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QF Vietnam woes

QANTAS has confirmed that two of its senior staff working in Vietnam were barred from coming home for Christmas due to an ongoing investigation by the Vietnamese govt into QF's local Jetstar Pacific offshoot.

The issues relate to fuel hedging losses which allegedly weren't

The deal, which was in fact announced in India late last month, was negotiated by C&K Australia ceo Steve Reynolds, who said the purchase continues C&K's strategy of growth in the Australian market, following its Tempo Holidays purchase just over 12 months ago.

Hardy comes a highland cropper

CRUISE Express ceo Hardy Schneider is expected to be discharged today from a NSW Southern Highlands hospital after surviving a light plane crash near the town of Mittagong.

Schneider and fellow Cruise Express tour host Craig Robinson were in a single-engine Piper aircraft flown by a friend, which clipped trees and crashed into a vineyard shortly after takeoff at about 11am yesterday.

All four people on board the joy flight escaped the wreckage with minor injuries, with Schneider the only one to be hospitalised, suffering a fractured toe along with cuts and bruises.

"I think we landed between the chardonnay and the shiraz," he guipped from his hospital bed.

The deal also includes the purchase of MyPlanet Australia Pty Ltd, with the operations sold by First Choice Holdings Australia Pty Ltd, owned by European travel giant TUI Travel which has other Australian operations including Peregrine Adventures.

Bentours was founded in 1979 by Bent Ronnov, and purchased by TUI in 2006 under the MyPlanet operation.

A restructure last year (TD 03 Mar) saw Bentours restructured, with its management shifting to be based at Peregrine's Melbourne

Reynolds said C&K would be "leveraging resources and technologhy to optimise both operations" but would take time to understand the business in detail before making any significant changes.

Details of the amount paid haven't been revealed, however C&K India said the acquisition was being funded "through an earnout mechanism".

US security talks

FEDERAL transport minister Anthony Albanese has met with US Department of Homeland Security deputy secretary, Jane Holl Lute, to disuss the enhanced border security procedures in place for travel to the US following the attempted attack on a transatlantic Delta flight on Christmas Day.

Albanese said the meeting "provided an opportunity to make sure our respective aviation and border security arrangements are coordinated and appropriate to the evolving threat."

The visit is part of a "broad international outreach," with US officials also set to call at major international airports in Europe. Asia, Africa and the Middle East.





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Camper crackdown

QUEENSLAND-based backpacker van rental specialist Wicked Campers has come under fire from the Old govt over safety issues with its vehicles.

Acting Qld premier, Paul Lucas, said that of nine campers recently submitted for testing by Queensland Transport, five had failed due to defects such as structural rust, oil leaks, steering problems, accident damage and a range of mechanical faults.

"I think it's wicked to have campervans out there with young people driving them in a highly dangerous manner," he said.

The director-general of Qld Transport, David Stewart, has written to his counterparts in other states about the fleet of almost 1000 campers, saying "the results of these inspections present reasonable grounds for concern over the way Wicked Campervans operate across Australia."

The company's ceo, John Webb, denied that the fleet was not roadworthy, insisting that the removal of 50 vehicles from the fleet when asked to submit them for safety testing was only a "coincidence" and was part of ongoing fleet renewal.

Webb said the govt attacks were not warranted, adding: "We employ 80 people and add a lot of value to tourists."

Auckland Airport CNS buy

NZ-LISTED Auckland International Airport has purchased a 24.55% stake in the operator of Cairns and Mackay Airports, saying the deal "opens up exciting new opportunities to strengthen and grow air services connections with Cairns as a stepping stone between New Zealand and the high-growth tourism markets of Asia."

The \$132.8m purchase sees Westpac sell out of North Queensland Airports, with AKL ceo Simon Moutter saying the deal recognises that the most important value driver for the airport is growth in international

QF hit by collapse

QANTAS has been revealed as one of the largest creditors of collapsed UK aircraft parts supplier, Aero Inventory, which went into administration in Nov.

The company operated by purchasing the parts divisions of various airlines and selling them back items over time, with major clients including All Nippon Airways and Air Canada.

A report from Aero Inventory's administrators shows Qantas is owed £1.46m, with unsecured creditors likely to receive only a minimal payout of around 1.1p in the pound.

passenger volumes.

"New Zealand has underperformed against Australia in gaining a share of Asian tourism, so we have decided to take a position in the Australian market in an effort to get better connected and lift our market share," Moutter said.

The deal is scheduled for settlement on Wed, with Moutter also saying that while Cairns has been underperforming due to the decline in the Japanese market, "we believe it is poised for a strong rebound" driven by improving tourism demand, the new Jetstar services to Western Japan and the recently announced federal govt initiatives to encourage foreign airlines to operate through regional airports.

WE all know airline yields are down, but this is ridiculous.

American Airlines last week advertised a First Class return fare from Los Angeles to Sydney, on board the new Airbus A380 operated by its codeshare partner Qantas, for just US\$1200.

Of course it was due to a fare loading error on the AA website which was discovered and fixed about an hour later - by which time a number of tickets described as being "in the very low three figures" were sold - enough to fill the QF A380 first class cabin several times over.

AA confirmed it isn't honouring the fare, instead offering the option of economy or a refund.

Industry recovery predicted

TRAVEL industry recruitment firms are seeing an upturn in requests for new staff, with the demand seen as a strong early indicator of industry recovery.

TMS Asia-Pacific ceo Andrew Chan has gone so far as to predict a return of the skills shortage experienced through 2007/08, which he referred to as the 'war for talent'.

He said TMS had seen a marked increase in job orders received through the Dec/Jan period, with clients "looking to boost headcount in anticipation of an upturn."

Recently appointed TMS gm Australia, Alessandra de Matteis, said many of the positions were in "experienced high end consulting, business development, account management - all middle management roles in the 60-80K range" as well as support roles with some wholesalers who are looking to increase head count as they gear up for the peak season.

TMS said the demand points toward solid employment growth in the hospitality and tourism sector in the months ahead, and

encouraged travel companies to start planning their manpower needs early.

Chan also said TMS was receiving enquiries about possible new roles from some "mid-range to executive candidates.

"People are obviously confident enough to be actively thinking about making a move," he said.



ESTA was introduced by the US Department of Homeland Security last year (*TD* 12 Jan 2009), and is used to determine the right of visitors to enter America.


