





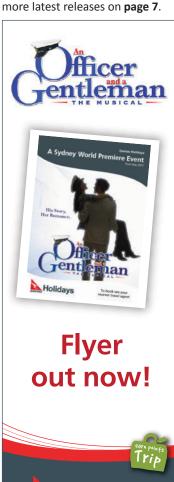

# Qantas flags profit dive

**QANTAS** expects its first half profit this year to more than halve, from \$417m last year to between \$140m-\$190m for the six months to 31 Dec (*TD* breaking news).

CEO Alan Joyce said the updated figure showed the resilience of the group's business model, with the airline still making a significant profit despite major challenges during the half.

He said fuel cost increases and industrial action had a total impact of more than \$650m, including \$68m for strike action before the fleet grounding; a \$70m cost of the three day grounding including lost revenue, refunds and accommodation; a \$27m impact on forward bookings of the union campaigns; and \$29m in "customer recovery initiatives".

He said that the Fair Work Australia termination of industrial action had seen a strong recovery in domestic bookings which are "now back to normal levels".

And international bookings were also coming back, with forward bookings for the second half of the financial year "now in line with normal trends".

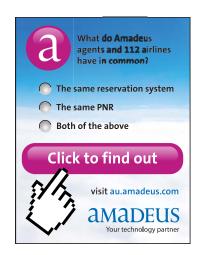

**MEANWHILE** Qantas is also set to ditch its controversial plan for an Asia-based premium offshoot, according to a front page story in today's *Financial Review*.

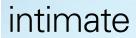
According to the report, the latest option favoured by QF executives is a lower risk alliance with Malaysia Airlines which would see the development of Kuala Lumpur as a key hub.

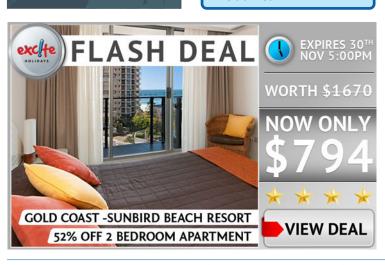

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# **UK entry delays**

THE Dept of Foreign Affairs & Trade is advising passengers flying into the UK on 30 Nov to contact their travel agent or airline for the latest info on flight details due to strike action being held by the United Kingdom Border Agency.

The organisation is planning to strike from 23:59 on Tue 29 Nov to 23:59 on Wed 30 Nov.

Around 18,000 passport and immigration staff are walking off the job, protesting changes made to their pensions.

The agency says it's aiming to keep disruptions to a minimum, but delays are expected.

Inbound pax are being advised to assist with processing by having all travel documents, including passports, available and taken out of any wallets; utilising automatic e-Passport gates where offered; having landing cards completed and ready; and staying in family groups - ukba.homeoffice.gov.uk.

**MEANWHILE** Cathay Pacific is one of several airlines urging passengers booked to fly into LHR on 30 Nov to "postpone their travel" due to the walkout which CX warns is likely to see long delays and possible diversions.

# Mining benefits tourism

A NEW report from Tourism Research Australia released on Fri highlights the significant impact that the mining boom is having on the Australian tourism industry.

Queensland and Western Australia have been the main beneficiaries, with both states the only ones to experience annual average growth in business visitor nights between 2000 and 2010.

In fact, last year a whopping 23% of domestic business nights in Australia was accounted for by people who took an overnight trip to their usual place of work i.e. fly-in fly-out mining workers.

Tourism minister Martin Ferguson said the report showed that resources demand is boosting business travel "to the benefit of aviation, food services and accommodation providers."

However he warned that the commodities boom was also creating pressures in terms of labour and "potential crowding out of traditional leisure markets.

"There is no doubt that many leisure tourism businesses are struggling from the effects of a strong Australian dollar and staff shortages, especially in mining regions," Ferguson said.

However the report also shows that there are opportunities for growth, with some operators thriving by catering for business travellers, fly-in fly-out workers and the "growing number of visitors from China and other emerging markets".

