## **Business class fares plummet**

**THE** advent of Virgin Australia's new domestic business class has seen a steep decline in fares, which have dropped in recent months to their lowest levels since 1996.

The latest Domestic Air Fare Index released by the Dept of Transport reveals that in Dec

2011 overall business class fares "fell substantially mainly due to reductions in many of these fares by Qantas," and the index "again dropped significantly in January 2012 as Virgin Australia introduced

Business class fares on many more of their routes."

Fares are now sitting at around 80% of the Jul 2003 base level



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## Govt backs green fuel study

**FEDERAL** tourism minister Martin Ferguson today confirmed the government would support a Qantas feasibility study into the potential for an Australian sustainable fuel industry.

The move was announced today just before the departure of QF1121 from Sydney to Adelaide - Australia's first commercial flight powered by fuel derived from recycled cooking oil.

Qantas ceo Alan Joyce said "today is a historic occasion in Australian aviation.

"Alternatives to conventional jet fuel are vital to the aviation industry meeting ambitious targets for carbon-neutral growth and emissions reduction," he said.

The CSIRO has estimated that the sustainable fuel sector could generate up to 12,000 jobs over the next 20 years.

"Australia has the skills, resources and infrastructure to take a lead...but there are also significant challenges, which is why we need to establish a clear plan," Joyce added.

Ferguson confirmed that funding for the study, to

commence in May, would be allocated under the Emerging Renewables Program, while oil company Shell will provide technical support.

Jovce also confirmed that Jetstar flights JQ705/706 between Melbourne and Hobart on 19 Apr will be powered by the SkyNRG test fuel, which is a 50:50 blend of biofuel and conventional jet fuel certified for commercial use.

#### Rhapsody sails out

ROYAL Caribbean's Rhapsody of the Seas will depart from Sydney today, marking the end of the company's biggest ever Australian cruise season.

Together, Radiance of the Seas, Rhapsody of the Seas and Celebrity Century carried more than 90,000 passengers - an increase of over 65% on 2010/11.

A total of 44 cruises operated in Australasian waters, with more than 50 ports visited.

Marketing manager Adam Armstrong said anticipation was now building to next season, with bookings already "buoyant".

#### **EK OK with CHC cuts**

**EMIRATES** has told the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission that the carrier has "no objection" to the proposed capacity cuts on the Tasman route to Christchurch requested by Air NZ and Virgin Australia (TD yesterday).

#### 1200 bmi jobs to go

**BRITISH** Airways has revealed that the takeover of bmi by its parent company, IAG, is set to lead to as many as 1200 staff redundancies.

The deal was approved by the European Commission last week, and consultations with unions over the deal predict that jobs will be lost at the bmi head office as well as in regional airports.

However, BA said that without the takeover, the loss-making bmi would be forced to shed as many as 2700 positions.

BA ceo Keith Williams said bmi "is not a viable business as it stands today.

"As we look to restructure the business and restore profitability, job losses are deeply regrettable but inevitable," he added.

Twitter users can use hash-tag account #TitanicMMA and from 12:55pm AEST on Sun will start seeing rebroadcasts of the original communications made from the stricken vessel, beginning with eight iceberg warnings through to the final crew evacuation.
