.

Koczkar said the new options reflected Jetstar's ongoing focus on offering "value-for- travel combined with choices."

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AirAsia, Jetstar deal

QANTAS this morning confirmed that Jetstar and AirAsia are in talks about a "potential cost saving joint venture".

The carrier was responding to a report in the Australian which outlined the possible deal for joint procurement, including the purchase of goods, parts, ground handling and even aircraft in the longer term, but not engineering work or training.

In a stock exchange release QF said the discussions were "at a preliminary stage and no binding agreements have been reached."

Daydream transfers

DAYDREAM Island Resort and Spa in the Whitsundays has signed an exclusive agreement with Cruise Whitsundays to provide transfers for guests and staff.

The resort said the pact would allow for more flexibility in transfer times as well as a "more seamless guest experience".

The agreement covers transfers between the island and Great Barrier Reef Airport on Hamilton Island as well as Whitsunday Coast Airport at Proserpine and Abel Point Marina, Airlie Beach.

It's effective Mon 01 Feb 2010, and from that date existing transfer vouchers, including those for Fantasea, will be honoured by Cruise Whitsundays without needing to be reissued.

Air NZ to launch SYD/RAR

AIR New Zealand will trial a direct link between Sydney and the Cook Islands over a four month period next year in a move to bolster Australian arrivals.

The Cooks' Tourism Minister Robert Wigmore disclosed details of the weekly service yesterday saying Air NZ plan to operate the service to Rarotonga from Jul, using a Boeing 767 aircraft.

Wigmore said the initiative has the support from Cook Islands Tourism, who will be promoting the new service from early next year through a joint advertising campaign with some Australian wholesalers.

The CI Tourism chief executive officer John Dean has applauded the decision - one which he has been hoping for since taking office in Apr last year.

"It is exciting and wonderful news for the Cook Islands, as Australian visitors have good lengths of stay, spend is high and approximately 80% visit one of the outer islands," said Dean.

He said the NZ service would assist with establishing Australia as a core short haul market into the future.

Currently, Air New Zealand and Pacific Blue fly to Rarotonga from Australia, operating via Auckland. Adventure World and Coral Seas

head Jamie Strickland told TD today that the new flights will "significantly open up the market and provide a chance to promote the Cooks to other new markets, including West Australia.

He said the once weekly service is planned to depart Rarotonga on Sun mornings, returning the same day in the evening, which will be "perfectly suited to the honeymoon market".

Strickland said John Dean will be meeting with key Australian wholesalers mid-Jan to plot marketing promos to ensure the service is a success.

TRAILFINDERS has closed its Brisbane branch, according to an update issued by the Travel Compensation Fund this morning.

Kunkel to Japan

CLUB Med's Australian gm has been appointed to a new role as Director North East Asia Zone (Japan and Korea) for Club Med, effective from 01 Jan.

Kunkel will relocate to Tokyo to take up the position, having headed up the Australian Club Med operations since 2003.

Sydney traffic up

MACQUARIE Airports today said traffic at Sydney Airport during Nov was up 7.8% on a year ago.

Domestic/regional passenger numbers rose 8.0% to 2.005m, while international traffic was up 8.4% to 892,000 for the month.

The major market which grew was Australia, up 12%, with other markets also up including NZ (+11%) and the USA (+22%).

The biggest declines were seen for Japan (-13%) and India (-11%).

SLH moves

THE Sydney office of Small Luxury Hotels has relocated to Level 17, BNP Paribas Centre, 60 Castlereagh Street.

The repartee did improve through the evening, but one quip by judge Gaynor Reid from Accor suggested that the Michael Jackson backing track used during the baton-twirling act from AFTA's Melissa Pickering was "good use of a dead star".

A POSSIBLE new threat to the travel industry has launched in the UK, with a service from phone provider Orange which invites people to "dial-a-beach" via a free Relaxation Line.

On offer to Orange subscribers, it's a dedicated phone number which allows callers to listen to the sound of the sea lapping against the shore, if they need a break from family or work pressures, particularly over the busy Christmas period.

The Relaxation Line also offers the sound of a woodland forest, the hum of birdsong or even the crackle of a log fire.

A NUMBER of US airports are offering free gift wrapping services, to help travellers as they pass through security checkpoints with their presents.

Travellers are being advised to leave gifts unwrapped when they get to the airport so screeners can check them out - with volunteer wrappers past security accepting charity donations in return for wrapping the gifts.

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Explore keeps it up

EXPLORE Holidays says it's still paying a full 8% commission on Garuda wholesale airfares, despite the cuts announced by the carrier this week (*TD* Wed).