Ferguson cited cooperation between mining companies and Indigenous communities as a vital factor in addressing labour shortages "and potentially leading to the creation of more long term sustainable Indigenous tourism experiences and economic opportunities in regional areas".

A second phase of the research, with more detailed economic modelling, will be released early next year, he said.

#### NZ looks afield

AIR New Zealand is set to explore new markets in Asia as well as North and South America. according to details released at an "investor day" presentation on Fri.

The carrier is currently doing a review of its underperforming long-haul operations, with group gm international Christopher Luxon confirming moves to grow its network in China as well as on the Pacific Rim.

Recovery in the Japanese market is also a key focus, while profit growth is forecast to come from ancillary revenue as well as the introduction of the Boeing 787.

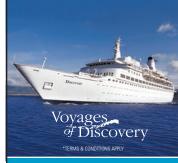

**EFFECTIVE** 01 Dec, Emirates will close its check-in counters for flights departing from Terminal 3 at Dubai Int'l Airport 1 hour prior to a flight's scheduled departure.

Passengers are being advised that they should arrive at checkin counters no later than 90mins prior to departure, and be at the gate at least 35mins prior.

Those using the online check-in service with checked baggage will also be required to have their bags dropped 90mins prior.

The airline says it will also shut gates 15 mins before the departure time on flights.

The aim of the time change is to "ensure greater efficiency and on-time departures" and to benefit customers who do arrive on time.

**CHINA** Southern Airlines has flagged significant growth in Australia, with the launch of a local recruitment drive attracting more than 400 applications in its first week.

An advertisement by aviation personnel provider Altara Resources says the airline is seeking "dynamic, motivated, patient, good communicators" to become China Southern international cabin crew operating from its Sydney base.

"Additional bases will be opening in 2012," according to the recruitment firm's website, with applicants sought who are fluent in English, and who are Australian citizens or permanent residents.

CZ gm Australia/NZ, Henry He, said the addition of Australian flight attendants aimed to add "typical Aussie character" to the airline's traditional Cantonese inflight experience.

A statement from the carrier also confirmed that the recruitment drive would be extended to Brisbane, Melbourne and Perth in the new year.

# QF pax numbers drop

QANTAS group passenger numbers in Oct fell 1.8% year on year, with the airline's traffic hit by industrial action and the fleet grounding at the end of the month.

The figures confirm the heavy toll the industrial action was having on the carrier, with mainline domestic passenger numbers 11.3% lower than the previous year, down to 1.41m.

And QantasLink held the line, with 448,000 passengers, up 0.5% on Oct 2010.

Jetstar domestic grew 7.9% to 915,000 passengers for the month, while Jetstar international was up 11.1% to 393,000 and Jetstar Asia carried 255,000 pax, up 7.1%.

QF international passenger numbers dipped 3.6% to 507,000 and the overall revenue seat factor was 81.4%, down 1.1 pts.

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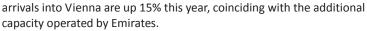


# Vienna comes to Sydney

# **GA** pregnancy rules

**GARUDA** Indonesia has issued new conditions of carriage for expectant mothers, with pax accepted for travel without restrictions up to 31 weeks of gestation in a normal pregnancy.

With complicated pregnancies, or between 32 and 36 weeks approval from the airline's medical clearance department is required, and in all cases "the health and condition of the passenger on the day of departure may influence acceptance for carriage, subject to the discretion of Garuda Indonesia staff.

Travellers who are at more than 36 weeks of gestation will not be accepted for travel, according to the updated policy.

# **AUH pax numbers up**

**ABU** Dhabi Airports Company is forcasting double digit growth in passenger numbers over the next few years due to Etihad Airways and Abu Dhabi's 2030 vision of developing the emirate into a business and tourist centre.

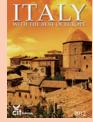

# iPhone cooks itself on Rex flight
