TCF ceo Glen Wells told **Travel Daily** the first claim was received yesterday, with the fund also taking a significant number of

"We would call on the Treasury and the rest of the Government

to support long-term funding of the statistics, because the industry has been identified as one of the five national growth industries and provides outstanding opportunities to grow employment across the country, in both cities and regional areas," Powell said.
