Joyce pleads for 'fair go'

QANTAS ceo Alan Joyce has addressed misconceptions about the carrier's future, with an opinion piece in today's *Australian* insisting that all the airline wants is a fair go.

"Not only has Qantas competed successfully in Australia and the world for nearly 20 years, it has done so while handcuffed by the Qantas Sale Act, which limits the company's access to foreign capital," he wrote.

Joyce insists that Qantas is not looking for protection from the free market, but says that Virgin Australia's restructure last year "has enabled it to circumvent Australian law and pretend to be an Australian airline, when it is majority owned by three foreign

VA chops TSV routes

VIRGIN Australia will terminate its direct services from Townsville to both Cairns and Rockhampton next month, citing low loads.

Services will be reduced during Jan before being wound up from 27 Jan, a spokesperson confirmed to *Travel Daily* yesterday.

VA said it "remains committed to these cities and will continue to fly direct to Townsville, Cairns & Rockhampton from key hubs on Australia's east coast such as Sydney, Melbourne & Brisbane."

Passengers on booked services on or beyond 27 Jan will be reaccommodated on other flights or offered a full refund.

THE American Airlines Group has been launched following the merger of AMR Corporation and US Airways yesterday.

With services to 330 destinations in 50 countries worldwide and a workforce of 100.000+, the combined new American Airlines is the world's biggest airline.

The process to achieve a Single Operating Certificate will take up to 24 months, but during which time the airlines say it's "business as usual", with each carrier's website to operate separately.

US Airways and its subsidiaries will exit the Star Alliance on 30 Mar, joining AA in oneworld on 31 Mar 2014 (TD 02 Apr).

JQ Top End hub goes south

JETSTAR will relocate three of its A320 aircraft stationed in Darwin to Adelaide as it winds down its operation in the Top End, shedding around 100 staff.

A fourth aircraft will reposition from Melbourne as the low-cost carrier ramps up its presence in South Australia, effective 30 Mar.

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Tahoe's Aussie tourist drive

CALIFORNIA'S Lake Tahoe region is enjoying "snowballing" development with major brands looking to build in the area, and is trying to lure more Australians to visit over both its summer and winter seasons.

Lake Tahoe Visitors Authority director of tourism Tony Lyle, who is visiting Sydney and Melbourne this week to promote the region, told *Travel Daily* that Tahoe was going from strength to strength.

"The Renaissance has finally happened," Lyle said.

While in Australia, the message being spread to both retail agents, wholesalers & consumers alike is that Tahoe is ideal for second or third-time US visitors looking to go further afield.

"We've got some new hotels that have come online and are really interesting.

"Our first five-star lakefront property is opening this month

and is called The Landing, which is in the downtown area but it's the only downtown property that is lakefront - we've never had a five-star property on the south shore before," Lyle told **TD**.

Other properties re-opening following remodelling include The Base Camp Hotel which has been themed as a base camp for outdoor recreation with themed rooms and communal areas.

"It's not the kind of place that's perceived as only for the rich and famous," Lyle added.

Australian ski wholesalers have always performed well in terms of numbers to Tahoe, Lyle added, with his visit aimed at getting the message out further to travel agents and then ultimately out to the consumer.

"They're already supporters of Tahoe – we just have to make sure we get the right product out there," Lyle concluded.

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Oman 2020 strategy

TOURISM and government officials in the Sultanate of Oman have expressed a renewed optimism in successfully reaching visitor growth objectives set down within its Vision 2020 plan.

The plan, originally envisaged way back in 1995, was to see the national hotel room count reach or surpass 20,000 by 2015 with a goal to welcome 12 million visitors each year by 2020.

New hotel openings and further development announcements in recent months (*TD* 26 Nov) has seen reaching room count targets now possible two years sooner.

Occupancy levels and RevPAR have also been steadily climbing, according to figures from the Oman Ministry of Tourism.

Significant investments are being made at Muscat Airport, with a new terminal capable of handling 12m people from 2014.

HA presses for HND

HAWAIIAN Airlines is arguing its proposed non-stop services between Kona and Tokyo Haneda is "superior" to the option from San Francisco planned by United.

In a 49-page response to the US Dept of Transportation regarding why it should be allocated slots, HA said its services to Haneda have outperformed all other US gateways and it will operate the largest aircraft among its competitors to the destination.

HA said competitors operating from US west coast gateways "have struggled" with loads and frequently cancelled flights or downgauged aircraft on Haneda routes, whereas it has "fulfilled every promise" committed to the DOT for its Japanese operation.

A DOT decision on which airline will be awarded the HND slots is expected in coming weeks.
