



Tiger blocked from Bali TIGERAIR Australia has entered a second day of Bali cancellations amid a regulatory dispute with Indonesian authorities (TD

breaking news yesterday). The carrier said it had been forced to cut flights to Denpasar after being hit with "new administration requirements" from the government.

However the ABC today reports Indonesian officials have disputed Tigerair's statement and accused the low-cost carrier of breaching its licence conditions.

Today's flights have since been cancelled along with another flight tomorrow from DPS to MEL with pax either re-accommodated on Virgin Australia services or offered full refunds.

The dispute appears to involve ticketing issues, with Indonesia's head of Air Transport saying Tigerair Australia operates charter services and therefore should not be issuing one-way tickets.

"We will not hesitate to give sanctions & suspend the operation of foreign airlines which violate the flight regulations in Indonesia," a spokesman told the ABC.

Record Xmas traffic

TOTAL arrivals and departures at major Australian international airports increased 9.9% year-onyear to over 1.49 million during the holiday period, the Australian Border Force reported yesterday.

Sydney Airport welcomed the largest number of travellers, with 278,952 incoming travellers (up 8.8%) and 328,768 outgoing (a whopping 9.6% compared to the same time last year).

Around the country, the busiest weekend for traveller movements was 07 Jan with 148.069 arrivals and departures and another 147,858 the following day.

Sabre names trends

QUIRKY behavioural trends among Asia Pacific consumers have the potential to open up new opportunities for hoteliers. according to a new report released by Sabre.

Prepared in collaboration with TrendWatching, the study identifies three movements that hotels can exploit in the face of increasing competition and industry disrupters, Sabre says.

The first is labelled 'betterment', in which consumers aim to improve their lifestyles, live healthier and 'do good'.

The second Sabre calls 'local love', and involves a growing pride among Asian travellers for local identity and brands such as Alibaba and Samsung.

The third, 'infolust', stems from the explosion of online and mobile information available to customers and the quest for more relevant services.

IATA Nov traffic

passengers reached its highest levels in nine months during November, the latest figures from IATA show.

Total worldwide revenue passengers kilometres (RPKs) were up 7.6% over the previous November, while capacity increased 6.4%.

Load factor was 78.9%, up by just under one percentage point.

"Stronger demand for air travel reflects - and is supporting - a pick-up in the global economic cycle," said IATA secretary general and ceo Alexandre de Juniac.

She is a fluent Swiss German speaker and has two Swiss children, but a residents' committee in the town of Gipf-Oberfrick has successfully blocked her passport application after arguing she did not accept Swiss traditions, the Daily Mail reports.

Holten has campaigned against cow bells, hunting & pig races, claiming they are cruel. Local politician Tanja Suter said she had "a big mouth".


