HELLOWORLD ceo Andrew Burnes has foreshadowed an "more exciting phase" for the company as it reaps the benefit of stability and synergies achieved over the last 18 months or so.

Qantas 787 schedule

QANTAS has released deployment details for its first Boeing 787-9 Dreamliner which will operate domestic flights ahead of its launch on the MEL-LAX route on 15 Dec.

The aircraft will fly between Melbourne and Perth tomorrow and Thu, then a mix of MEL-PER and SYD-MEL flights Mon to Fri until 14 Dec.

On weekends it will operate morning and afternoon services between SYD and MEL.

Flights are subject to regulatory approval and may be operated by an A330 if required.

Virgin Samoa knock-back

THE Samoan Government has denied Virgin Australia permission to operate five return services per week between Auckland and Apia from 13 Nov.

A Virgin Australia spokesperson said the carrier was disappointed with the news.

"We are working in conjunction with the Australian Government to explore options to encourage the Samoan Government to reconsider its decision."

About 6,000 pax booked on the AKL-APW route will be impacted.

Virgin said it would fly pax to Samoa via Australia or to other destinations in the Pacific, or provide them with a full refund.

"As a matter of priority, we are working hard to reaccommodate those passengers and will be proactively communicating with them today to discuss their options," a Virgin Australia spokesperson said.

VA has issued a waiver code

BW000078 for changes or refunds for pax affected.

Samoa's ruling will not affect Virgin's already-approved twice weekly return services from Sydney to Apia and weekly flights from Brisbane to Apia which begin on 13 Nov.

The news comes after Virgin Australia and the Samoan Govt opted to conclude their Virgin Samoa partnership, with the Govt electing to start up its own Samoa Airways operations (*TD* 18 May).

World Exp release

New trips include a 39-day Great Tasmanian Traverse allowing travellers to trek, raft and sail across the state.

Sth Africa rallies expats

SOUTH African Tourism (SAT) has enlisted the support of the 180,000-strong South African expat community in Australia as it works to develop tourism from this market.

As part of its campaign Come Home Bru (brother) targetting South Africans living abroad, the SAT has identified Australia as a high-potential market and has begun asking expats to take on roles as tourism ambassadors.

More than 350 recruits joined a braai (barbecue) held in Sydney on Sun, attracted via a competition and social media campaign based on a recent viral video involving Durban comedian Robby Collins.

NSW China mission

DESTINATION NSW has taken a delegation of 21 tourism operators to China for a showcase this week in Shanghai.

The group will highlight Sydney and regional NSW to more than 150 travel trade representatives at a series of one-on-one meetings and a gala dinner.

NSW Tourism Minister Adam Marshall said the visit would allow sellers to capitalise on the lucrative China market.

Among participants are AAT Kings, BridgeClimb, Fantasea Cruising and Taronga Zoo.

expected to take part in a similar launch in Perth this weekend.

In Australia for the events, South African Tourism chief operating officer Sthembiso Dlamini told *TD* expats would be equipped with tourism news, product developments and package details to share among their networks.

"We want to educate the expat community so they can sell their country and share with their Aussie mates what the destination has to offer," she said.

"It's a no-brainer to get them on board as our partners to help sell the destination."

The number of Australians travelling to South Africa grew 10% in 2016 to reach 111,000, and Dlamini said SAT was on track to reach its target of 120,000 Australians by the end of 2017.

While Australia sat behind South Africa's biggest markets in the US, UK, Germany and Netherlands, it had been identified as a high-potential source of future tourism and would be given greater marketing priority, Dlamini said.

MEANWHILE, South African Airways has launched Business class fares for travellers aged 65 and over.

Return fares are available from \$3,885 from east coast points, on sale until the end of Nov and valid for travel until further notice.

Travellers need to depart and return on Mon, Tue or Wed flights.

UL's Peter McKeon said forward bookings were already strong, with heavy demand from both Melbourne and interstate pax.

THE hotel industry in Barcelona has suffered a dip in sales in the wake of ongoing political unrest in the city.

Figures released by STR show Oct continued a recent decline, with the sharpest drop in RevPAR of 27.5% occurring Oct 4.

Before referendum protests broke out in Catalonia, the hotel sector in Barcelona was experiencing strong growth.

Volcano downgrade

BALI'S Mount Agung volcano has shown a decreased amount of seismic activity according to Indonesian authorities.

The Government has formally lowered the safety alert for tourists on the back of the news.

Despite the softening of the alert status from Indonesian officials, DFAT has renewed its warning to Australian travellers thinking about holidaying in Bali, stating the volcano "continues to show volcanic activity".

World fleet doubles

THE world's jet airliner fleet is expected to double over the next 20 years according to international aircraft leasing company Avolon.

Over 51,000 aircraft are expected to be in service by 2036 with 16,000 aircraft to be decommissioned over the same 20-year time period.

The motivating factors for new orders will involve the need to replace ageing models and ensuring craft keep pace with modern technology.

"A total of US\$4.3t in additional financing will be required, with US\$700b needed over the next five years," said Avolon head of strategy Dick Forsberg.

FEDERAL politics got interesting last week with the High Court handing down its decision in relation to the seven politicians caught up in the dual citizenship wrangle. As it turns out two were OK, even though one of them has announced he is leaving in any event. That would be Nick Xenophon. So, the Nick Xenophon party now needs a new member, new leader and new name. The

deputy Prime Minister Barnaby Joyce turned out to be an ineligible dual citizen so he needs to go to a byelection, which will happen before the end of the year. As for the others, one is safe and four were deemed ineligible and one has now resigned. Deck chairs to the right please.

It is all very complicated as all legislation that has been passed by the lower house by one vote over this past term of government will need to be reviewed as to whether that vote carries, given the situation with the Deputy Prime Minister. I think this is called a right royal mess and I am sure the Prime Minister can't wait for the last sitting of Parliament and the summer break to start so they can get on with sorting this all out.

Meanwhile, the Queensland Premier has called a snap election for November 25, with both the Labor party and the LNP now facing strong swings from the growing support of the One Nation Party led by Pauline Hanson. The bookies have the LNP ahead by a nose, but I suspect that the odds will shorten as the next few weeks unfold.

These are uncertain times for the nation really, and it is amazing how, as a democracy, how down the middle we have all become. Both the Queensland election and the issues in Canberra are both held together by string and I suspect that once the outcome of the Queensland election is known a great deal of attention will turn to the way in which things might fall in Canberra.

We are bound to be surrounded by weeks of media coverage about the speculation of it all and in the end, it will be what it is and let's just hope that the country continues to be as successful as it is without necessarily clear political leadership with a mandate to get on with running the country with the policies put forward. Interesting times ahead over the coming month for sure.

Aquarium opens

When reopened, the renovations will have paved the way for an additional 806 guest rooms, taking the total to 1,300.

New additions will include a redesigned 7,000-seat Hard Rock Live Theatre & a giant guitar tower as the centrepiece.

ACTE blasts Trump

THE Association of Corporate Travel Executives has lambasted the Trump Administration's new policy on laptop screening at airports as an "unsafe, untested and reactionary" policy.

Whilst the association admits that laptops in check-in baggage pose a genuine security threat, in its view the new measures only serve to "shift the hazard" when not implemented thoughtfully and can also cause unnecessary wait times for travellers long-term if security is not well planned.

Cobalt Gatwick link

CYPRUS' largest airline, Cobalt Air, has introduced a new service that will link London Gatwick directly with Larnaca, Cyprus.

The new route will fly six times per week and will commence flying from Dec.

Services are set to cater towards holidaymakers and the growing business traveller market.
