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Virgin Nov traffic climbs

VIRGIN Australia domestic traffic surged 5% in Nov, as the carrier benefited from passengers switching away from the strikeplagued Qantas and the subsequent grounding of the QF fleet at the end of Oct.

According to figures released by the Virgin, domestic capacity also grew 4.8% over the same period giving an overall revenue load factor of 81.3%, up 0.2 points.

The Virgin Australia statistics for international traffic also now include the contribution of its

new revenue-sharing arrangements with Air NZ and Delta Air Lines, with this change reflected in a 2.3 point drop for revenue load factor to 75.8% on international routes.

During the month Virgin Australia carried 203,893 international pax, up 5.1%, with the carrier's int'l capacity up 13.5% on Nov 2010.

MEANWHILE IATA has sounded a warning bell about international passenger demand, with its global figures for Nov showing a 0.5% month on month decline compared to Oct.

Although Nov passenger traffic was up 4.3% overall, IATA said this was skewed because Nov 2010 was "a particularly weak month".

IATA ceo Tony Tyler said weak global economies were being reflected in air transport, with freight carriage also down and passenger load factors dropping two points to 76.3%.

A nice New Year bonus

QANTAS ceo Alan Joyce had lots to celebrate over the New Year weekend, after receiving almost \$600.000 worth of shares in the carrier on 30 Dec.

According to a stock exchange update, Joyce was granted 375,014 shares valued at \$1.58 each under his 2010/11 Short Term Incentive Plan (STIP).

The STIP is an annual program for Qantas executives, giving them a contractual right to receive shares based on individual and Qantas Group performance measures at the discretion of the company's board.

The boost brings Joyce's shareholding in the carrier to 721,255 direct shares and 2.1 million held indirectly, with the total worth about \$4.5 million.

TA Syd NYE video

TOURISM Australia has made the most of Sydney's iconic annual fireworks display, creating an instant short film using footage downloaded by revellers in the NSW capital during last Sat night's celebrations.

The videos were created using the City of Sydney's NYE iPhone App along with the official broadcast of the fireworks, and released just a few hours after midnight meaning it was online via social media before many other parts of the world reached the New Year.

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Voyager Zuno mobile

VOYAGER Travel Corporation has released a new version of its 'Zuno' business intelligence solution, including a mobile app which allows clients to access timely management information via smart phones or tablets.

The proprietary system delivers "critical analysis online and in real-time," with customisable reports and dashboards, email alerts when KPI targets are not achieved and the ability to quickly detect non-compliant travel.

Voyager ceo Richard Savva said the company's online, front, mid and back end software is a single system "and we are the only TMC in Australia set up this way.

"This means we are able to feed the most current travel data overnight into Zuno so our clients have the most up-to-date information at their fingertips".



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Top-level MH restructure

THERE are set to be some major changes at Qantas' prospective **one**world partner Malaysia Airlines, which has announced a new organisational structure to "rally its staff" and steer the airline into a new era.

The move will see the departure of several top executives, including the heads of Commercial Strategy, MASkargo, MAS Aerospace Engineering and Revenue Management.

CEO Ahmad Jauhari, whose direct reports include Customer Experience, Operations, Human Capital plus Network, Alliance, Strategy & Planning also takes on the role of ceo of Long-Haul for the carrier, while deputy group ceo Mohammed Rashdan will be in charge of short-haul, group finance, aircraft finance and management and the group's Commercial operations.

Several key new appointments have been made under the changes, including former Etihad head of pricing Shihaj Kutty who will lead MH's Revenue Management division.

2011 Brisbane record

BRISBANE Airport says it's expecting final figures for Dec to confirm a 3.4% increase in passenger numbers during 2011, to a grand total of 20.4 million.

CEO Julieanne Alroe said the record figure "demonstrates the importance of air travel in this day and age and the resilience of the industry as a whole to withstand and bounce back from unexpected events," she said.

MK boosts Shanghai

AIR Mauritius is set to more than double capacity to Shanghai in China, with the current weekly A330 flight via Kuala Lumpur to operate nonstop using an A340 from 26 Mar this year.

The move will see MK offer 31,200 annual seats ex Shanghai.

And Dr Hugh Dunleavy is MH's new head of Network, Alliance, Strategy & Planning, with his extensive career including senior roles at WestJet, Lufthansa, Air Canada and the Star Alliance.