However Viva! Holidays today advised agents that due to the cuts its new commission level on GA flights to Bali would be 6% effective from 01 Jan 2010.

From the same date Viva! is also reducing its commission on Malaysia Airlines flights to 4%.

EU Canada deal

THE European Union has signed a new bilateral aviation deal with Canada phasing out current restrictions on flights, including allowing services from any European city to Canada.

The pact replaces previous agreements which only allowed an airline to fly to Canada from its home country.

BA director to IB

BRITISH Airways executive director Keith Williams has been appointed as a non-executive director of Spanish flag carrier Iberia, with the move following a board meeting yesterday.

The move confirms the further progress of the previously announced merger of the airlines.

CO begin NAN route

CONTINENTAL Airlines has today commenced new nonstop services between Honolulu and its Guam hub to Nadi, Fiji.

The new twice weekly service (revealed exclusively by *TD* (*TD* 16 Mar) will be operated by CO's subsidiary Continental Micronesia, using a 155-seat Boeing 737-800, departing Nadi on Tue and Sat.

MEANWHILE, Continental has said it will being offering GoGo inflight internet on its fleet of Boeing 757-300s used on domestic US routes from mid-2010.

EK407's 7 strikes before take off

THE Australian Transport Safety Burueau has today handed down its latest Interim Factual report on the Emirates A340-500 aircraft tail strike which occured in MEL on 20 Mar (TD 23 Mar).

The report was drawn up to remind other carriers of the risks associated with calculating and entering take-off performance information.

The EK Flight407 incident occured when the crew of the jet, which had 257 pax onboard plus crew, miscalculated the weight of the aircraft by 100 tonnes.

The document releases more frightening details about the infamous EK take off which could have ended in Australia's worst aviation disaster had the pilot's not reacted swiftly to get the plane airbourne.

The investigation has found that the Airbus made contact with the ground (or an object on the ground) seven times - incl the runway three times, the ground twice, a stobe light and a Localiser Monitor Antenna - each highlighted in the above image.

The A340 dumped its fuel and returned to MEL at which time cabin crew at the back of the jet also reported smoke in the cabin.

Following the "accident", the

ATSB says Emirates has undertaken a number of procedural, training and technical initiatives across its fleet and operations.

EK has also released a modified version of its cockpit performance planning tool and is developing a software package which automatically checks the consistency of the flight data being entered into the jet's flight computers by flight crew, reports the aviation watchdog.

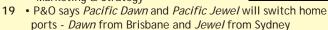

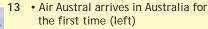

AW merge Brewster

AF bailing on Dubai

AIR France is pulling five of its 12 weekly services operating on the Paris-Dubai route and shifting them to Abu Dhabi.

The move, which comes into effect from 03 May, signals the return of Air France to Abu Dhabi after an eight year hiatus from the capital of the UAE.

Paris icon selling

STRATEGIC Hotels & Resorts has announced a sales agreement with an investment group for the Mariott International managed Renaissance Paris Hotel Le Parc Trocadero for €35.5m (\$AU57m).

The firm says the sale, which closes in 45 days, is in line with its "strategic disposition strategy".

B6/Amadeus pact

JETBLUE Airways (B6) in the US and Amadeus has signed a multiyear global distribution deal which will enable Amadeus connected agents globally to access the carrier's full range of content and real-time data.

B6 vice president sales, Noreen Courtney-Wilds said, "Formalising our relationship with Amadeus reinforces our commitment to the agency community".

Under the agreement JetBlue will use Amadeus' Interactive Sell, Dynamic Availability and Interactive Seats functionality.

MEANWHILE, Amadeus has also announced a new partnership with the KLIA Ekspres non-stop high speed rail service, which operates ever 15 min between Kuala Lumpur International Airport and the city centre.

The move will enable agents to book the train service via Amadeus, further expanding the GDS firm's Airport Express Service which already includes London's Heathrow Express, the Alranda Express in Stockholm and Friendly Airport Limousine at Narita.

Strategic Bali OK

THE International Air Services Commission has agreed to transfer 408 seats of capacity per week on the Indonesia route from the defunct OzJet Airlines to Strategic Aviation.

Strategic plans to operate twice weekly A330 services between Brisbane and Denpasar, to commence with one per week in Mar and adding a second dependent on market demand.

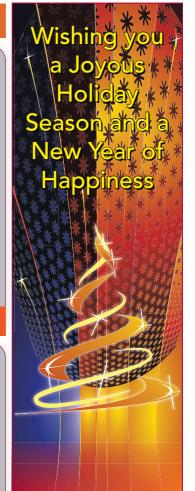
