

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


Velocity matching

VIRGIN Blue says reports that it's currently matching the status of Qantas frequent flyers in its Velocity Rewards program (*TD* yesterday) are incorrect.

Spokesman Colin Lippiatt told *TD* that the suggestions appear to have emerged from an erroneous business travel website report.

He said that from time to time Velocity does release an allocation of free Gold memberships for QF high status frequent flyers, but the most recent one of these has been exhausted and it's not clear when more may become available.



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A380 European directive

THE European Aviation Safety Agency has issued an interim airworthiness directive for A380 aircraft operating the Rolls Royce Trent-900 aircraft, ordering repetitive inspections of parts of the engines to "detect any abnormal oil leakage, and if any discrepancy is found, to prohibit further engine operation".

The move follows the sudden suspension of three Singapore Airlines services from London, Sydney and Melbourne (*TD* yesterday), with those aircraft heading home to Singapore (with just crew on board) to each have an engine replaced.

Singapore Airlines denied reports that the London crew had refused to operate the flight after oil was found in one of the turbines, saying this was "absolutely incorrect" - and also

Ben's Expedition

QUEENSLAND tourism minister Peter Lawlor yesterday confirmed that the state's former Best Job in the World Island Caretaker, Ben Southall, will begin a new threemonth campaign to promote the Great Barrier Reef, as revealed by *Travel Daily* (*TD* 28 Sep).

Dubbed 'The Best Expedition in the World', the challenge will see Southall kayak and sail 1,600km from the town of 1770 to Cooktown to spread the meesage of research, education and conservation of the world's largest coral reef.

"Our aim is to encourage more people from around the world to experience the Islands of the Great Barrier Reef and perhaps to get involved in research and protection of the reef themselves," Lawlor said.

Southall was the brains behind the expedition, saying he was "thrilled" to be taking on a caretaker role for the GBR.

His expedition will kick off in May next year.

claimed that passengers on the suspended LHR flight were not told that Rolls Royce had placed an "embargo" on the A380 Trent 900 services.

SQ Regional Vice President South West Pacific, Subhas Menon, told *TD* that initial engine inspections by SIA had found "nothing untoward," but further investigations had seen Rolls Royce recommend replacing the three engines - leading to the cancellation of the services.

The EASA safety directive requires mandatory engine inspections within 10 flight cycles and thereafter for every 20 sectors operated by the A380s.

This morning SQ issued an update saying that alternate aircraft had been put in place to operate its Sydney and Melbourne flights through until 17 Nov, with the A380s to resume service once the precautionary engine changes had been carried out in line with the Rolls Royce recommendations.

There are no changes to SQ's SYD and MEL schedules as a result, and the carrier said if necessary it would mount supplementary flights to meet demand.

MEANWHILE Qantas also today released an updated A380-free schedule for its international network for the "coming weeks".

QF said that while it's committed to returning the superjumbos to service as soon as possible, "this contingency schedule has been designed to provdie certainty for customers planning to travel in the near future".

747s have been replaced by A330s on Sydney-Narita, while A330s have been replaced by 767s on Perth to Singapore and A330s will operate Sydney-Hong Kong.

"These changes will enable Qantas to operate 747s on long haul international services previously operated by the A380," the carrier said.

THE Netherlands' "drug tourism" industry may take a hit after a crackdown by Dutch authorities on home-grown marijuana.

As part of the move 30,000 households in Rotterdam and The Hague will receive special 'scratch 'n' sniff' cards to help them detect whether their neighbours are cultivating cannabis on a large scale.

Authorities say that although they turn a blind eye to those who grow up to five marijuana plants for personal use, they're concerned about the estimated 40,000 bulk plantations hidden in people's attics - which can be a fire hazard because of the electrical equipment needed to maintain the right growing conditions.

When the special cards are scratched they reveal the scent of marijuana as well as the phone number of a police drug hotline.

AIR New Zealand has been rated as delivering the most satisfying experience by customers on international flights for the 12 months to Sep 2010, according to reseach by Roy Morgan.

Air NZ just pipped out Singapore Airlines to the best rating, with 88.6% of passengers saying they were either 'very' or 'fairly' satisfied in the latest results.

Customers flying with Singapore Airlines were satisfied 88.5% during the period, followed by V Australia with 86.4% (which was a jump of two places since Jun), then Thai Airways and Malaysia Airlines (83%), Emirates (81.4% - down three places), Etihad (81%) and Qantas with 80.9% satisfied.

23 airlines were surveyed in the poll, with an industry average of 74.2%, which according to Jane lanniello of Roy Morgan Research says has been pulled down by low cost carriers such as Tiger Airways, AirAsia X and Jetstar.

Stay in SIN longer

SINGAPORE Tourism Board is ramping up its YourSingapore.com branding (*TD* 06 May) with a new 'Scratch more than the Surface' marketing campaign.

Operating income swung around during the period, from a loss of US\$740m in Q3 2009 to US\$104m this year, and pre tax profit of US\$175m.

CEO and president Jeff Clarke said the growth from GDS business (Galileo and Worldspan) was slightly lower than anticipated.

US/Japan ATI ok'd

THE US Dept of Transportation has issued its Final Order of approval for antitrust immunity to both Star Alliance and oneworld, permitting the airline groups to begin joint ventures between the United States and Japan.

A tentative decision in favour of the JVs was announced last month (*TD* 07 Oct).

The green light means Star partners ANA, Continental and United Airlines, and oneworld members American Airlines and JAL, can coordinate services.

ZQN stays up in Sep

TOTAL visitor nights spent in Queenstown, New Zealand were up 9% year-on-year to 196,686 in Sep 2010, on the back of a 9.5% increase in int'l visitor nights.

Destination Queenstown ceo
Tony Everitt said the figure was
fueled by a longer ski season,

Qantas GST fight

THE Administrative Appeals Tribunal in Sydney is currently hearing a case in which Qantas is disputing whether GST is payable on cancellation fees and forfeited fares paid by no-show passengers.

QF has been disputing the GST assessments issued by the Australian Taxation Office over the last four years, and is seeking a "hefty refund" according to today's *Financial Review*.

The ATO has previously ruled that Qantas makes a so-called "taxable supply" even before passengers take a flight, and therefore GST is payable on cancellation fees and forfeited fares for no-shows.

QF's legal representative yesterday argued that "take-off is the path that leads to supply" and in cases where no flight is taken there is "simply an agreement that if you don't take a supply, we'll keep your money".

Mexicana restart?

BANKRUPT carrier Mexicana may be revived by next month if its owner, Grupo Mexicana de Aviacion SA, can get the support from unions and creditors to agree to a 1.9 billion-peso (AU\$155m) proposal deal, *Bloomberg* reports.



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

MacBook TSA OK

THE latest micro-thin Apple MacBook Air laptop is allowed to stay in passenger baggage through US airport screening, according to the Transportation Security Administration's blog.

The 11-inch model can stay in the bag - along with iPads and small 'netbook' computers - but the 13-inch MacBook Air must be removed for screening.

The TSA has also announced that it will ban the carriage of toner and ink cartridges on all USbound passenger aircraft, in both carry-on and checked baggage.

This move follows the discovery of bombs disguised in toner cartridges on several cargo flights late last month.

PNG travel advisory

THE Department of Foreign Affairs & Trade has today advised of a restriction on all cross-border travel under the free-movement provisions of the Torres Strait Treaty in Papua New Guinea's Western Province, due to an outbreak of cholera in Daru.

The travel restrictions will be in place until further notice, the govt's Smartraveller site says.
