Qantas numbers up 11%

QANTAS this morning reported that its traffic during Mar was up 11.2% on a year ago - but most of the growth occurred on Jetstar international sectors, and the carrier's yield is down significantly on a year ago.

Mainline domestic numbers were up 2.6% to 1.443m for the month, while Jetstar domestic only grew 1.6% to 697,000.

Qantas international carried 494,000 passengers for the month

UA/CO Aus. c'share
CONTINENTAL Airlines is now displaying its flight code on Star Alliance partner carrier, United Airlines, services between the USA and Australia, according to travel agent GDSs.

The 'CO' code appears on UA metal on services between Los Angeles-Sydney-Melbourne and Sydney-San Francisco.

MEANWHILE, the expected tie-up between CO and UA (*TD* Fri) is likely to see United's ceo Glenn Tilton appointed as chairman of the merged carrier, while CO's chief exec. officer Jeffery Smisek will run the airline.

which was 91,000 (15.6%) less than in Mar 09 - while Jetstar international added 151,000 passengers, increasing 80.8% to 337,000 Mar pax.

Qantaslink also performed well during the month, with numbers up 12.6% to 387,000 for Mar.

Qantas said its total international yield for QF and Jetstar international operations (excluding foreign exchange) for the month of Mar "was positive when compared to the corresponding prior year period".

But for the financial year to Mar 2010 total Qantas/Jetstar domestic yield was down 3.9%, and total international yield under both brands for the nine months was 16.2% lower than the previous corresponding period.

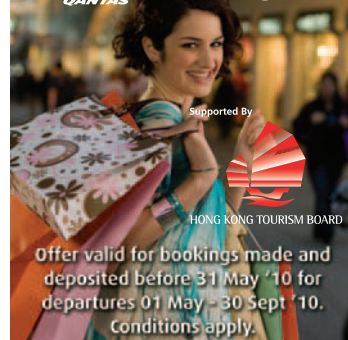

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Tasman tie-up for NZ/DJ

AIR New Zealand and Virgin Blue say that their proposed trans-Tasman alliance (TD breaking news) will "stimulate a new wave of competition in Australasian aviation".

The carriers this morning announced they would seek regulatory approval for a wide-ranging pact which would see them collaborate on future route and product planning, code sharing, lounges and frequent flyer program benefits.

Applications covering the deal will be lodged today with competition authorities in both NZ and Australia, with NZ ceo Rob Fyfe and outgoing Virgin Blue chief Brett Godfrey saying the alliance would deliver cheaper airfares, increased frequency and better connections.

Godfrey said his replacement, John Borghetti, "thoroughly supports this strategy" which as well as direct trans-Tasman flights would also cover connecting

regional centres in Australia and NZ as part of a Tasman journey.

"We are two of the world's most innovative and nimble airlines and by working closer together we believe we can deliver significant benefits to customers and shareholders," said Fyfe, adding that DJ/NZ's Tasman capacity would grow more quickly than they would without the alliance.

"By combining our New Zealand customer base with the strong market presence that Virgin Blue has in Australia, additional flights and new routes will make sense much more quickly," with the deal also set to boost tourism in both countries.

MEANWHILE Air NZ yesterday also launched a new range of fare options on its Tasman and Pacific flights - to debut between Sydney and Christchurch from 18 Aug.

Four fare levels will be on offer - Seat only, Seat + bag (including one checked bag), "The Works" which adds entertainment, a meal and drinks; and "Works Deluxe" with premium check-in, lounge access and more space.

CARNIVAL Australia has today announced a special charter of its *Pacific Dawn* in conjunction with the sport division of European travel giant TUI Travel PLC.

Carnival ceo Ann Sherry said *Dawn* would carry 2000 rugby supporters from Europe, South Africa and Australia, with the itinerary taking in key knock-out matches in Christchurch and Auckland plus a visit to Wellington and the 23 Oct final in Auckland.

Dawn will reposition from Brisbane to Auckland on 04 Oct for the four week charter which will also feature a line-up of former rugby internationals to add to the onboard experience.

Other cruise ships holding rugby devotees during the World Cup will include Holland America's *ms Volendam* which has been chartered by Adventure World and is being marketed by AW's parent firm NRMA (TD 24 Oct).

DJ axes ADL/NAN

VIRGIN Blue sister airline Pacific Blue has withdrawn its direct Adelaide-Nadi route effective this past weekend.

Virgin Blue spokesperson Amanda Bolger told TD today the South Australia -Fiji direct link was "underperforming" so the carrier was re-directing capacity elsewhere where demand is high.

There are "no plans for the service to return at this stage," Bolger said.

In Mar last year, Pacific Blue announced the launch of the route but shortly afterwards suspended the service for 2 months between Jul and Aug as it worked on a re-designed schedule (TD 02 Jun 09).

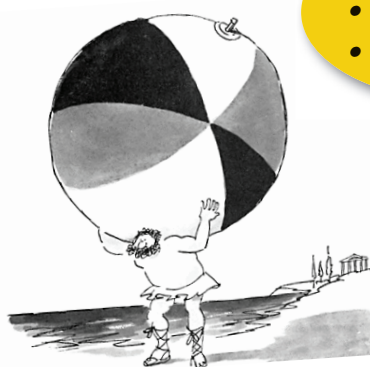
