

# Virgin confirms MEL/HKG

FIVE weekly services between Melbourne and Hong Kong will be launched by Virgin Australia from early Jul (*TD* breaking news), providing increased competition to incumbents on the route, Qantas and Cathay Pacific.

VA will utilise Airbus A330-200s on its first route into Greater China, a "key pillar of our int'l strategy, allowing us to tap into Australia's fastest growing and most valuable inbound travel market," ceo John Borgehetti said.

Flights go on sale tomorrow, providing links through HKG to 13 destinations in mainland China.

The announcement this morning follows interim authorisation from the ACCC yesterday for Virgin Australia's proposed alliance with HNA Group, Hong Kong Airlines and Hong Kong Express Airways.

Interim approval for its Alliance Framework Agreement (AFA) with its Chinese co-owner, HNA, enables Virgin Australia the ability to begin selling tickets on the route ahead of final approval, expected by May/Jun.

It also allows VA "to support the existing and planned services that are and will be operated by Hong Kong Airlines and HNA Group" on Australian routes.

The competition regulator said it believed the tie-up will "likely result in some public benefit and limited public detriment".

It added the AFA will support HNA's existing services between China and Hong Kong to Australia and VA's domestic services by allowing the applicants to market and sell each others services "sooner than would otherwise be the case".

The ACCC highlighted that draft authorisation should not be taken to be indicative as to whether or not final authorisation will be granted to Virgin Australia.

VA's mainland China routes from Australia remain under wraps.

# Cathay deploys A350s to PER

**CATHAY** Pacific will expand its Airbus A350 services to Australia later this year, introducing the aircraft on daily flights to Perth and a second flight to Melbourne.

The airline's new A350-900 aircraft will be deployed on the daily CX170/171 Perth services and CX134/135 Melbourne services from 29 Oct.

The announcement follows last month's launch of an initial A350 daily flight from Melbourne and will join a daily Brisbane service, due to commence next week.

Perth Airport welcomed the announcement, saying it would add 17,000 seats per year.

This will mark the debut of MGM and Bellagio names in the Middle East and will include 1,000 rooms and 10 villas.

A entertainment complex with a theatre, retail shops, a beach club and museums will feature in the new development.

**DELTA** Air Lines will add three daily flights to Chicago O'Hare International Airport (ORD) from Seattle this summer.

Services will begin on 19 Jun and flights will be operated by Airbus A319 aircraft.

# SYD traffic steady

**SYDNEY** Airport's traffic in Feb slid 0.1% in Feb on Feb 2016, but the year-to-date performance of the airport is still up 2.5%.

International traffic grew by 4.2%, despite the Chinese New Year timing difference and the leap year in 2016 while domestic traffic decreased 2.5%, attributed by Sydney Airport managing director and ceo Kerrie Mather to the leap year effect.

Mather said international traffic remained strong with an extra 220,000 international seats on a year-to-date basis.

# **Qld China aviation strategy**

**QUEENSLAND** will work to attract more Chinese visitors under a new partnership aimed at securing extra air services.

The state's government has given in-principle support to a plan put forward by a consortium of tourism organisations under its Connecting with Asia Strategy, in which it will match industry contributions dollar-for-dollar.

Tourism Minister Kate Jones announced the plan yesterday and said it would result in millions of dollars in additional Chinese visitor expenditure.

"This latest proposal focuses on passengers arriving into Brisbane, then dispersing to other parts of the state including the Whitsundays and the Gold Coast," Jones said.

# Canada's strong start

**CANADA** has begun 2017 on a high, posting an 18.6% increase in visitor arrivals during Jan.

Overseas arrivals (excluding the US) were up 48,466 over the previous Jan to 308,981.

Australian arrivals were up by almost a third during Jan, increasing 29.9% to 26,823.

Chinese visitors increased 46% to 44,615, while the US increased 5.7% to 566,595.

"The project aims to secure a new direct service between Beijing and Brisbane and increase the frequency of existing services," she said.

The consortium behind the plan involves organisations from Brisbane, the Gold Coast and the Whitsundays, including Brisbane Airport Corporation (BAC).

BAC general manager aviation & retail Andrew Brodie welcomed the government backing.

"The Connecting with Asia funding will assist in securing additional capacity from the three top tier cities in China, which will ultimately provide wide reaching returns for the city and state," Brodie said.

# Sudan plane crash

**DOZENS** of passengers had a miraculous escape after the crash of an Antonov 26 aircraft in South Sudan yesterday.

The plane burst into flames after crash-landing at Wau Airport in the country's north-west.

While all 44 passengers and five crew were initially feared dead, media have since reported all on board survived, with several taken to hospital for treatment.

The flight was travelling from the country's capital of Juba.

# Disney pays out

THE Walt Disney Company will pay US\$3.8 million to more than 16,000 of its Florida workers after it was found to have breached minimum wage and overtime rules by the US Department of Labor (DOL).

The department alleged that Disney had deducted a uniform or 'costume' expense from staff pay and had not paid for duties done before and after their shifts.

The DOL said it was hoped the resolution of the case would alert other employers who may be paying staff in a similar manner "so that they can correct their practices and operate in compliance with the law."

Disney was also alleged to have failed to keep proper payroll records at its Florida operations.

TOURISM Authority of Chile has reported record numbers of Australians visiting Chile, with a 10.8% growth in 2016, reaching 50,968 Aussie visitors.

Chimu Adventures and the Tourism Authority of Chile cited "increased air capacity, value for money and reduced misconceptions regarding accessibility" as main factors leading to this inflation.

For 2017, tourism is projected to see a 14% increase in arrivals from 5.6 million to 6.4 million.

Greg Carter, co-founder at Chimu Adventures said, "Both Qantas and LATAM have increased their capacity into South America over the last three years by switching to larger aircraft with some very competitive airfares."

The country has been dubbed 'The Switzerland of South America', offering travellers diverse landscapes from glaciers to salt plains and the desert.
