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ABC News takes VA flight

VIRGIN Australia is continuing its focus on the corporate market via a new partnership with the national broadcaster, giving passengers access to daily ABC news bulletins on VA's domestic and international networks.

From early 2015, passengers travelling on Virgin's Boeing 737 and Embraer 190 aircraft will be able to stream dedicated daily news direct to their own devices. Comprising four separate

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QF touts MU pact benefits

QANTAS says its proposed tie-up with China Eastern Airlines (TD Tue) will result in "substantial benefits for Australian consumers," by offering shorter journey times, more schedule choice and improved connectivity between Australia and China.

In a submission to the ACCC covering the alliance, the carriers point out that their joint market share will be about 30% on the Australia-China route only slightly higher than China Southern at 27.2% while Cathay Pacific has a 17% share.

"Alone, Qantas would not be able to keep pace with the capacity growth being driven by carriers such as China Southern



Honeymoon over for AAX

HEAVY financial losses in the third quarter of 2014 due to soft demand and growing competition will see low-cost long-haul carrier AirAsia X cut some of its 2015 capacity to Australia.

According to the Sydney Morning Herald today, the airline reported a nett loss for the Sep quarter of MYR\$210.9 million ringgit (AUD\$72.9 million) on its Australian operations, taking its full year losses to \$96 million.

The carrier currently flies to Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane, Adelaide, Perth and the Gold Coast up to twice daily.

Staff in Malaysia have also been told they will be paid their wages on a "staggered basis" due to late arrival of incoming funds.

Further, forthcoming aircraft deliveries intended for Kuala Lumpur will be slowed to allow for newer routes to mature.

Aircraft will instead be sent to its Indonesian and Thai offshoots.

"Capacity allocation in 2015 will see a drop in the number of flights to Australia, while North Asia and other regions will see an increase in the number of flights," AAX ceo Azran Osman-Rani said.

Osman-Rani added it was confident that with carriers cutting capacity and amid falling fuel prices, AirAsiaX expects to turn things around, potentially as early as next quarter.

EY/AZ seek ACCC approval

ETIHAD Airways has sought interim authorisation from the Australian competition watchdog to enable it to cooperate with Alitalia on a range of matters and to better compete on air services between Australia and Italy.

The airlines this month advised the Australian Competition & Consumer Commission that their planned cooperation agreement will cover scheduling and pricing of international air services for a period of not less than 10 years.

According to a submission by the partners, the proposed commercial partnership will also cover marketing, distribution, codesharing, reciprocal frequent flyer schemes, lounge access, product development and more.

"The Partnership foresees the generation of significant public benefits through Alitalia's use of Etihad's Abu Dhabi hub for travel from points in Italy to and from points in Australia and Asia," the

carriers told the ACCC.

Etihad Airways and Alitalia say the partnership will deliver public benefits "immediately" once in place, providing Aussie travellers with new access to smaller Italian cities including Venice, Catania and Bologna, via Abu Dhabi.

The carriers state the alliance will stimulate tourism to Australia from the Italy market by creating new online itineraries, and that they plan to "improve the scheduling" of Alitalia flights to support the development of traffic to and from Australia.

It will also help them compete against the likes of Singapore Airlines, Qatar Airways and Qantas/Emirates to Italy.

To fast-track benefits, EY and AZ have sought interim authorisation to begin marketing the deal to enable the public "to realise the full benefits".

Submissions from interested parties are sought by 28 Nov.



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


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Citadines to S. Korea

Record month at MEL

THE International Convention of Jehovah's Witnesses contributed largely to a record month for int'l arrivals at Melbourne Airport, the facility's Oct statistics show.

Overseas arrivals topped 694,000 for the month, up 9.5% year-on-year, while the domestic tally closed over 2.17 million, an increase of 4.6% on Oct 2013.

Japan recorded a staggering 88.2% growth in arrivals, clearly the strongest nationality for the month over China at 32.4%, while arrivals from USA were up 28.5%.

Regus/NMBS p'ship

GLOBAL workspace provider Regus has forged a pact with Belgium's railway operator, which will see the company's network expand to business lounges across the country's rail network.

The new Regus Express/NMBS centres are part of Regus' global initiative to open professional work facilities at transport hubs.



STAR Alliance hosted more than 120 agents to a networking function at the National Maritime Museum in Darling Harbour last night, providing partners with a chance to meet ceo Mark Schwab and member airline executives.

Schwab's whirlwind 2-day visit to Sydney included participating in a symposium with other online and offline Star Alliance members that operate to Australia.

The Frankfurt-based exec said 2015 was proving to be an unusual period for global airline alliances, with Star Alliance, SkyTeam and oneworld yet to announce any pending future member additions after many years of expansion and airline consolidation.

Schwab confirmed to *Travel*Daily the group was in talks with

a potential airline in Brazil to further broaden the alliance's scope in South America.

While coy to name names, **Travel Daily** understands Azul Brazilian Airlines is a front-runner.

He also said voids in the Star network still remain in Russia, Australia and "other pockets".



The results showed double-digit growth from China, Malaysia and the Philippines, with US up 9% on the back of dedicated UA capacity.



The regulator said the 4hr & 10min delay at Washington Dulles International Airport on 21 Feb was only brought to its attention after a passenger complaint.

MU said the delay was a result of MU587 being diverted from New York JFK to IAD due to the closure of airspace as a result of heavy fog.
