SINGAPORE'S Changi Airport handled more than 50 million passengers in 2012, with the milestone reached just two years after hitting 40 million in 2010.

The rapid growth was attributed to the increasing availability of SIN low-cost travel options, along with "booming demand for intra-Asia travel".

Passenger numbers grew more than 10% in both 2011 and 2012.

A special ceremony to celebrate the 50 millionth arrival was held to welcome Garuda flight 824 on 31 Dec, with Indonesia the top market for Changi, comprising 13.4% of total traffic this year.

Virgin trialling BYOD IFE VIRGIN Australia is expected to

begin the full roll-out of wireless in-flight entertainment streaming to passengers' personal devices from next month, with an initial month-long trial of the system currently under way.

One 737 has been fitted to the 'Bring Your Own Device' (BYOD) system which supports Apple and Windows devices.

More than 300 hours of content (including movies, TV, CDs, radio programs and a moving map) is available on the system, which works on iPads and iPhones via a special Lufthansa Systems app available on the Apple iTunes store - but this must be downloaded before boarding.

Laptops and tablets with Microsoft's Silverlight software can also display the Virgin streaming IFE content.

You and I and Gemini

THE former Norwegian Dream, now renamed SuperStar Gemini, has set sail from Singapore after undergoing a US\$50m overhaul.

The 1500-passenger ship has upgraded navigation and safety systems along with "restyled" cabins, restaurants, recreation and entertainment facilities. She'll operate 17 voyages from Penang in Malaysia, then relocate to Sanya in China for 26 cruises. From Apr to Oct the ship will operate from Shanghai to destinations in North Asia.

Hotel locks hacked

THOUSANDS of hotel locks around the globe are set to be "fixed" after a hacker posted details of a low-cost device which can open a popular brand of keycard-based room lock.

The locks are made by a company called Onity, which has reportedly sold more than a million of them, installed in thousands of properties across the globe.

The saga started in Jul at the Black Hat hacker conference in Las Vegas, when one of the delegates demonstrated a tool he had created for less than \$50 from parts bought at his local Radio Shack store.

The gadget could be inserted into a data port on the base of the Onity lock, and allowed him to read information from the electronics inside and in turn use this to open the lock in seconds.

The vulnerability, initially just a curiosity, quickly became exploited for criminal purposes after videos showing how it worked were posted online.

Hotels have implemented new security protocols and Onity has developed a fix which it says has been available for some months, and which is gradually being rolled out across affected hotels.

FAA orders 737 probes

THE US Federal Aviation Administration has issued an order calling for additional inspections for cracking in the fuselage of about 109 ageing 737 aircraft used by US airlines.

The affected planes are 737-300, -400 and -500s, mostly flown by LCC Southwest Airlines.

The move follows an investigation into a 2009 incident in which a hole about the size of a football was torn in the roof of one of the older 737s en route from Nashville to Baltimore.





TROPICAL Cyclone Freda is approaching New Caledonia, but the latest forecasts have reclassified it as a "depression".

The cyclone caused extensive flooding in the Solomon Islands, but has weakened as it moves south, causing heavy rain in Noumea but without the huge winds experienced during Fiji's recent Cyclone Evan which devastated some resorts incl the popular Castaway Is (**TD** 21 Dec).

QF shares rising

QANTAS shares hit a six month high on New Year's Eve, rising as high as \$1.50 each before dipping slightly to close at \$1.49.

That means they have recovered more than 50% since plummeting to just 96c on 08 Jun after Qantas issued a profit downgrade forecasting its full year loss for 2011/12.

New Orleans Indigo

INTERCONTINENTAL Hotels Group has opened the first Hotel Indigo in New Orleans, with the 132 room property located in the city's historic Garden District.

The hotel ormerly operated under the Clarion brand, but has now reopened under the new banner after a \$17m renovation.

The opening has come just in time for this year's SuperBowl football game in New Orleans later this month.

C&K Indonesia tour

COX & KINGS is promoting a 12 day Highlights of Indonesia tour which departs from Surabaya and explores a range of destinations including Mount Bromo, Bali, Yogyakarta, Borobodur and more.

Priced from \$3790ppts, the trip operates between Apr and Sep 2013 and includes a local tour manager, private transfers, air conditioned land transport, daily breakfast, a flight to Denpasar and some meals - 1300 836 764. However Freda has had an impact on cruise ships in the region, including *Radiance of the Seas* which was set to depart Sydney on 30 Dec.

The ship was delayed until yesterday and will skip two of its planned ports in the South Pacific because of expected heavy seas from the storm which passed directly across *Radiance*'s route.

Radiance will return to Sydney in time for its next sailing 'Fijian Bliss' 12 night trip on 09 Jan.

The delay had some benefits for passengers, because the ship was moored in front of Sydney Harbour's Point Piper - in prime position to view the famous Sydney New Year's Eve fireworks.



