The call comes after the recent demise of Top End Escapes (TD 15 Nov) with client losses now in the realms of \$700,000, leaving many out of pocket and some unlikely to receive compensation.

The NT is the only Australian State or Territory where there is no TCF or similar protection for consumers, should a travel agent collapse, said TCF ceo Glen Wells.

"The reason the NT is not part of the TCF scheme is that, after almost all of the necessary arrangements were made for the NT to join the TCF in 1996, the then NT Government decided to accommodate demands by some local travel agents to make TCF participation optional," Wells said

QF Europe waiver

QANTAS Airways says it's still experiencing significant delays on services between Australia and Europe due to snowstorms.
