EU cartel fines

QANTAS, British Airways and Air France-KLM are among 11 airlines which were overnight fined a total of €799m (A\$1.1 billion) by European regulators over the long-running cargo cartel case.

The biggest fine - A\$472m - was imposed on Air France-KLM which acquired cargo carrier Martinair in 2008, while British Airways was hit with a \$144m fine.

The Qantas fine was \$12 million, while Cathay Pacific was fined \$79 million, LAN Chile \$11 million, SAS \$97 million, Air Canada \$30 million and JAL \$50 million.

Air NZ, which was initially part of the probe, was one of 11 airlines which had charges dropped.

Some of the carriers said they would appeal, while Lufthansa and SWISS were found guilty of taking part in the cartel but didn't receive a fine because they had alerted the European Commission to the cargo fuel surcharge pricefixing scheme which operated between 1999 and 2006.

"It is deplorable that so many major airlines coordinated their pricing to the detriment of European businesses and consumers," the EC said.

Big guns push Delta-DJ

KIM Beazley, the Australian ambassador to the USA, has been throwing his weight around in support of the proposed alliance between Virgin Blue and Delta.

Documents released this week by the US Dept of Transportation (DoT) reveal a series of high level meetings following the draft rejection of the pact (*TD* 09 Sep).

One of these, on 12 Oct, included Beazley and "other senior representatives of the government of Australia" - along with Virgin Blue ceo John Borghetti, who all met with the US Secretary and Deputy Secretary of Transportation.

During the meeting Beazley "noted the keen interest that the proceeding held for the government and people of Australia, and emphasised the economic significance of aviation links between the United States of Australia and the Open Skies Agreement between the two countries," according to the DoT memorandum.

The documents also reveal meetings in Sep between Delta and DoT officials, including a 15

Sep discussion with DL ceo Richard Anderson who "asserted that the tentative decision was inconsistent with past DoT precedent".

DL and DJ have subsequently made further submissions to the DoT probe after being granted an extension of time to "clarify the matter" (*TD* 15 Sep) which expired on 13 Oct - the day after Beazley and Borghetti's meeting.

Global recovery

THE Asia-Pacific region is continuing to lead the rebound in international tourism, according to figures released at the World Travel Market in London overnight.

The United Nations World Tourism Organisation said global arrivals were up 7% for the eight months to 31 Aug, with the results positive in all regions.

The figure for the Asia-Pacific region was twice this at 14% - and with an extra 10 million international tourist arrivals when compared to the pre-crisis peak of 2008 and double-digit growth for most destinations.

Europe is recovering at a much slower pace, with numbers up just 3% due to the "uneven economic recovery and the impact of the volcanic ash cloud".

"Tourism has again confirmed a strong capacity for recovery," said UNWTO Secretary-General Taleb Rifai, with the sector "showing real growth and is expected to beat previous records by the end of 2010".

The organisation is estimating that worldwide arrivals will climb by 4-5% in 2011, but said tourism expenditure was lagging behind.







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B787 emergency

A BOEING 787 *Dreamliner* test flight over the US has needed to make an emergency landing in Laredo, Texas after a fire broke out in the electronic equipment on board the aircraft.

The fire caused displays and auto throttle to fail on ZA002, Boeing's second state-of-the-art 787 test aircraft, and resulted in the emergency shutes being deployed for the 30 to 40 test personnell on the flight.

Virgin status match

VIRGIN Blue is reportedly matching the status of top tier Qantas frequent flyers, who are being offered instant Gold level membership of the DJ Velocity Rewards scheme.

The offer applies to Gold and Platinum Qantas members, and means they will be entitled to Velocity Gold perks such as lounge access, larger baggage allowances and priority check-in.

SQ suspends A380 flights

SINGAPORE Airlines this morning cancelled the departure of one of its A380 flights from London, telling pax that engine maker Rolls Royce had placed an "embargo" on A380 aircraft using its Trent 900 engines, as exclusively revealed to the world in TD's breaking news.

Several reports say the crew refused to fly the superjumbo flagship after oil was found in one of the turbines - a symptom which is believed to have led to the explosion of the QF engine.

It's understood that SIA A380s are also currently grounded in Sydney and Melbourne, although the carrier hasn't responded to requests for comment before *TD*'s deadline today.

Engine maker Rolls Royce yesterday issued a special service bulletin after saying it had "made progress in understanding the cause of the engine failure" on QF32 out of SIN five days ago.

"As a result, a series of checks and inspections have been agreed with Airbus, with operators of the Trent 900 powered A380 and with the airworthiness authorities," Rolls Royce said in a statement.

"These are being progressively completed which is allowing a resumption of operation of aircraft in full compliance with all safety standards".

The Qantas A380 fleet remains grounded and isn't expected to resume service until Fri at the earliest, with further details emerging from QF32 incl damage to wiring and hydraulic systems.

Earlier this week SQ said it was continuing to operate its A380s after inspections found no problems with the fleet.

Nov air fare index

DOMESTIC discounted airfares have dipped 6.5% during Nov against the Oct figure, to be at their lowest point in six months, according to figures released today in the Australian Domestic Air Fare Index.

The 'Best Discount' fare index for Nov 2010 is 53.8 (with Jul 2003 being the base year of 100), the lowest level ever for that month on record.

'Restricted' and 'Full' Economy fares rose slightly in Nov, up 0.1% to 91.8 and 0.5% to 92.7 respectively on the month prior.

'Business' class fares were flat, sitting at 97.0, a similar figure recorded since Aug this year.

And 57.9% of those are plotting to stay at home, which is a record level for the Sep quarter, up 1.1% on the same period last year.

Intention to head abroad during the period was down 0.4% yearon-year to 8.2%.

Jane lanniello from Roy Morgan Research said: "Although overall consumer confidence has rebounded since the Global Financial Crisis, Australians are facing the possibility of higher interest rates in the near future.

"A cheaper domestic holiday may be a safer bet than an overseas trip," she added.

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