Dunleavy's newly created division "will support the effective implementation of the Group's network to meet the dynamic needs of the market and to leverage on strategic alliances and partnerships with other airlines," according to a statement from Malaysia Airlines.

Jauhari said the changes would "enhance the group's reputation and significance for its eventual entry into the oneworld alliance by the end of 2012".

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JQ guarantee expiry?

IT'S probably just a New Year's website glitch, but a number of consumers on Twitter are pointing out that Jetstar's 'Price Beat Guarantee' for both flights and holiday bookings has expired.

The fine print of the terms and conditions for the guarantee specifies that the promotion is "valid for flight bookings made to 31st December 2011".

New DXB app

DUBAI Airports has released a new mobile application, with the aim of making it easier for passengers to navigate one of the world's biggest and busiest airports "and to ultimately influence behaviour and spend".

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Sun City to Sri Lanka

SOUTH African hospitality and gaming firm Sun City is set to spend US\$800m on a major new tourism project in Sri Lanka.

The move was announced by Nalaka Godahewa, head of Sri Lanka's national Tourism Board, who said it would be the biggest ever investment in the country's leisure sector.

He said the project would involve a 200-acre property in the planned coastal resort town of Katana, located close to Colombo.

Katana will feature four five star hotels as well as a major new convention and shopping centre.

The cessation of hostilities in Sri Lanka's 25 year civil war in 2009 has seen tourist arrivals surge, with visitor numbers up 25% to 820,000 during 2011.

Intrepid afloat

INTREPID Travel has announced the 2012 debut of sailing trips, with small group voyages in Croatia, Greece and Thailand to launch this year.

The company said that by creating a "streamlined, easy-tobook product" it's opening up the world of small group sailing for people wanting to experience the destinations from sea level with a trusted operator.

Jetstar Pac payments

QANTAS' Vietnamese offshoot Jetstar Pacific has introduced new technology which allows it to accept mobile payments for fares.

According to the *Saigon Times*, the system is a partnership between the carrier, an online payment gateway called OnePay and Vietnamese mobile network operator Vinaphone.

Travellers sign up for a MoMo "electronic wallet" provided by payment company m-Service which is linked to a bank account.

When booking they can select MoMo as a payment method, with their device receiving a code which authorises the transfer of funds.

Expedia review move

EXPEDIA has begun promoting new "verified" hotel reviews, aiming to counter perceptions that online hotel ratings are sometimes not accurate.

Writers of Expedia Verified Reviews must have made a booking for the hotel via Expedia.

The move comes just days after the firm spun off sister review site Tripadvisor in a public float.

Maldives spas shut

THE government of the Maldives has ordered the immediate closure of all spas and massage facilities across the country, with the decree believed to including those catering to foreign tourists staying in the nation's luxury resorts.

According to a statement from the president's office, the move follows "an opposition-led religious protest last week calling for their closure".

Protesters are upset at what they call "anti-Islamic activities" and are also urging that the sale of alcohol cease in the Maldives.

Sunni Islam is the country's official religion, according to *Associated Press*, and opposition parties claim that the government is allowing the compromise of Islamic principles.



THE obesity crisis is clearly impacting America's ranch holiday sector, with a number of horseriding operators in the Northern Rockies adding superlarge saddles and stronger horses to cope with growing numbers of overweight clients.

According to USA Today, guest ranges are boosting their outsized riding stock with special draft horse cross-breeds, while outfitters are citing increasing demand for equipment to handle big butts.

Teton Horseback Adventures in Jackson Hole, Wyoming, has set a 125kg weight limit for trail rides to help prevent injury to horses, while other operators are now offering 22-inch saddles which were "unheard of" a few years ago.

CHRISTIANITY is cool - and is very cool indeed if you go to a new church which has just opened in eastern Germany.

The sacred structure in Mitterfirmiansreut near the Czech Republic has been built entirely of ice and snow - just like the ice hotels which are built each winter in northern Europe and Canada.

The German structure has been created this year to commemorate 100 years since locals built their first snow church in 1911, which was part of a protest because they didn't have a local house of worship.

CABIN crew at Filipino carrier Cebu Pacific have updated their popular Lady Gaga safety demonstration routine for the festive season, this time adapting it to Mariah Carey's *All I Want for Christmas*.

The carrier said that as well as being entertaining, the dance improves safety because it encourages passengers to watch the demo.
