

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Quarantine set for update

A REVIEW of Australia's biosecurity legislation is set to simplify requirements for airlines and cruise operators, as well as help the country meet its international health obligations.

A consultation paper prepared by PwC details the proposed changes and is seeking feedback from the industry.

Among other changes, the proposals would see extremely ill passengers barred from travel on outbound flights or cruise ships - but this would only apply to

A new ship sanitation scheme will make it much easier for cruise operators, because ships holding a valid sanitation certificate will not require further inspection upon arrival.


The validity of ship sanitation certificates issued overseas would be recognised under the move.

Another significant change would remove the requirement for an import permit for human remains - apart from deaths in transit which will still be managed by state police and the Coroner.

The Health Dept said about 500 bodies are repatriated to Australia each year, and the change would reduce the emotional toll on those who have recently suffered the death of a family member.

The final legislation is expected to be voted on sometime this year.

BELGIAN tourism officials are considering taking legal action against a private weather bureau who predicted a long-term rainy summer, leading to a string of hotel & restaurant cancellations.

Officials say private weather firm Meteo Belgique predicted only five days above 25 degrees in Jul and a rainy first half of Aug and that was "bad for business".

An official told Reuters "Those predictions are unscientific".

"They predicted the first two weeks in August to be bad and we get cancellations immediately," Daniel Despiegelaere, head of tourism in the upmarket seaside town of Knokke-Heist said.

One-third of Belgium's US\$3.5b annual tourist revenues are generated in July and August.

Domestic air traffic flat in 2012

GOVERNMENT data released today shows Australian domestic passenger traffic rose fractionally in May compared to 12-months ago, up 1.6% to 4.53 million.

According to the Bureau of Infrastructure, Transport and Regional Economics report on Domestic Airline Activity, year-todate pax movements for 2012 are down 0.2% to 54.73 million - put down to the "removal and slow build up" of Tiger Airways flights since its grounding in Jul 2011.

Revenue Passenger Kilometres increased 1.7% to 5.25 billion in May, while capacity surged 1.9% to 6.88 billion Available Seat Kilometres.

Domestic aircraft trip numbers rose by more than 800 during the month, to 52,797.

The Melbourne-Sydney route continued to be the country's busiest sector, transporting more than 650,600 pax (up 0.9% on last year), followed by Brisbane-Sydney

with 348,900 movements (down 4%) and Brisbane-Melbourne with 252,300 pax (down 0.2%).

The greatest percentage increase in passenger numbers was found on sectors to resource hubs, with the Newman-Perth city pairing seeing a 54% spike, then Perth-Port Hedland (+49.1%) and Brisbane-Gladstone (+39.5%).

Routes suffering the largest dip in traffic included Melbourne-Sunshine Coast (-30.6%), Adelaide-Melbourne (-11%) and Darwin-Melbourne (-9.3%).

Sydney remained the busiest domestic airport with 1.98 million passenger movements, followed by Melbourne with 1.76 million.

Europe services showed the biggest growth, posting a 6.5% improvement to Jun last year.

This was closely followed by Australia and the South-West Pacific region, up 6.4%.

Silkair also saw sizeable capacity increases from new routes, which tempered MI pax carriage figures.


