EY to lift Manchester

ETIHAD is set to expand capacity on its flights between Abu Dhabi and Manchester in the UK, replacing the existing 262seat A330-200 aircraft with a two class 777-300ER.

The change is effective from 01 Jun 2014, with the new planes having capacity for 380 passengers each.

Princess performance

PRINCESS Cruises has been hailed by an Aussie travel agent for exceptional service to the family of a client who tragically died shortly after returning home from a cruise.

Jennie Dicker from Helloworld Stockland Nowra in NSW told **TD** that her clients were returning home after their holiday and en route stayed overnight with family.

The woman mentioned to her daughter that a photo had been taken at the "pirate night" on board the cruise, and she had regretted not purchasing it.

Unfortunately she was killed in an accident the next day, and in the aftermath her daughter contacted the Helloworld office to find out what happens to leftover pictures on board.

Dicker contacted Princess, and with just the cruise and cabin number and a photo of the woman the cruise line's staff "went above and beyond" and searched through the boxes of prints left over after the voyage.

They found four pictures of her and forwarded them to the agent, with Dicker praising Princess' "outstanding customer service."





Antarctic cruise rescue

ABOUT fifty

passengers and 20 crew are stranded aboard expedition ship *MV Akademik Shokalskiy* which is trapped in heavy ice about 3km from the open ocean

during an Antarctic voyage.

The vessel, which was operated last season by Aurora Expeditions, sent out a Christmas Day request for assistance after being immobilised when a blizzard hit. However a spokesman reassured

that "there's no danger at all. "It's just stuck in ice," he said.

The Australian Maritime Safety Authority is coordinating a rescue, with three icebreakers currently en route to the vessel.

The first is not expected to arrive until tonight at the earliest. The current voyage departed from New Zealand on 08 Dec,

with the vessel now about 1500

Boxing Day sales

AIRLINES yesterday got into the traditional Boxing Day shopping frenzy, with Qantas, Jetstar, Virgin Australia and Tigerair all launching sales.

Tiger's "boxing day madness" sale offered deals on 21 routes across Australia, with \$1 "return" airfares offered when purchasing a round trip outbound ticket.

The TT deals are on sale until midday on 31 Dec, for travel 29 Apr-26 Jun 2014.

Jetstar is offering "Boxing Day Bargains" on sale until midnight tomorrow 28 Dec, on a range of domestic and international routes. Virgin Australia's "End of Year

Sale" ends at midnight on 30 Dec, with deals across its domestic network and a \$100 saving for travellers who spend \$1000 or more with Virgin Australia Holidays before 28 Dec.

And the Qantas Boxing Day Sale is on until midnight 28 Sep, with domestic deals available for departures 22 Jul-11 Sep 2014.

United Croatia pact

UNITED Airlines has launched new codeshare cooperation with its Star Alliance sister carrier Croatia Airlines, with the UA code now appearing on Croatia Airlines flights from Zagreb to Amsterdam, Brussels, Frankfurt, London Heathrow, Munich, Paris and Zurich.

China Southern to Gold Coast

CHINA Southern Airlines is set to add the Gold Coast to its Australian portfolio of destinations - but it's just a one-off flight for the upcoming Chinese New Year period.

The one-time Gold Coast charter will utilise an A330-300 aircraft, flying non-stop from Guangzhou on 26 Jan 2014 and returning to China the following day.

Harbin Ice Festival

RUSSIAN Gateway Tours is offering commission on a series of upcoming departures for China's Harbin Ice Festival.

The six day/five night tours will take place between 05 Jan and 05 Feb 2014 with deals including accommodation, meals, a private English-speaking guide and driver in an air conditioned vehicle.

MH JAL codeshare

MALAYSIA Airlines has launched codeshare services in partnership with Japan Airlines, with the MH code added to JAL services between Narita and Vancouver in Canada.

The codeshares are on JL017/18 which will also be designated as MH9769/9770, with MH group ceo Ahma Jauhari saing the move is part of "enhancing air connectivity with key priority markets overseas for increased tourist arrivals into Malaysia and in conjunction with the Visit Malaysia Year 2014".

Heron Is evacuation

ABOUT 300 guests staying on Heron Island off the Qld coast near Gladstone were evacuated on Christmas Day after the resort was forced to close due to a fire in an electricity generator.

The incident left the resort without power or running water, with the guests and about 110 staff taken by boat to Gladstone.

There were no injuries or damage to public spaces, with guests booked to stay this week currently being contacted to discuss alternative arrangements.

Sabah safety

A TAIWANESE tourist who was kidnapped in eastern Sabah more than a month ago (TD 28 Nov) has been safely rescued by authorities in the Philippines.

