EK Premium Econ coming

THERE'S growing certainty that Qantas' alliance partner Emirates is developing a new Premium Economy product after the Gulf carrier's president suggested tickets would go on sale for the product as early as next Dec.

Speaking in London this week, Tim Clark said Emirates expects to be selling tickets in the new Prem Economy cabin before mid-2018.

"We are at the stage of finding what form [Premium Economy] will take," Clark told reporters,

"I would think within the next year to 18 months, we will have it in the airline, hopefully up and running," he said.

TD understands the absence of a Y+ cabin on EK services has long been a source of frustration in its Qantas partnership, with the Australia carrier's premium passengers unable to connect to EK's wide European network in equivalent seating.

Currently, passengers wanting the full Premium Econ experience to Europe are restricted to QF's services to London, or those of rivals such as Singapore Airlines or Cathay Pacific.

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Neil Rodgers now Adventure World md

NEIL Rodgers has been appointed as managing director of Adventure World, stepping up from his role as general manager of the Travel Corporation brand.

TTC ceo John Veitch told **TD** Rodgers had done an outstanding job over the last 18 months, with the Adventure World portfolio showing strong growth.

Rodgers yesterday also confirmed the launch early next year of a significant new expansion into the US, with a range of active adventure-based holidays in areas such as the Pacific Northwest and Wyoming.

787-10 final assembly

AIRCRAFT manufacturer Boeing has begun final assembly of the first 787-10 *Dreamliner* an extended version of the carbon composite fuel-efficient jet.

Boeing has received 154 orders, so far, for the 787-10 from nine customers including ANA, AF, BA, SQ, EY, UA and Air Lease Corp.

The inaugural -10 is expected to take flight next year and the first delivery is slated for 2018.

Helloworld sells WAS, GAS

HELLOWORLD'S divestment of its aviation representation businesses World Aviation Systems and Global Aviation Services (TD breaking news) sees the company exit the airline gsa business after almost 40 years.

World Aviation Systems was established in Sydney in 1978, under the umbrella of Helloworld forerunner Concorde Travel.

Former Transonic Travel ceo Peter Lacaze merged the business with Global Aviation Services in 2005, making the combination a dominant force at the time.

Former Helloworld ceo Rob Gurney appointed James Vaile to head up the division in 2013 (*TD* 30 Oct 13), at the time describing it as the "premier General Sales Agency in Australia and NZ".

However more recently key clients had established their own offices here or appointed alternative representation.

Vaile departed suddenly earlier this year (*TD* 18 May) followed by former Virgin Atlantic staffer Gia Acitelli, with both now working at Anjuna, a "global airline services company" founded by Vaile.

Yesterday's announcement was not a surprise to astute observers, who had noticed the disappearance of the World Aviation Systems and Global Aviation Services logos from a brand matrix in the Helloworld annual report and presentations as far back as Aug.

It's also not surprising that the new owner, a company formed last week called World Aviation Holdings Pty Ltd, is owned by Spiros and Irene Alysandratos.

The Alysandratos family is a major Helloworld shareholder and has a separate airline representation business under the Airline Marketing division of Consolidated Travel.

With the acquisition from Helloworld, the group adds carriers such as Kenya Airways, Egyptair, TAP Portugal, Virgin Atlantic, Air Botswana, Royal Jordanian, Alaska Airlines, Aer Lingus, Ethiopian Airlines, Sichuan Airlines, Hong Kong Airlines and MIAT Mongolian Airlines to its portfolio.

The transaction is expected to be finalised on 16 Jan 2017.

Lido appointment

THE Lido Group has appointed Jon West to the newly-created role of chief commercial officer.

West is the former managing director of HRS' operation in the UK and will relocate to Sydney to take on the position with the integrated hotel booking and payment solution provider.

He'll be tasked with developing commercial strategies to expand the Australian company's footprint in Asia Pacific.

Chief executive Steve Mackenzie said West brings "extraordinary knowledge and experience" to the role, adding "his commercial insights and networks will ensure The Lido Group continues to recognise and seize opportunities for growth".

Egypt DFAT update

THE Australian Government has issued a fresh advisory for travel to Egypt, warning "terrorists maybe in the advanced stages of planning attacks in Egypt in areas frequented by Westerners".

