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The new policy took effect late last week and currently applies to all new bookings.

New guidelines have been introduced to ensure a passenger is not deliberately booking flights with longer connection times in Dubai purely to take advantage of the complimentary stopover offer.

The Dubai-based carrier has amended its reservations system, allowing it to now calculate STPC eligibility at the time a booking is made, based on seat availability on the best connecting flights, not simply the flights of the passengers' choosing.

Flyers originating their journey from Australia or New Zealand with a wait time in Dubai of more than 8-hrs for Economy, 6-hrs for Business Class and above, and less than 24 hours will still be offered the stopover accom free.

Different conditions can also apply to bookings originating from other parts of the world.

# Qantas to fly biofuel flight

**QANTAS** will next month operate Australia's first commercial flight powered by sustainable aviation fuel.

The Sydney-Adelaide return service will take place on 13 Apr using an Airbus A330 powered by a biofuel derived from used cooking oil, split 50/50 with conventional jet fuel.

The fuel is produced by SkyNRG and has been fully certified for use in commercial aviation - as well as being endorsed by the World Wildlife Fund.

"With high fuel costs and carbon pricing affecting airlines around the world, the Qantas Group is taking the lead in advocating the development of a sustainable aviation fuel industry in Australia," the carrier said.

The 'life cycle' carbon footprint of the biofuel is about 60% smaller than that of conventional aviation fuel.

QF Head of Environment, John Valastro, said the green sectors aimed to raise awareness of the potential for sustainable aviation fuel in Australia.

He said operating the Australian

aviation industry on sustainable fuel was possible, but not until the product was produced at a commercial scale and at a competitive price.

"No single player can make this happen, it needs support from government, private sector investment, access to infrastructure and market demand," he said.


QF1121 will depart Sydney at 10.20am on 13 Apr, returning as QF1120 ex ADL at 1.35pm.

**SKYWEST** Airlines has confirmed the recent completion of a flight test program as the launch customer for the Global Navigation Satellite System in the Fokker F100 aircraft type.

GNSS will give the airline "improved landing capability into airports with limited systems" by utilising satellite navigation.

The airline is also the first Australian Fokker operator to have the ADSB system (Automatic Dependent Surveillance Broadcast) fitted to its F100s.

ADSB has been mandated by CASA for all aircraft operating above 29,000 feet effective from 12 Dec this year.

## Travolta shakin' in Santiago

ACTOR John Travolta says the 7.8 earthquake that struck Chile (*TD* yesterday) was no big deal, at least not for him.

The Qantas Ambassadorat-large flew his Boeing 707 jet into Santiago three days ago to be on-hand for the arrival of the Qantas inaugural from Sydney to the Chilean capital that touched down on time after a 13hr flight.

He told a packed conference at Santiago's Hyatt Hotel that he was having lunch at a local winery when the quake hit.

"I wasn't scared, having lived in LA, you get used to these things and it was really nothing to worry about", he said.

Pax on the flight were told of the quake mid-flight by the pilot -Capt Rob Meek - who came over the PA to assure them there was no damage to the airport and it was safe to land.

The pax quickly forgot about the drama when they deplaned to be met in person by Travolta in his pilots uniform (above).

He greeted each with a big smile and a "Hi there, how was your flight" and a handshake to boot.

Travolta, who has been associated with Qantas for 10 years and holds a Qantas 747 pilots licence, says he has influenced the airline in many business decisions.

#### Abu Dhabi visits rising

ABU Dhabi Tourism & Culture
Authority has reported a 5% year-on-year rise in the number of
guests staying in hotels and hotel
apartments during Feb, as well as
a 5% spike in guest numbers
which were up to 184,296.

"I recommended they fly to Dallas and guess what, that's been a stunning success, and I had a hand in them coming to Chile and I've no doubt that'll also be a success".

Wally Marinari, QF vp - the Americas agreed, saying it's been an "amazing start to the service.

"We came in full and the return leg to Sydney had only one spare seat. There's tremendous interest in Australia for South America and it's our intention to build to a daily service in the near future," Marinari said.

#### Full MK loads in Dec

AIR Mauritius achieved a 100% seat factor on its 10 flights from Australia to Mauritius in Dec, latest govt data shows.

The BITRE International Airline Activity report shows MK filled all but one of 2,888 outbound seats during the month.

Last month Air Mauritius announced it would cease its Sydney and Melbourne services at the end of May 2012.

Neighbouring carrier Air Austral, which operates to Reunion had seat factors of just 25%, the figures reveal.

#### **AFTA UPDATE**

The latest insights from AFTA's Chief Executive, Jayson Westbury

**THE** Queensland Election has demonstrated just how harsh an electorate can be when it is not happy.

The numbers at the time of doing this column in terms of the result were:- LNP 78, ALP 7, TAP 2 and 2 independents making up the 89 seats in the parliament. Remember also, that Queensland is a one house parliament so there is no upper house whatsoever. This clearly gives the LNP a very clear mandate for change in Queensland.

No matter what your view of politics, this is a historically significant election as it brings a number of questions into play, such as that of the ALP forming an opposition. Parliamentary rules state that an opposition needs to have 10 seats and reports so far indicate that Premier Elect Newman will grant Labor with opposition status even with only 7 seats. As one person put it, they will only need a maxi taxi to hold a caucus meeting and in terms of the front bench, each member will need to cover multiple portfolios to handle all of the shadow ministerial responsibilities.

This win for the LNP will also have to send a message to Canberra and let's just hope that some of the many issues that impact the travel industry will start to gather some momentum. Specifically for travel this result now means that we will have a far greater chance of reaching an agreed outcome for the review of consumer protection. In opposition, the LNP had supported the reforms on the table and there have been no indications that this position will change now that they are in government. The other important political point for this reform is that the next state election is not scheduled until 9<sup>th</sup> March 2013, in WA, so this gives us a solid year to finalise the reforms and get them implemented.

AFTA will look forward to the confirmation and announcements of Ministerial responsibilities in Queensland and will continue to build on our many relationships that have already been formed while the LNP was in opposition. A solid result with an appropriate message of congratulations to be sent by AFTA to Premier Elect Newman in the coming week.