Thai-Cambodia buses

THE first ever direct bus services linking Thailand and Cambodia launched this week.

Two routes are available, including the 424km Bangkok-Siem Reap trip which takes about seven hours and will operate twice per day with a fare of 750 baht (about \$24).

The Bangkok-Phnom Penh service will run once daily and takes about 11 hours to traverse the 719km route, costing 900 baht or roughly \$30 one way.

Buses used on both routes are air conditioned, with the operators planning significant expansion including new routes such as Pattaya, Sihanoukville and the addition of trips to Myanmar and Vietnam in 2014.

Contiki's Cousteau adventure

LEADING environmentalist, adventurer and explorer Celine Cousteau recently paid a visit to Travel House at Bondi Junction in Sydney to meet with and speak about her adventures with staff from Contiki. Following in the footsteps of

There were 151 passengers and crew on board during the incident which saw emergency crews scrambled, as well as the suspension of train services to the airport.

A spokesperson for the carrier said the aircraft's captain "took the decision to divert as a precaution only". culinary journey".

AIR India has opened reservations for Boeing 787 flights between Delhi and Paris CDG, with GDS screens currently showing the new Dreamliner route to debut 31 Mar 2013.

Kuoni shuts down loss-making operations

SWISS travel giant Kuoni has confirmed the sale of a number of businesses in the Netherlands, Spain and Russia as part of a previously announced restructuring plan (*TD* 22 Sep) under which it wants to exit from loss-making activities.

Tour operations in Spain and Holland were sold to local management, while Russia's Megapolus Tours was sold to rival operator Russian Express.

Kuoni said that "no sustainable solution" had been found for its Belgian Best Tours operation or the Octopustravel B2C online hotel platform.

"Therefore closure of these operations has been initiated," the company said, with activities in the businesses to cease during the first half of 2013.

Kuoni ceo Peter Rothwell said that the withdrawals meant that the company was "eliminating operational losses and concentrating on strategically relevant areas of business as a global, broad-based travel services provider".

As exclusively revealed by **Travel Daily** the Octopustravel closure only affects the consumer facing octopustravel.com sites (**TD** 21 Nov), with its Australian and NZ trade operations continuing to take bookings for its wholesale portfolio of more than 45,000 hotels, 6,000 tours and 5,000 transfer options.

New FAA chief

THE US Senate has confirmed the appointment of Michael P. Huerta as Administrator of the Federal Aviation Administration.

Huerta has been acting in the role since taking over from former chief, Randy Babbitt, who resigned in Dec 2011 over a drunk driving charge.

US president Barack Obama nominated Huerta for the position, with the move now confirmed by the Senate vote.

Window Seat

HOW many times did you see midnight on New Years Eve? A small group of celebrities, including Hollywood heartthrob Leonardo DiCaprio, flew into Sydney last weekend to be among the first in the world to ring in the new year, courtesy of Australia's UTC+10 timezone.

Not content with doing it once however, the troupe quickly departed their Sydney party digs after midnight on 31 Dec to be whisked to the national capital.

Evading Sydney Airport's curfew restrictions by departing from Canberra, the group boarded a chartered Boeing 747 flight to Las Vegas - 17 hours behind Sydney - with the intention of celebrating New Years Eve in 2012 once again. Only for the rich and famous.

The move is effective for all sailings from 16 Jan, and reflects the rising popularity of Zumba which Celebrity previously only offered on transatlantic voyages.

QR sues German firm

QATAR Airways has confirmed a massive \$600m lawsuit against German company Lindner Depa Interiors, over delays in the construction of the new Doha International Airport.

The move was flagged by QR ceo Akbar Al Baker (TD 22 Nov), who said the problems would see the airport open up to a year late.

The company held a \$250m contract to build 19 airport lounges, but this has now been terminated due to the delays which have affected QR's revenue and rapid expansion plans.

Big Apple sets record

NEW York City welcomed a record 52 million visitors in 2012, according to Mayor Michael Bloomberg, with the figure up 2.1% on 2011.

Bloomberg said visitors spent a hefty \$36.9 billion, contributing to a total estimated economic benefit of \$55.3 billion.

Overseas visitors comprised a hefty 21% of the total, with 29 million hotel room nights sold overall generating more than half a billion dollars in hotel taxes.

The figures show New York is well on the way to its 2015 target of 55 million visitors and \$70 billion in economic impact.

BRITISH AIRWAYS

US inflight internet

AMERICAN regulators have slashed red tape for new in-flight internet services, under a framework which simplifies licensing procedures with the aim of halving the time needed for approvals for new installations.

The Federal Communications Commission said the changed procedures would "promote the widespread availability of internet access to aircraft passengers".

The procedures will allow airlines to test systems to ensure they don't interfere with aircraft electronics, and then simply apply for approval from the Federal Aviation Administration.