Yesterday's update continued to recommend that Australians "reconsider their need to travel".

The airline's vice president and general manager Oceania Ryo Sadayuki said sales on the Sydney route had surpassed expectations, with passenger levels to peak during the Japanese ski season over the coming three months.

Load factors had already reached 92% last month, giving the airline optimism for future Australian routes.

Sadayuki said although there was no timeline for expansion, Melbourne and Brisbane were likely destinations for ANA, Japan's only five-star Skytrax rated airline.

NZ sleeper bus service

WELLINGTON and Auckland will be connected by an overnight sleeper bus service from Wed, departing both cities nightly at 11pm and arriving at 8.45am.

The ManaBus.com service will offer premium buses with leather seats and lie-flat beds.

The overnight buses complement existing day services and are priced from NZ\$25.99.

Bali still Aussie fave

DESPITE repeated warnings from the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade about the "high threat of terror attacks" in Bali, Aussie visitor numbers continue to grow, with the latest stats from the govt's tourism office indicating a 10.78% increase in numbers to 104,631 in Oct, compared to 94,449 during the same month last year.

Chinese tourists to the popular tourist hub continue to soar in Oct, jumping a whopping 40.32% to 78,604 from 56,015 recorded in the corresponding period in '15.

VA pet fees rejigged

VIRGIN Australia has recently launched a new fee structure for accompanied pet bookings.

Effective from 30 Nov, pets weighing in between 0-10kg, 11-20kg, 21-30kg or 30+kgs will be charged at \$85, \$105, \$135, \$165 respectively.

The price is charged based on the combined weight of the container and the animal, with agents reminded that payments for accompanied pet bookings need to be completed via VA's guest contact centre.

Bookings made prior to 30 Nov will be honoured accordingly.

Morgan Hotels sold

MORGANS Hotel Group has been acquired by sbe, with the transaction valued at \$805m.

The sale sees sbe's current portfolio more than double, combining Morgan's Delano and Mondrian brands with the group's existing collection which includes SLS hotels, The Redbury hotels and Hyde hotels.

RIO de Janiero's mayor-elect Marcelo Crivella has boldly proposed a controversial tourist tax which could see visitors mugged in the city reimbursed.

"[The city] cannot continue treating its tourists as if they were an afterthough," said Crivella at a business leaders lunch event this week.

However, the proposed plan has been criticised by many, including global tourism scholar Mario Beni who told the *New York Times* "creating such a tax makes no sense, unless the aim is to discourage tourism in Rio de Janeiro".

Crivella will take office in Jan.

NORTH Korea's Ryugyong Hotel project, the world's largest lodging at 3,000 keys, is rumoured to finally open after spending 30 years empty.

Whispers of the revival began after Egyptian development company Orascom was flown into Pyongyang to discuss the future of the nicknamed "hotel of doom", reported *NK News*.

The pyramid-shaped development, which was first launched in 1987 by then leader Kim Il-Sung and abandoned in 1992, stands at 105-storeys and cost a reported \$800 million to get off the ground.

ROLLS-ROYCE Holdings has agreed to fund measures to address performance and maintenance concerns over engines for Emirates A380 jets.

Emirates is due to take delivery of its first A380 with Trent 900 engines from 16 Dec, two weeks later than initially planned.

MEANWHILE, Emirates has injected a little Christmas spirit into its experience, launching a Christmas menu for the first time across all cabin classes, featuring festive dining options.

The meals are available for travel between Dubai & Australia, Europe, the US or the UK.

Galaxy S6 smoking

A SAMSUNG Galaxy S6 mobile began smoking on a China Airlines flight from Palau to Taoyuan on Wed, Taiwan News reports.

Crew quickly responded by putting the phone in an ice bucket and no injuries were reported.

The airline has banned all Samsung Galaxy Note 7 smartphones since 15 Oct.

China Airlines said it would work with authorities to investigate the incident.

Longest tunnel opens

SWITZERLAND will open the longest train tunnel in the world this weekend, allowing passengers to travel under the Alps in some 17 minutes.

The dual track, Gotthard Base Tunnel, will tie southern and northern Switzerland closer together.

The 17-year pioneering project extends for 57km down to a maximum depth of 2300 metres under the Gotthard massif.
