BA to interline with CZ CHINA Southern Airlines has

signed a new interline agreement with British Airways.

The move is understood to involve significant cooperation between the carriers, covering 33 destinations across the UK and Europe with connections via CZ's London Heathrow flights which launched in Jun this year.

China Southern gm Si Xianmin has also pledged to further develop the airline's 'Canton Route' which connects its Australian flights to Europe via Guangzhou.

Speaking at a conference in China this week, Si said the city is an "ideal transit hub" between Europe and Australia, with the initiative showing good success.

New Georgia route

FLYGEORGIA, a startup carrier in the eastern European nation of Georgia, has announced the debut of direct flights between Dubai and its capital Tbilisi.

ROYAL Caribbean this morning announced a firm order for a third Oasis-class vessel, with the 5400-passenger ship set to join the mammoth Oasis of the Seas and Allure of the Seas in 2016.

The move was flagged in Oct, with extended negotiations since then seeing the vessel

constructed by STX in France. Royal Caribbean Cruises Limited ceo Richard Fain said that Oasis and Allure had "fundamentally transformed the cruise experience for our guests.

"These ships have consistently generated outstanding guest satisfaction ratings and continue to produce superior financial results," he said.

The newbuild contract includes a one-year option for a fourth Oasis-class vessel which. if confirmed, would be delivered in the middle of 2018.

Interestingly, the deal also includes the transfer of the Atlantic Star cruise ship, operated by Spanish cruise line Pullmantur,

Shrinking Gulf Air

GULF Air has flagged further service reductions from next month, including reduced frequencies from Bahrain to Bangkok, Frankfurt, Manila, Paris, Chennai, Colombo, Dhaka, Kathmandu and Khartoum. The carrier is also suspending flights to Copenhagen, Rome, Aden, Erbil and Kabul.

Atlantic Star is well known to the Australian market, having previously sailed under the P&O Cruises banner as Pacific Sky between 2000 and 2006 including the infamous Diane Brimble onboard death in 2005.

Oasis of the Seas debuted in Nov 2009 with a range of industry firsts including a massive 'Central Park' in the centre of the ship which enabled the creation of inward-looking balcony cabins.

It also offers an aquatic amphitheatre, scores of restaurants, an onboard zip-line and ice skating rink and two FlowRider surf simulators.

A statement from Roval Caribbean today said that its annualised compound capacity growth rate remains at a "historically low" 3.5% between 2012 and 2016.

Strong year for Hawaii

THE Hawaii Tourism Authority says it's expecting a recordbreaking full year result for 2012, with visitor expenditure surging almost 20% for the year to 30 Nov to a total of \$12.9 billion and expectations of almost 7.9 arrivals.

The \$2.1 billion increase means that visitors spent on average \$193 each per day over the 11 month period, with HTA ceo Mike McCartney saying that was a hefty \$16 increase on last year.

"The HTA's continual efforts to increase airlift and distribution throughout the state have led to incremental growth in visitor arrivals and expenditures across the four major islands," he said.

McCartney said the organisation is continuing to be optimistic looking forward, with the greatest potential coming from international markets including Asia and Oceania "as a result of numerous new flights and increases in flight frequency in 2012, with more expected in 2013".

IATA's NDC revealed

THE International Air Transport Association is planning a 2013 roadshow to provide further information on its controversial 'New Distribution Capability' (TD 17 Oct), with IATA's Director -Passenger Eric Leopold saying it will "help close the gap between the merchandising offers available on airline websites and the offers that travel agents are able to book."

In an interview with US website Travel Market Report Leopold downplayed suggestions that NDC would replace current GDS offerings, but would instead define a standard Application Program Interface (API) which will enable standardised development of new distribution solutions.

"With an open API, anyone can use it to develop applications, as opposed to today's GDS, which are proprietary solutions," he said.

