World pax hit new high

THE number of people travelling by air worldwide has exceeded 4 billion for the first time after a 7.3% surge in passenger numbers last vear.

Data released by the International Air Transport Association (IATA) shows 4.1 billion passengers were carried on scheduled services in 2017, about 280 million more than during the previous year.

IATA says the growth has been driven by improved economic conditions and lower airfares.

"Flying has never been more accessible," said IATA ceo Alexandre de Juniac.

"In 2000, the average citizen flew just once every 43 months.

"In 2017, the figure was once every 22 months," he said.

Airlines connected a record number of cities worldwide, providing regular services to over 20,000 city pairs in 2017, more than double the level of 1995.

Growth was strongest in the Asia-Pacific region, where the number of passengers increased 10.6% to reach 1.5 billion in 2017, or 36% of world market share.

The top five carriers by pax were AA, DL, UA, EK and WN.

Melbourne-Sydney was the world's second busiest domestic route, behind Korea's Jeju-Seoul Gimpo pairing.

Jetstar ups carry-on

JETSTAR has introduced a new baggage option that increases the carry-on allowance from seven to 10 kilograms.

The new service is priced from \$13 on Starter Fares & is available to purchase on Jetstar.com.

"This is particularly useful for those travelling with a laptop or camera bag or those travelling on short trips with an overnight bag," said Jetstar's chief customer officer Catriona Larritt.

Window

AS IF air travel wasn't already traumatic for germ-ophobes, researchers in Helsinki have turned their attention to airport sanitation and pinpointed the highest source of common bugs that cause colds and flu.

And the main culprits, they say, are those plastic bins used at security screening points.

According to a report in the Washington Post, half of plastic security bins may carry viruses responsible for respiratory infections like rhinovirus or adenovirus.

Worse, the bins were more likely to be contaminated than other facilities like the airport toilets, which are cleaned more frequently and effectively.

The researchers said the results showed airports were potential risk zones for any emerging pandemic threat, and recommended they offer hand sanitiser to travellers and disinfect more frequently.

"HOW are you feeling today? I mean really feeling. It's a different question to 'How are you?', isn't it? Our default response to this question is usually a polite 'Well, thanks. You?' regardless of whether it's true or not.

Signs of stress, anxiety and poor mental health are, for most of us, figuratively and literally below the surface. They're not always obvious to colleagues and workmates as we bottle them up between the hours of 8.30 and 5.30 for fear of appearing weak or offbalance. Instead, we continue with the 'Morning! How are you?' I'm fine...

you? charade, despite being much more mental health 'literate' than we were a few years ago. Or so we thought.

The fact that people still don't feel they can confide in a colleague or employer really is astonishing. When someone unexpectedly hobbles into work on crutches, our immediate reaction is to gasp and actively

enquire as to 'What happened?!'
But if that same person arrived looking tired, stressed, or even visibly upset, it wouldn't be uncommon for us to turn a blind eye, or avoid engaging with their struggle for fear of

being 'intrusive'. This corporate mindset has to change. We need to remove the stigma attached to conversations around mental health and find tangible ways of supporting people who are struggling.

I want my team to be genuinely happy and healthy at work, not just pretend to be. As Sir Richard

Branson famously said: "Clients do not come first. Employees come first. If you take care of your employees, they will take care of your clients."