The Eastern Sabah Security Command has outlined a range of initiatives to improve safety including "weeding out" illegal workers, more police stations and an elite tactical response squad.

AUSTRALIA is currently one of the strongest markets in the Asia-Pacific region for hotels. according to recent data from research firm STR Global.

Europe storm chaos

CHRISTMAS travel plans have been disrupted across parts of western Europe this week due to a massive winter storm.

Passengers were stranded at airports in London and Paris, while train services have also been severely impacted in some areas due to fallen trees.

There were reduced frequencies on the Heathrow Express train services from Paddington to LHR, while the heavy weather also hit cross-channel ferry services.

Singapore had a strong 84.3% occupancy rate during the month but that was down 2.4 points.

Average daily rates surged in Jakarta (up 14.4%), Bali (11.3% higher) and Tokyo (also up 11.3%) while China saw an overall occupancy of 68% with an average rate of US\$101.74.

EK A380s to Gatwick

EMIRATES will become the first scheduled operator of the Airbus A380 to London Gatwick Airport, with the carrier confirming that the superjumbo will replace 777-300ERs on flight EK09/10 effective from 30 Mar 2014.

Emirates operates three daily flights to Gatwick from Dubai, and when the double decker aircraft debuts at LGW it will be the airline's 27th A380 destination.

Amex settlements

AMERICAN Express will pay almost US\$80 million in fines and customer settlements as part of agreements with several US regulatory agencies, in order to resolve issues relating to marketing and billing practices for some discontinued products.

The companies involved include American Express Travel Related Services Company Inc, American **Express Centurion Bank and** American Express Bank, FSB.

Agreements have been signed with the US Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, the **Consumer Financial Protection** Bureau and the Office of Comptroller of the Currency, and will see Amex pay \$16.2 million in fines and about US\$60m in "customer remediation".

Products cited include 'Identity Protect/Identity Protect Premium,' 'Account Protector' and 'Lost Wallet Protector,' with marketing of all these products discontinued over a year ago.

Delta to retire DC-9s

DELTA Air Lines has revised the date of the final commercial flights of its venerable Douglas DC-9 aircraft (*TD* 08 Oct), which will see the last operations of the type by a major US carrier.

The historic final service by the classic aircraft will depart from Minneapolis St Paul Airport heading to Atlanta at 4.20pm on Mon 06 Jan 2014.

"The DC-9 has been a workhorse in our domestic fleet while providing a reliable customer experience," said DL vice president of fleet strategy, Nat Pieper.

"The aircraft's retirement paves the way for newer, more efficient aircraft," he added.

Over the last five years Delta has removed or retired more than 350 aircraft from its fleet including CRJ-200s, Saab 340s and DC9s, at the same time adding newer planes including Boeing 777-200LRs, 737s and 717s as well as smaller regional jets.

DL was the launch customer for the original 65-seat version of the DC-9 in 1965 and removed it from the fleet in 1993; however DC-9s again became part of its operations when it merged with Northwest airlines.

To acknowledge the DC-9's retirement the final flight has been tagged as DL2014 to note its last year of service, while the preceding sector from Detroit to Minneapolis will be flight DL1965, its initial year of operation.

UK changes UAE visas

AUTHORITIES in the United Kingdom have changed their visa requirements for travellers from some Middle Eastern countries.

Effective from early 2014 citizens from the UAE, Qatar and Oman will be able to obtain a free electronic visa waiver two days prior to their planned departure.

The initiative changes the current visa application process, with the scheme expected to be expanded to Kuwaiti nationals later in the year.



INDONESIAN airline Merpati Nusantara encountered some operational difficulties last weekend after an overbooked flight led to a local official unable to find a seat.

Marianus Sae, who's the head of the Ngada district on the eastern Indonesian island of Flores, tried to buy a ticket for a flight early on Sat morning but there were no seats available and the airline refused to bump passengers who had already made confirmed bookings.

The official was so upset that he ordered his local staff to drive cars onto the runway at his local airport and stop the plane from landing.

Staff at the airport were unable to stop the blockade, and the plane was forced to turn back to its origin.

A spokesman for Indonesia's transport ministry said the incident had "tarnished the reputation of the aviation industry," but added that there were limited options for the ministry to sanction the official.

NORAD isn't the only US government agency which tracked Santa Claus (*TD* Tue), with the US Department of Agriculture also issuing a formal statement about the jolly red man's entry into America.

Apparently the normally stringent border control livestock checks didn't apply to the nine reindeer pulling his sleigh, with the department's Chief Veterinary Officer saying "we agreed to waive the normal application fees and entry inspection costs, provided he winks his eye and wishes port personnel a Merry Christmas."

Another condition of entry was that Santa Claus certify that the reindeer had never been fed anything other than hay, sugar plums and gingerbread.