But "NDC is not a GDS bypass and is not a travel agent bypass...it gives GDS and travel agents the ability to access the same product offers when airlines sell their products directly to consumers via their websites".

The report says IATA is aiming for NDC to make it easier for airlines to sell diverse products, as well as developing standards to allow airlines to connect with distributors without "reinventing the wheel for every connection".

US flights disrupted

A MASSIVE winter storm has caused flight chaos across the north-eastern USA this week, affecting the Christmas travel plans of thousands of passengers.

About 30cm of snow fell on parts of the continent, with northern New England and New York the worst affected areas.

1500 domestic services were cancelled on Boxing Day.

Portuguese airport portfolio sold

THE government of Portugal has announced the acquisition of ANA, which runs the country's ten key airports, by a French firm called Vinci Concessions.

The deal includes the rights to run the airports in Lisbon, Porto, Faro and Beja on the mainland as well as six facilities in the Azores and Madeira for 50 years, including managing airport facilities, commercial activities, ground handling services, safety and security and passenger assistance operations.

The move will boost Vinci's portfolio to 23 airports managed in Portugal, France and Cambodia handling around 40 million passengers every year.

The Lisbon hub is claimed to have a major advantage due to its strategic position in relation to high growth destinations such as Brazil and Portuguese-speaking African countries including Angola and Mozambique.

Vinci Airports will have annual revenue of more than €600m.

QR expands Thailand

QATAR Airways is set to boost its presence in Thailand with the addition of a fourth daily direct flight between Doha and Bangkok.

The additional service will commence 20 Feb, with the carrier continuing to deploy its 777 aircraft on the route.

"Our strategy has always been to serve popular routes with multi-frequency flights, and Bangkok is an example," said QR ceo Akbar al-Baker.

The addition of more aircraft to the Qatar Airways fleet will see even more expansion in the coming months, with the carrier set to launch new destinations including Gassim in Saudi Arabia on 07 Jan; Najaf in Iran on 23 Jan; flights to Phnom Penh in Cambodia on 20 Feb; Chengdu in China on 19 Mar; Chicago in the USA on 10 Apr; and Salalah in Oman on 22 May.





Emirates aces ATP tennis

EMIRATES today expanded its program of sports sponsorship with a new global partnership which will see it become the Official Airline of the Association of Tennis Professionals World Tour.

EK will also become the new title sponsor of the ATP rankings effective from 01 January, with the five year deal giving the carrier an on-site presence at tournaments across the season.

Emirates is already involved in tennis as the sponsor of a range of events including the Emirates Airline US Open Series.

The company launched just last year and is expanding following strong demand for its product.

Alaskan Dream Cruises was started by the Allen family, who are members of Alaska's Tlingit Kaagwaantaan Clan.

BANGOK Airways has announced the addition of two new routes, including the resumption of flights between Bangkok and Krabi from 31 Mar.

It's nearly five years since PG flew to Krabi, with the new plans indicating double daily A320 flights on the route.

PG will also expand its operations in Myanmar with the launch of a new four times weekly flight between Bangkok and Mandalay effective 16 Sep.

Bangkok Airways will be the third foreign carrier to operate flights to Myanmar, which is the country's second biggest city.



Kingfisher not flying

INDIAN carrier and **one**world member-elect Kingfisher Airlines remains grounded, after its owners failed to present Indian regulators with a viable funding plan for its recovery.

The carrier earlier this week presented a proposal to the Directorate General of Civil Aviation to resume limited service but aviation minister Ajit Singh said the plan was not satisfactory because of significant debts.

He said the airline owed money to staff, airports and banks as well as outstanding tax bills, with all stakeholders needing to be on board before the carrier is allowed to fly again.

Etihad has been mooted as a potential investor in the beleaguered airline which has been trying to raise additional funding for over a year.

Last week the India Times reported on talks by Etihad to take a stake in either Kingfisher or Jet Airways, after recent changes allowed foreign carriers to invest in the Indian aviation sector.
