Agent-friendly Virgin move

VIRGIN Australia says moving to a full GDS operation (TD breaking news) is a key part of "positioning the organisation to operate as an integrated airline, serving multiple market segments both domestically and internationally".

Yesterday the group announced it would transition to fully ticketed operations by introducing the SabreSonic Customer Sales and Service system.

Virgin said the Sabre platform would deliver a "complete endto-end business solution" including sales distribution and merchandising, guest recognition, e-commerce, inventory and revenue management, as well as check-in and departure control.

Virgin said it expects to have fully migrated to Sabre by Mar 2013 from its current platforms which include the Navitaire Open

Skies system along with Amadeus which is used by V Australia.

AFTA ceo Jayson Westbury hailed the move, saving providing inventory via GDS "will provide greater efficiencies in the agency booking process.

"It has been one of the missing links that has been needed in order for the business processes to be more seamless and in line with industry standards, this is great news for travel agents, the travel industry, consumers and of course Virgin Australia," he said.

MEANWHILE speaking at the Virgin Australia agm yesterday, ceo John Borghetti also revealed an expansion of cabin crew, with 250 extra roles mostly based in NSW, bringing total additions this year to around 400.

He said Virgin was developing a new cadet pilot training program to be launched next year.

The carrier is also set to be operating its domestic and international businesses under the Virgin Australia name by the end of next month, Borghetti confirmed, with other plans incl a revamp of international aircraft.

QATAR Airways is planning to boost its new Perth-Doha flights (*TD* 17 Nov) to a daily operation. Initially launching three times per week using an A330-200 effective 03 Jul 2012, GDS displays now show the route increasing to daily B777-200LR flights from 27 Oct next year.

Rex expecting profit

REGIONAL Express chairman John Sharp told the carrier's shareholders yesterday that it expects all of its subsidiaries to be profitable this financial year.

Speaking at the Rex AGM, he said the company was currently unable to provide profit guidance "in light of a highly volatile financial/economic environment, FX exchange rate and fuel price".

Delta drops routes

DELTA Air Lines has announced the suspension of a number of routes from its main Atlanta hub, including flights to Tel Aviv, Athens, Copenhagen, Prague and Shanghai - all destinations served from other Delta ports.

Viva! Holidays adds JAL

THE ever-expanding range of airlines offered in conjuction with Viva! Holidays land product has grown again, with the JTG Wholesale brand this week announcing the addition of Japan Airlines packages.

JAL wholesale fares with Viva! are now on sale, with 4% commission applicable on air and 10% on land booked via easyway or 8% via the contact centre.

New QF A₃80 layout

QANTAS' reconfigured Airbus A380 aircraft being rolled out mid next year will feature 484 seats, comprised of 16 in First class, 64 in Business, 35 in Premium Economy and 371 in Economy.

It's understood that 30 Econony seats will be positioned on the upper deck, behind the Premium Economy cabin of the newer versions of the QF superjumbos.

The new design features eight less Business class seats than the current 450 seat QF A380 deckplan, but two additional seats in First, three more in Premium Economy and an extra 39 seats in Economy.

Japan is the only destination available for sale with Japan Airlines, and JAL and Qantas flights cannot be combined in the same Viva! Holidays package.

Revenue for Japan Airlines bookings also counts towards the Global Achievers program.

JAL joins other Viva! carriers including Aircalin, Air Canada, Air NZ, Air Tahiti Nui, Air Vanuatu, Cathay Pacific, China Southern, Emirates, Etihad, Garuda, Hawaiian, Malaysia, Pacific Blue, Philippine Airlines, Polynesian Blue, Royal Brunei, Air Australia, Singapore Airlines, Thai, United, Vietnam & the Virgin Australia group.

EU bans body scans

THE European Union has banned X-ray security scanners at airports because of concerns linking them to cancer.


A European Commission statement issued overnight said that "in order not to risk jeopardising citizens' health and safety, only security scanners which do not use X-ray technology are added to the list of authorised methods for passenger screening at EU airports".

The systems banned are the same ones used across the USA by the Transportation Security Administration, which the TSA claims generate less radiation than experienced during a flight.

Thomas Cook travails

BRITISH travel giant Thomas Cook is expected to announce a major loss at its annual results announcement in the UK this week, with its share price plummeting 75% overnight after confirmation it was seeking £100m in finance to tide it over.

Acting ceo Sam Weihagen moved to reassure travellers, saying it was business as usual and that the company's board was "confident that we will survive".

Contiki Asia set to soar

contiki Tours has more than tripled the number of departures on some tours in its 2012/13 Asia program, with the capacity boost following a very strong performance this season.

"We can't keep up with demand," md Fiona Hunt told *TD* yesterday,

with huge growth particularly in the *Thai Island Hopper* tour as well as the *Big Indochina Adventure*.

The new program features seven tours in Vietnam, Thailand, Cambodia, Laos and China, and Hunt said the demand shows there has clearly been a gap in the market for 18-35 year olds travelling to Asia and wanting to enjoy Contiki's "social experience" as part of their holiday.

"As this new season launches and progresses, we will continue to monitor capacity and add even more departures should demand dictate," she said.

Hunt said the 2012/13 Asia program also offers the ability to



give back to local communities as travellers pass through, such as visiting a centre that helps victims of Lao's civil war, or eating at restaurants that provide training and employment for locals.

Contiki is trading strongly, with the earlybird season driving its strongest Europe demand for several years, Hunt added.

The tour operator's South America season is completely sold out on all current departures, while USA sales are up 25% on last year too.

US flights choc-a-bloc

VIRGIN Australia operated the fullest non-stop flights between Australia and mainland USA for the year ended Jun 2011, latest government data has revealed.

V Australia had seat capacity levels of 89.8% outbound over the 12 months, which was followed by Delta Air Lines at 88.4%, United at 86.7% and then Qantas at 86%.

However, with 2,391 US flights, QF flew about 68% more services to the US then it's nearest rival, UA.

China Darwin charters


